Styling is key to helping a character come to life. Not only does the style provide the mood of the period, but also the identity of the character. Styling and cutting is the most crucial piece in any performance.









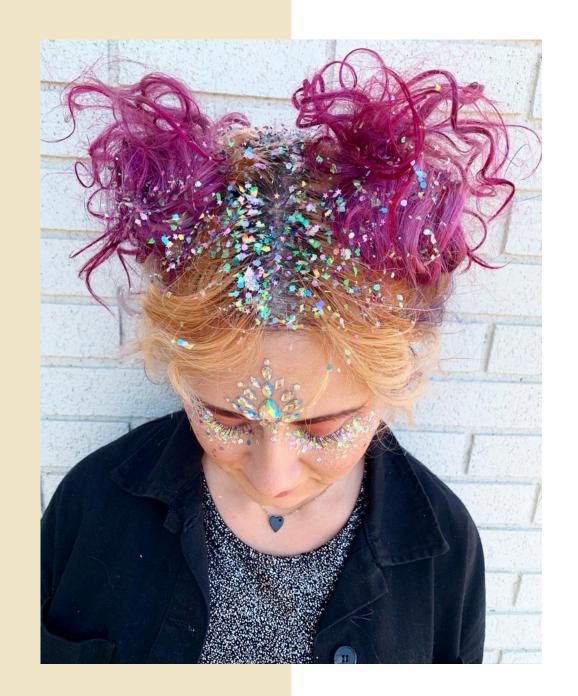
## CHARACTERS

Accurately portraying a beloved character will make or break the magic of the performance. Creating designs and implementing shapes into new wigs is half the job.

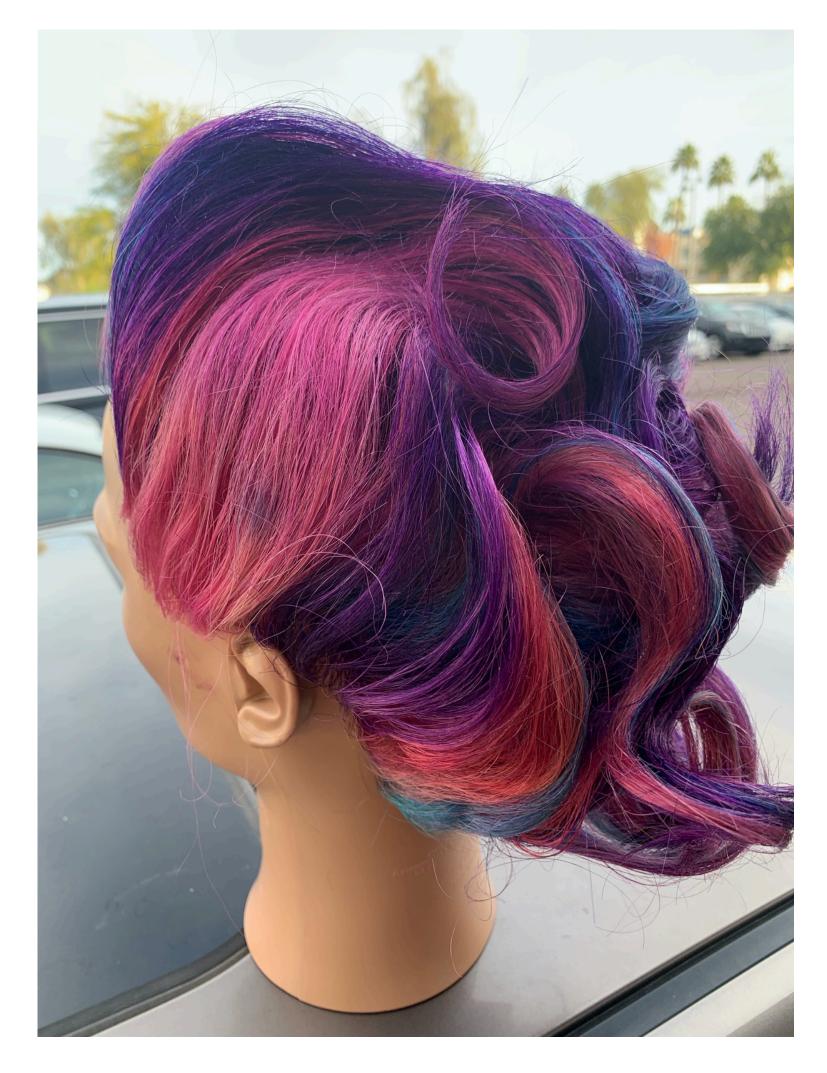


# EDITORIAL

# CAGE BULDING

Cage building is the process of shaping wire in the desired look and is often covered in a material in order for the hair to adhere. This is the only way to truly get styles that seem to defy gravity. An essential skill to have in any wig designers' book of knowledge.

















