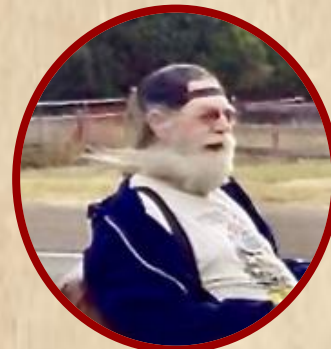

**Shelby Withrow**

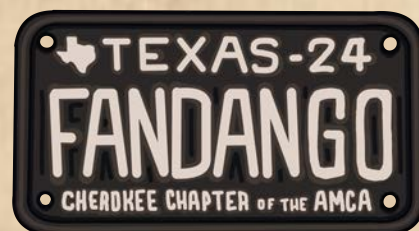

## Steve Klein, Cherokee Board Member

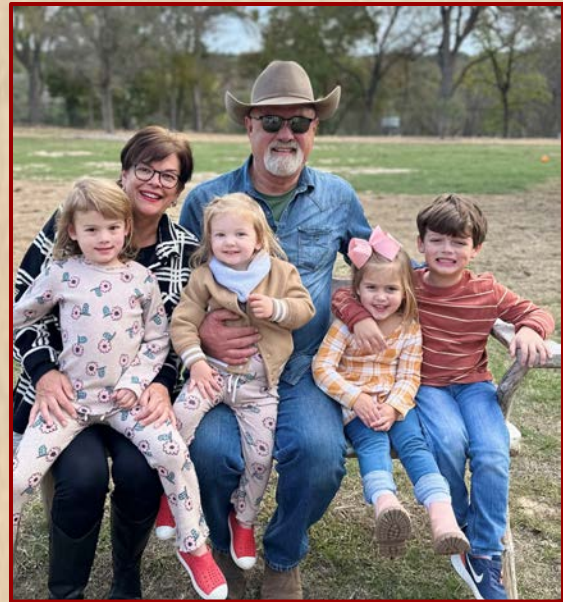

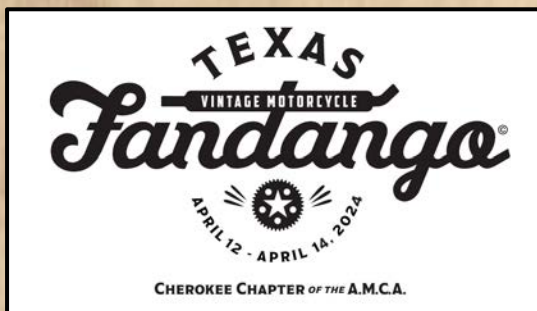

This is an AMCA sanctioned event and all AMCA event rules apply. All participating motorcycles must be registered. Motorcycles and riders must meet minimum Arkansas liability insurance and safety requirements. Proof of insurance must be provided at check in.

Eureka Springs has a trolley with 4 routes that'll take passengers around town from 10 am to 6 pm, Sunday through Friday. Final On-Site Planning Trip Accomplishments including, but not limited to, as follows:

1. All Road Run Routes have been driven, modified, and will have gas stops, photo ops, points of interest, antiques, noon lunch stop, pie/ice cream stops, etc. all determined w/ mile marks etc...
2. All Hotel facility planning (with all staff) for rooms, parking, AMCA Info Property signage, Hospitality Room & all Convention Center signage, all Banquet event details, food, electronics, media & signage all are determined.
3. Meetings with Sheriff's Department, & Police Department for logistics at Hotel/Convention Center are all done! Will provide route maps to Sheriff Department/EMS so they have one Deputy in that part of county on each day for fast response if needed.
