Address Lights

Check your address light. Is it working? Emergency responders need to see your house number at night. It is a simple fix, but first contact Kellie, our Site Manger, for the bulbs. You will need 2; they work in pairs. If one goes out neither of them will work. A screw is located on either side of the number light box that holds it in place. Remove the number cover. Pull both old lights and plug in the new ones. Replace the cover. If you need help or more information, contact Kellie.
