Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

Our late Holy Father, Pope Francis called the clergy to be "Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples," bringing Christ's love and mercy to the world's most vulnerable communities. It is a call that deeply resonates with our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, who spent most of his priestly ministry as a missionary in Peru, serving communities in the Andean highlands and rural villages, always with humility, joy, and pastoral closeness. The World Mission collection supports 1,124 mission territories—places where the Church is young, growing, poor, persecuted, and in need of support and funds the formation of seminarians, catechists, and religious sisters, builds churches and schools, and sustains healthcare and social outreach programs. In his message for the World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis urged the community of the baptized to "participate actively in the common evangelizing mission of the Church by your witness of life and prayer, by your sacrifices and your generosity." Today, Pope Leo XIV, echoes that call and we hope that you will be generous with today's second collection.
