Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: In the first reading, Moses encounters God in a burning bush, and is commissioned by God to free the Israelites from Egypt. God reveals his name to Moses, saying, I am who am. In the second reading, Paul warns the Corinthians against overconfidence by recounting the story of the Israelites. In the Gospel, Jesus calls for repentance and tells a parable of a barren fig tree. We know the history of Moses' role in God delivering the Israelites from bondage, and we have heard the story of the barren fig tree, but today's psalm allows us a moment of connection to God in our own particular way. He has pardoned us; he has healed us; he redeems us from destruction; he is merciful and gracious and surpassing in kindness. Our story is not just what happened then, but what is happening now, and the Lord indeed is kind and merciful.

TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The Lord is kind and merciful.

Adult Christians who have been attending Mass for several years may complete their Catholic initiation through a period of instruction; then Reconciliation, Profession of Faith, Confirmation, and Reception into Full Communion which often occurs during the Vigil of Easter but can also occur at other times of the year.
