Check Your Sprinkler

Water use impacts our maintenance fees in Huelani. Please recheck you timer and adjust run times to a minimum.

Also please recheck your system for any possible leaks, especially inside your control box. If there is damp ground around your sprinkler valve or control box, you have a leak.



Tree Trimming July 18th and 19th

The common area tree trimming is scheduled for July 18th and 19th. To reduce the risk of your vehicle being struck by dropping limbs, please do not park in the vicinity of trees during this time. If you have trees hanging over your driveway, please park in the nearest visitor parking area from 7:30 am until 4:30 pm. Please remember to move your vehicle back to your driveway at the end of each day.

Please expect a pool closure on one of the two days for a few hours. We will send out another reminder as the time gets closer.

Also, this is a great time for all homeowners to address overgrown trees and shrubs within your private backyards. Tree limbs and bushes should not be hanging over fence lines or touching any parts of the home or fence. Inspections of yards will start soon.

IV. General

4. Fireworks - The use of fireworks of any kind, including "poppers" or

"snappers," is strictly prohibited at all times anywhere within the property. An immediate fine may be imposed for each instance of using fireworks and the Association may seek the eviction of the persons responsible if they are tenants.

The watch team will check your home while you are away.

You must be a full time resident of the Ewa by Gentry Community Association in Hawaii and physically residing in your home on a full time basis.

Homeowner Steps:

- 1.) Complete the form below and click Submit to CWT.
- 2.) Wait 24 hours, then call CWT at (808)685-0111 ext.21 to confirm receipt of your request.

Please call CWT for confirmation before leaving for your trip. Residence checks are provided for homeowners leaving for vacation, work and emergency trips. Residence checks can only be done for a maximum of (30) thirty days. Please call CWT if you need an extension or if there are any changes to your residence check.

This service is provided as a courtesy to our homeowners – it does not prevent unwanted activities at your home and it is NOT a security watch for your home.
