#### **Sacrament of Baptism**

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

#### **Sponsor Eligibility**

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage**

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

**TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD:** In the first reading, Ezekiel is appointed watchman for the house of Israel and is responsible for guiding the wicked to holiness. In the Letter to the Romans, Paul summarizes all of the commandments with the directive to love. In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples how to resolve conflict. He says he is present when two or more are gathered in his name. Jesus' words at the end of today's Gospel are some of the most reassuring in Scripture. He is present whenever God's people gather, as we do at every liturgy. When we gather in love and unity, we are fulfilling Paul's instruction in the second reading when he says: Owe nothing to anyone except to love one another.

**TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.
