TODAY'S LITURGY OF THE WORD: The introductory reading from Matthew's Gospel is Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The prophet Isaiah speaks as the suffering servant who has trusted in the Lord while submitting to persecution. In the second reading, Paul speaks of Jesus' total self-gift and God's subsequent exaltation of Jesus. In the reading of the Passion, we hear of Judas' betrayal, the Passover supper Jesus shared with his disciples, and the death of Jesus on the cross. The congregation's last words in today's communal Gospel reading are those of the centurion: "*Truly, this was the Son of God!*" This is the central proclamation of our faith that we should strive to profess more fully this Holy Week.

TODAY'S RESPONSORIAL PSALM: My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

ADULT FORMATION

Adult Bible Study: Wednesday evenings from 7:30PM until 9:00PM in the Meeting Room at St. Richard. Please note the different start time for the duration of Lent due to Stations of the Cross.

RCIA: RCIA stands for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. If there is an adult who wishes to become Roman Catholic and receive their Sacraments of Initiation, this is the process to make that happen. Adult Christians who have been attending Mass for several years may complete their Catholic initiation through a period of instruction; then Reconciliation, Profession of Faith, Confirmation, and Reception into Full Communion which often occurs during the Vigil of Easter but can also occur at other times of the year. Adults may be Baptized also in an extended process as well. Please let us know if you or someone you know would like to become Roman Catholic.

Adult Confirmation at the Cathedral on Pentecost Sunday: Bishop Schlert will celebrate the 11:30AM Mass on Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023 at the Cathedral of Saint Catherine of Siena in Allentown, wherein he will confirm adults of our Diocese. Those to be confirmed are adults who were baptized, received their First Holy Communion, but were never confirmed. Please contact the Parish Office or Fr. Finlan to discuss registration details.

VOTIVE CANDLE REMINDER

All the above prices are the same at St. John XXIII <u>except</u> that their small votive candles are \$1.

COMMUNION
