The Messiah, who breathed life into the instruction manual that not only brought salvation to the soul but freedom to live it out.

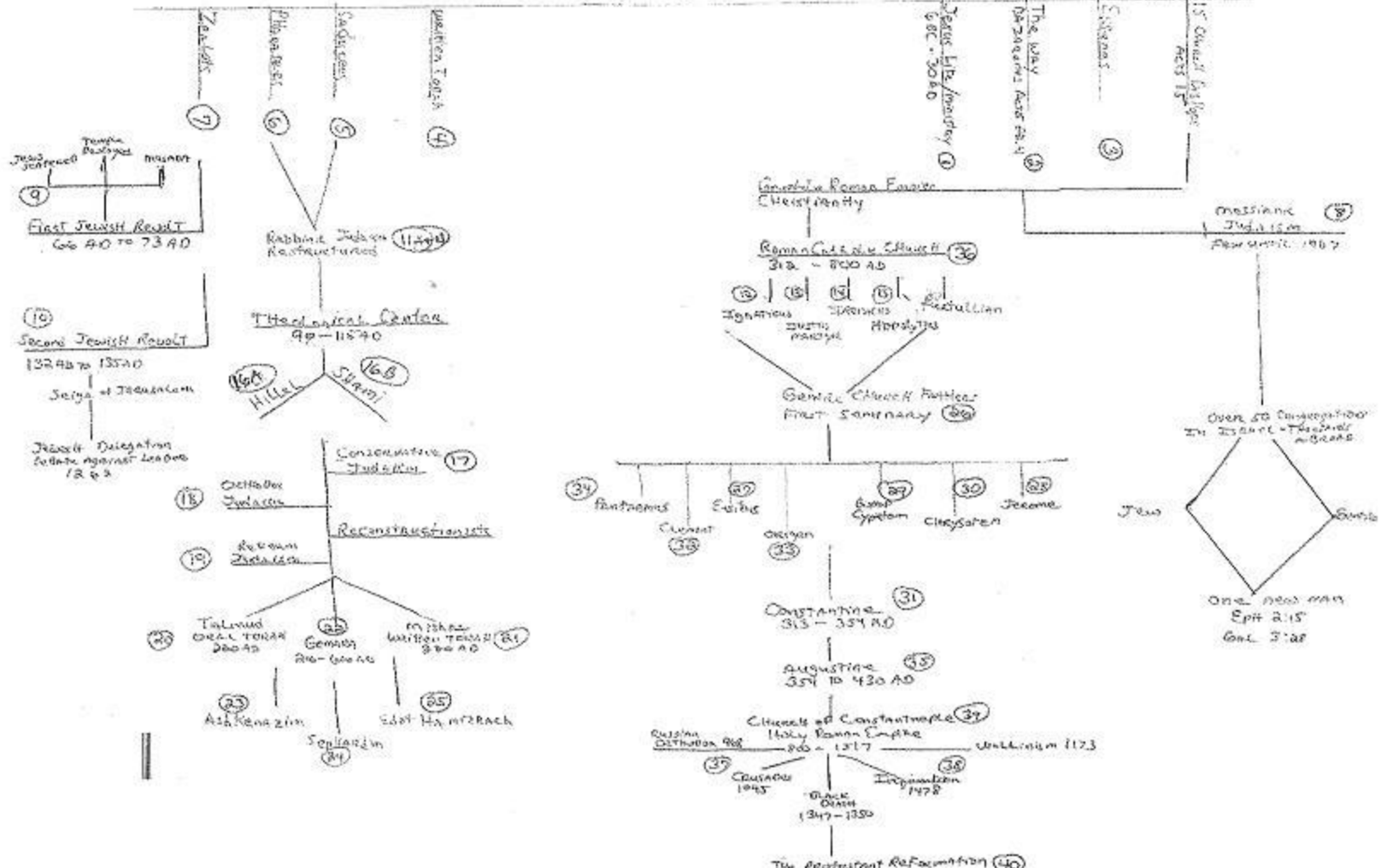
This allowed a religious spirit to deceive those who are not fully equipped; those, who like myself, was

“...tossed about by every wind of doctrine...” *Ephesians 4:14*

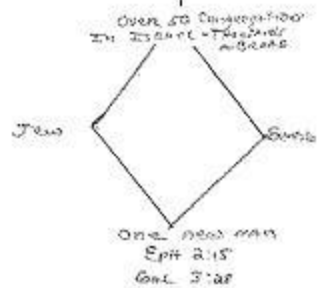
Much of Christendom is bearing bad fruit because they don't have a strong root system.