Hair covers so much more of the body than simply our heads. Learning bone structure, body shapes and how hair beyond the head can affect a character makes for a more rounded hair designer

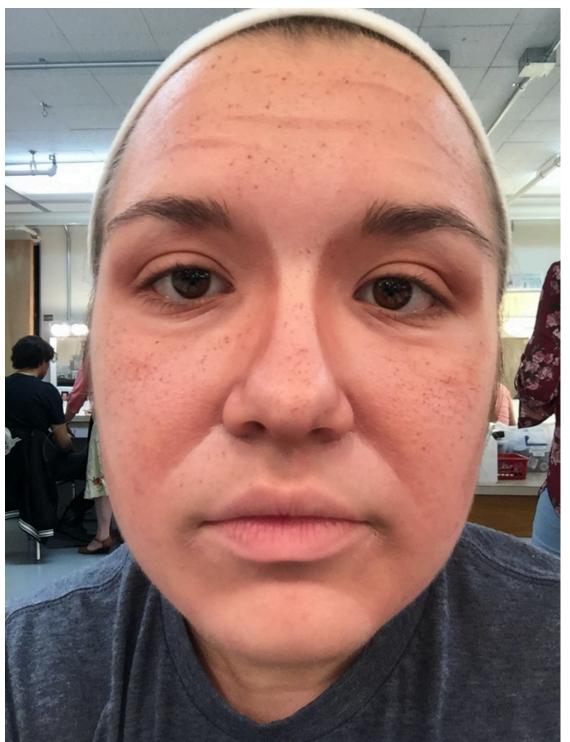

# AGING

Aging and natural makeup are the most common uses for production purposes. When considering characters aging you also must consider distance to the audience. An up-close audience means softer more blended lines. Farther away means darker and harsher lines so it can be easier seen.











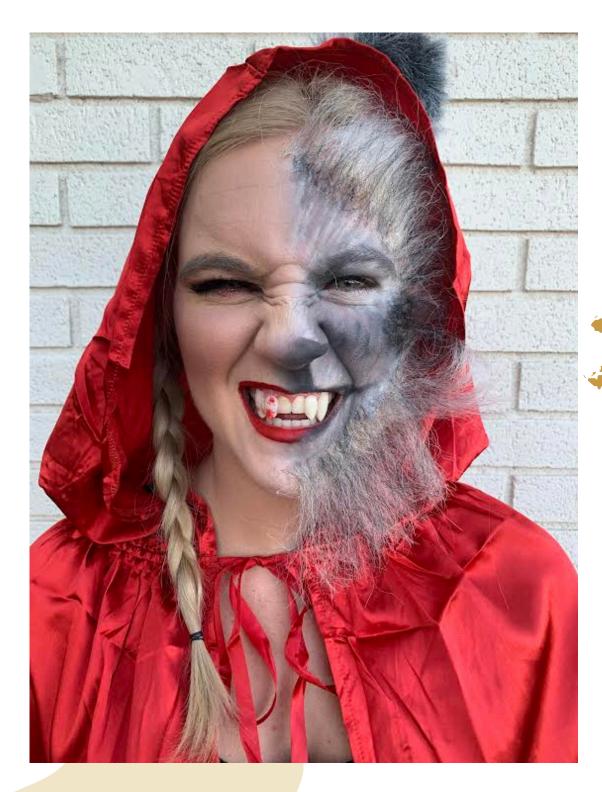




### CREATURES

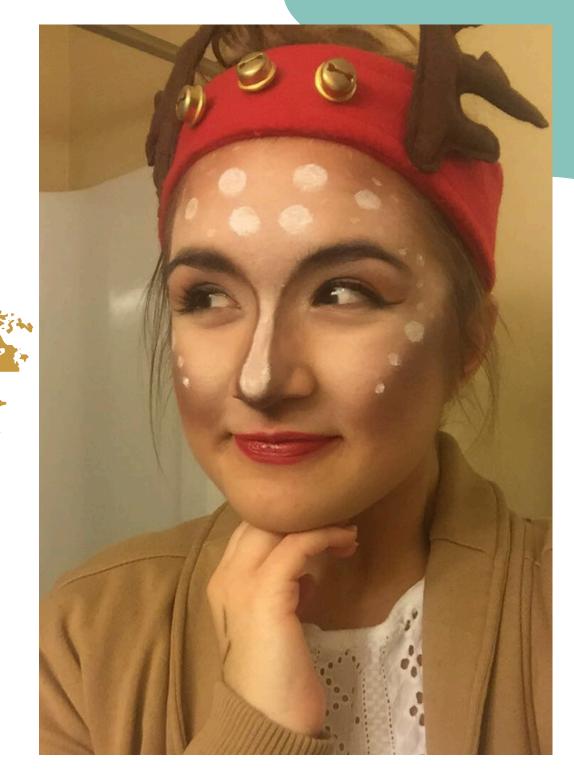
Species and creatures aren't always like humans. They have different insides, facial structures myths and objects that can hurt them.
