Coproduction occurs when individuals with lived experience are involved in the design, delivery, and evaluation of services.

Two additional peer support workers started in the team to support those in temporary accommodation/rough sleeping	Since April 2024, we've delivered two Introductory and one Intermediate coproduction training to 23 different services in total