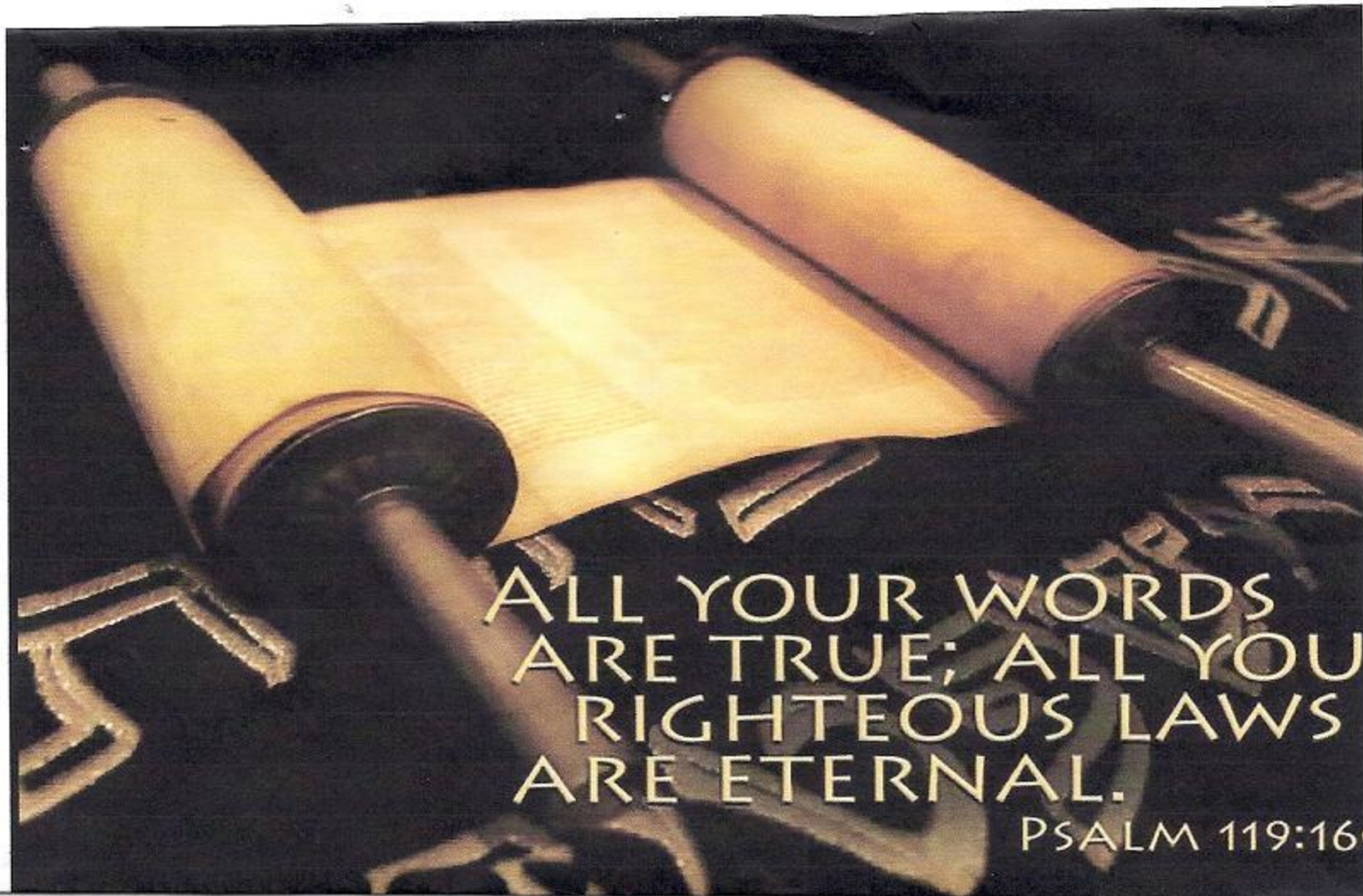
This includes an understanding of where it all began.

