Sacrament of Baptism:

Baptisms are usually celebrated after the 10:30am Sunday Mass. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic for a valid reception of Baptism and also obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Dear Parish Family,
Happy Solemnity of Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ -
Corpus Christi.

Origins of the Solemnity: The Solemnity of Corpus Christi dates back to the 13th century. In Belgium, following the mystical experiences of Saint Juliana de Cornillon, a local feast dedicated to the Most Holy Eucharist was established in Liège in 1247.

Several years later, in 1263, a Bohemian priest on pilgrimage to Italy was afflicted by doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. While celebrating Mass in the town of Bolsena, he experienced a Eucharistic miracle, when a few drops of blood were shed by the broken Host after the consecration. The very next year, in 1264, Pope Urban IV extended the feast of Corpus Christi to the whole Church.

Dogma of the Church: The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ – as it is now known – honors Jesus substantially present in the Blessed Sacrament. The truth of the Real Presence was confirmed in 1215 by the Fourth Lateran Council. Later, in 1551, the Council of Trent definitively re-affirmed the doctrine in a passage quoted verbatim by the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

“Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation” (cf. CCC 1376).

I announced previously that I received a new assignment which begins on Tuesday, June 15th, 2021 at Annunciation B.V.M. (a.k.a. “St. Mary’s”) in Catasauqua Parish.

Father Robert Finlan is being assigned as Pastor of both St. Richard of Chichester and St. John XXIII effective June 15th, 2021. Both parishes will remain as independent parishes and both churches will remain open. Since there will only be one priest as pastor of both parishes, Father Finlan made changes in the daily and weekend Mass schedules which are announced in this weekend’s bulletin so that he will be able to celebrate Masses in both parishes without requiring the assistance of another priest. The new Mass schedule for St. Richard of Chichester and St. John XIII parishes will take effect on the weekend of June 19-20, 2021.

I know that you will welcome Father Finlan and make him feel at home. You will be able to attend Mass at either parish. You can put your collection envelopes in the basket at either parish and be assured that your contributions will be directed toward St. Richard Parish.

Our Bishop ordained one new priest on Saturday, June 5th, 2021. After nine priests retire in June 2021, this year for the first time in the 60-year history of the Diocese of Allentown, there will be fewer than 100 active diocesan priests. In a special way, during this Year of the Real Presence, it is our responsibility as the faithful of the Diocese to spend time in prayer in front of the Eucharistic Lord in Adoration, praying for an increase of vocations to the Priesthood, especially within our Diocese.

Thank you so much for welcoming me here for the past two years. You will always be in my prayers and I ask that you pray for our Bishop, me and the other priests of our diocese as well.

**Updated Covid Guidelines:
Modifications Effective Pentecost Sunday
May 22, 2021:**

1. Facemasks are to be worn by all of the faithful who are not fully vaccinated. See #2 below. **Children under the age of 2 and those with medical exceptions are not required to wear a face mask.**

2. In accordance with government guidelines effective immediately, the fully vaccinated may attend Mass in the Diocese of Allentown and all gatherings on parish property without wearing a mask. "Fully vaccinated" is defined as being 2 weeks after receiving the final dose of the vaccine. People who do not meet those requirements are not considered fully vaccinated, and must keep taking all precautions.

3. **NO CAPACITY LIMITATIONS** will be required in parishes and institutions within the geographical territory of the Diocese of Allentown.

4. Sunday Mass attendees may enter and exit the church using both the ramp and front doors 30 minutes before the scheduled Mass.

5. The Distribution of Holy Communion is to return to the proper place in the liturgy in the Church only. It is no longer permitted to distribute after Mass.

6. Holy Water: All fonts and stoops remain empty.

7. Votive Candles: Parishioners may now light votive candles. Please hand sanitize before and after lighting the candles.

8. Altar servers, Lectors, and Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers are permitted.

9. The Exchange of the Sign of Peace is not permitted.

10. Weekday Mass attendees may enter and exit the church using both the ramp and front doors 30 minutes before the scheduled Mass.

Sunday 8:30 AM Mass will continue to be live-streamed for those unable to attend Mass.

Guidelines for Outdoor Gatherings:

1. No capacity restrictions.

2. Those who are fully vaccinated are not required to wear masks.

3. **Those who are not full vaccinated must wear masks when present at outdoor venues.** See #2.

As you plan events, it would be appropriate to have signage reaffirming these requirements and requiring compliance.
