received our "Trim Notice" which will present the alternatives for the 2026 property tax rates. The good news is that the Commissioners have agreed to adopt the "Roll Back" rate which is the lowest millage rate. Two parts to our tax notices. Ad Valorem and Non-Ad Valorem. Ad Valorem is based on our property assessed value, and is subject to the millage rates. Non-Ad Valorem are flat fees and assessments. Our Commissioners recently decided to institute a New flat \$15 fee, per trip, to the Convenience Centers. No effective date has been published, but I suspect it will be effective on October 1st, this year. Of note under our Non-Ad Valorem fees there is already a facility charge for the Landfill and both east and west convenience centers. The \$15 is a new fee or tax depending on how you look at it? As part of budget negotiations County Departments and Constitutional Officers such as our Sheriff are negotiating their 2026 budgets with our Commissioners. The Fire Service is looking at about a 6-7 percent increase. The Office of the Sheriff is asking for about a 10.3 percent increase on top of six years of successive, sizable annual budget increases. He does not own any facilities, so the expense is for labor, maintenance and operations. Our county budget is approaching about \$1 Billion, which does not include the Schools. Our total population is about 223.000(+). If granted the 10.3 percent increase, this would constitute about 1/10 of the total County budget. "FLOCK" tag reader cameras are a hot topic, county wide. They are innocuous looking solar powered cameras popping up just about everywhere on public roads and big box store locations. The cameras read license plates and the data goes back to a central national data center. Very little is know other than the cameras are made in China and Law Enforcement has access to the real time location data through out Hernando County. So in short, yes we are being tracked in our vehicles. How you feel about that is a personal opinion and the information is only being provided for situational awareness, Traffic enforcement is up in our Golf Cart Friendly community, in order to provide for life, health and safety. The traffic unit has a couple of unmarked vehicles, so please be aware and do the speed limit. In September there are two scheduled budget meetings, in the evenings in order for residents to provide their input for the 2026 budget. The Republic Waste Collection Contract is being replaced by a new company by the name of

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





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# HERNANDO COUNTY AQUATIC SERVICES AND WATERWAYS DEPARTMENT RESTORES NAVIGATIONAL SAFETY FOLLOWING HURRICANE HELENE

(**Brooksville, FL)** – In the aftermath of Hurricane Helene, Hernando County's coastline sustained significant damage, including the destruction of critical navigation aids and regulatory signs that ensure the safety of local boaters and waterway users.

The Hernando County Aquatic Services and Waterways Department has worked diligently to restore these essential navigational tools. Since the storm, the department has successfully completed the installation of 24 new pilings and replaced 98 damaged or missing channel markers and navigation aids.

"Our priority has been the safety of everyone using Hernando County's waterways," said Carla Burrmann, Manager of Aquatic Services and Waterways. "Thanks to the dedication of our team, we've been able to restore order and help ensure safer travel along our coast."

#### **DIVER-DOWN FLAG**

The size of divers-down flags displayed on vessels must be at least 20 inches by 24 inches, and a stiffener is required to keep the flag unfurled. Dive flags carried on floats must be at least 12 inches by 12 down flags on open waters and at least 100 feet inches. Also, divers-down flags on vessels must be from flags on rivers, inlets or navigation chandisplayed above the vessel's highest point so that nels. Vessels approaching divers-down flags closer the flag's visibility is not obstructed in any direction.

Divers must make reasonable efforts to stay within 300 feet of a divers-down flag on open waters (all waterways other than rivers, inlets, or navigation When divers are out of the water, a dive flag may