Jewish Roots of Christianity



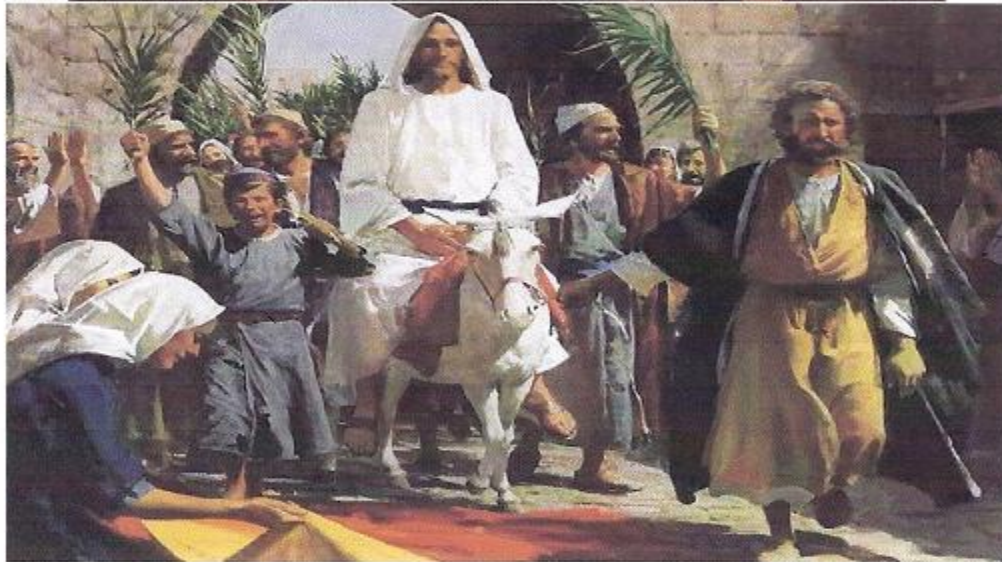
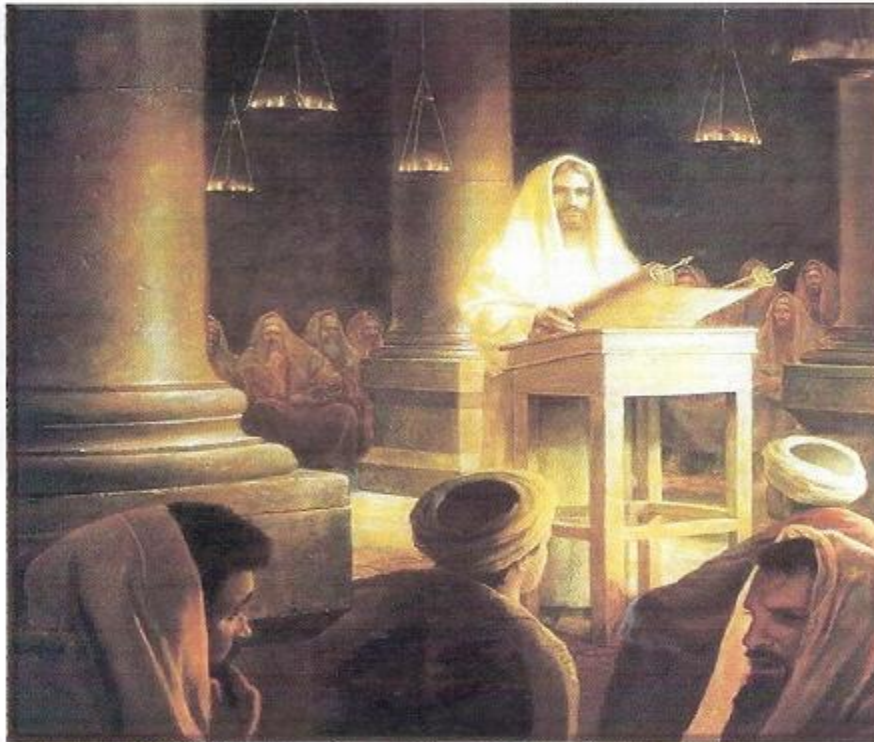

Faith in Jesus was mostly Jewish in the 1st century. There were also God Fearing Non Jews called Gentiles who joined themselves to form the Messanic community.

