Updated Covid Guidelines: Effective <u>Immediately</u> (July 1st, 2021)

As we begin this new month of July, all liturgical restrictions that were remaining as of Pentecost Sunday are lifted effective immediately, with the exception of the distribution of the Precious Blood to the faithful and the exchange of the Sign of Peace. These two normal flu season precautions will remain in place for the coming months.

No one is required to wear a facemask on diocesan property. Those who wish to continue to wear

The Diocese will continue to update on matters of this nature as information is available.

1. No one is required to wear a facemask on diocesan property. Those who wish to continue to wear one are free to do so as well.

2. NO CAPACITY LIMITATIONS will be required in parishes and institutions within the geographical territory of the Diocese of Allentown.

3. Weekday Mass and Sunday Mass attendees may enter and exit the church using <u>both</u> the ramp and front doors 30 minutes before the scheduled Mass.

4. The Distribution of Holy Communion is to return to the proper place in the liturgy in the Church only. It is no longer permitted to distribute after Mass.

5. Holy Water: All fonts and stoops will return to being filled.

6. Votive Candles: Parishioners may now light votive candles. Please hand sanitize before and after lighting the candles.

7. Altar servers, Lectors, and Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers are permitted.

8. The Exchange of the Sign of Peace is not permitted.
