Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday afternoon. Parents need to be registered parishioners and attend a Baptismal Preparation Class. At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic and obtain a Certificate of Eligibility from their parish.

Sponsor Eligibility

Certificates of Eligibility for Baptism and Confirmation require the sponsor to be a registered and active member of the parish, and if married, in a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Please call the Parish Office for additional information.

Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements should be made at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date to begin pre-nuptial instructions before making any arrangements. Please call the parish office for more information and to schedule an appointment with the Pastor.

TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: The first reading regulates procedures for dealing with people with skin disease. They are denounced unclean and must live alone. Paul calls the Corinthians to give glory to God in everything they do. In the Gospel, Jesus is moved with pity for a man with leprosy. Jesus touches the man, and he is made clean. "Do everything for the glory of God." Paul's words are both commanding and encouraging. As Christians, whatever we do ought to reflect who we are: children of the Most High God, adopted sons and daughters of the Lord. We are brothers and sisters of Christ, and our very identity should permeate all we say and do. We are encouraged in this endeavor, and aided by grace, so that we can glorify God for his sake, and for the sake of the world's salvation.

TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation.

OPERATION RICE BOWL

We will participate in Operation Rice Bowl this year. At St. John XXIII, the "Rice Bowls" are on a table in front of the baptismal font, please take one. Extra "Rice Bowls" will be located on the table in the Family Room. At St. Richard, the "Rice Bowls" are in the vestibule. Since its inception in 1975, Operation Rice Bowl has provided more than \$330 million to support programs that prevent hunger and poverty around the world. At the conclusion of Lent, the Rice Bowls will be collected. We ask participants to convert Rice Bowl gifts to checks made out to the parish for easier counting. We will then combine all the gifts and send one check to the Diocese.

When you enter our church, it may be possible that you hear "the call of God" however, it is unlikely that He will call you on your mobile phone. We thank you in advance for turning off your phones when you attend Mass.

THE INTROIT & COMMUNION ANTIPHON

Some people were curious about the two pieces of music that the cantor sings both at the start of Mass before the Entrance Hymn and at the start of Communion before the Communion Hymn. These are the Entrance Antiphon (commonly referred to as the Introit) and the Communion Antiphon and both have been part of the Mass for millennia. (At weekday Mass we even sing a third antiphon at the Offertory.) These sung antiphons were mostly written in the 6th and 7th Centuries, but some are even older, having been written as early as the 4th Century. Pope Gregory the First, after whom Gregorian Chant is named, also composed several of these Entrance Antiphons. These antiphons often tie in directly to the readings that we hear on a given day.