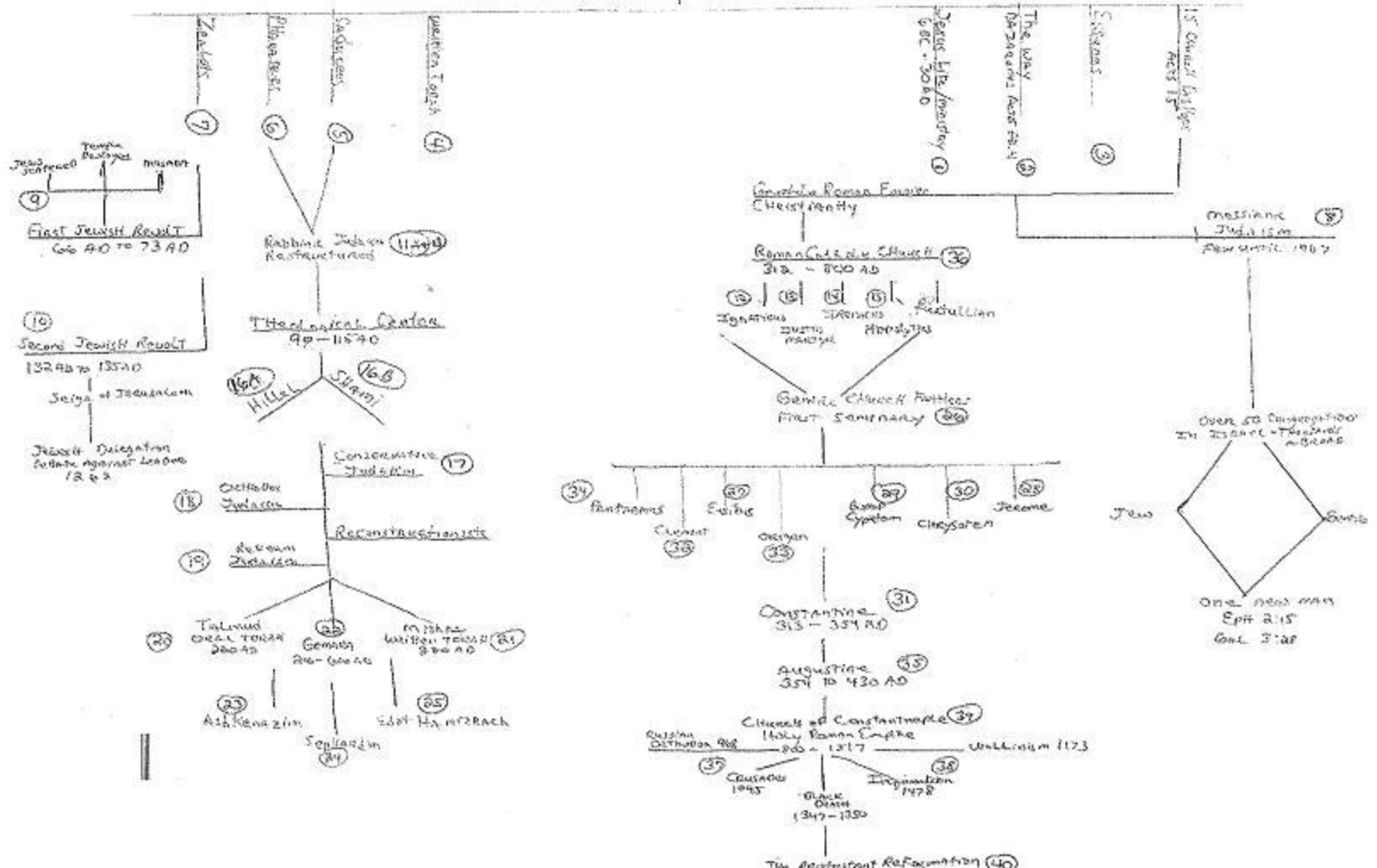
There were no church buildings. There were only synagogues, home congregations, and the Temple, where the believers would gather for prayer, praise, study, worship, and fellowship.

As the Gospel message spread to the Non Jews and more and more Gentiles came into Faith, there were those who did not understand the Jewish Roots and God's eternal Covenant with Israel.

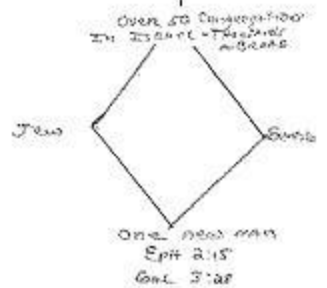
The results of this non understanding was a separation from the Jewish believers and this led to a formation of a second wing of

Faith in Jesus composed of Non Jews or Gentile believers known as Christianity.

One special Feast of the Lord is,
“Biblical Feast of Trumpets.”

This is a special time of blowing the Shofar, as they did in Biblical times, called the people to prepare their hearts for

The Day of Atonement, “Yom Kippur” which is 10 days after The Feast of Trumpets.

reminder that points to the final trumpet
sound when Jesus returns for
His Bride the Church.

- Trumpets/Rosh Hashanah also points to the future day when The Messiah returns to rescue the righteous (Rapture) and judge the wicked.

We also celebrate “The Day of Atonement” (Yom Kippur) which reminds us that Jesus sacrificed Himself on the Cross for the sins of the world.
