The Beachcomber Advertiser Highlight was Diane Greenwell who supplied an overview about the Front Porch Artwalk. The program celebrated one year in operation now with 41 artists who participate. Recent sales of art upwards of \$5000 drive the point that the Art Walk is viable and a success. Support from the Hernando County Fine Arts Council (HCFAC), the community and the HBPOA helped generate interest. The (HCFAC) just awarded the Front Porch Artwalk a \$1500.00 grant for out of county advertising. The funding will help inform other art communities and artists about the Hernando Beach Front Porch Artwalk. Events such as the First Saturday can be more than just the Art Walk according to Diane. All the businesses on Shoal Line can sponsor their own events on the First Saturday whether it be a specialty car show, or fund raiser, each unique event helps to draw visitors and influence their impression of Hernando Beach as a place to go . . . First Saturday at Hernando Beach – Plan on it!

Jerry Campbell, District 4 (2nd Vice Chair) was our guest speaker. He is on the Hernando County Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Campbell's presentation encapsulated what we love best about Hernando Beach - this community came together when faced with the difficulties caused by hurricane Idalia – "neighbors helping neighbors".

Moving to the elephants in the room, he addressed the ongoing contracting issues with Pine Island Park (6 months) and Linda Pederson Park (3 years) repairs and restoration. He summarized the Caliente Street and Petit Lane reconfiguration and storm water management changes as well as the ongoing Sewer Mitigation Plan. We will post on the HBPOA Website: (www.hernandobeachpoa.com) the county provided summaries for the Caliente project, the Petit Lane project and the Sewer Mitigation project.

Commissioner Campbell supplied statistics from the Waterways Sheriff's Office – the Marine deputies-2023 numbers show a marked increase in patrolling and where we need it is in enforcement. I can attest that our members saw them in action in 2023 on Memorial Day weekend, 4th of July and Labor Day.

- Citations on the water were up 40%, 300 issued.
- Warnings went down to 23%, only 136 issued.
- Boating safety checks are up 25% with 1,549 safety checks completed.
- The Marine Deputies performed more citation and arrests on the most severe infractions which were up 58%, with 1,681 accomplished.

Hernando County Marine Deputies took part in 31 community programs - up 210% from 2022 and they attended 5 community meetings. When you see a Marine Deputy, please thank them for their diligence in keeping our waterways safe for all.

Commissioner Campbell closed his presentation by answering a few questions and the first was about Hernando County Plans for the Preserve and where are we with that effort? Bottom line – still waiting on the contract to lease the property from SWFWMD. County plans include full time staff to manage trash pickup, maintenance of the boardwalk, bathroom(s) and walking bridge from parking lot on Shoal Line Blvd. He repeated that the park **will not** be a Sun West like park.

Commissioner Campbell officiated the induction of our 2024 Board with an oath office. They are listed in your Beachcomber with phone numbers – have a question? – Call!

The Association Business reports were lively and demonstrated we have great members who desire only the best for our community and look forward to bringing new ideas to the table.

Treasurer's report and Beachcomber report were read and we got three volunteers for the 2024 Annual Audit. The Committee of Volunteers will present the audit findings for a February Report. A big thank you to Denis Polyn, Valerie Shelter and Shari Oakland for stepping up. Our Hospitality Committee report from Patty Roberts introduced the new Membership Chair

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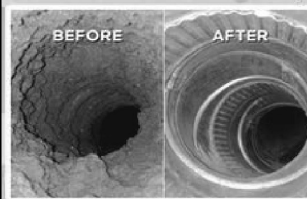
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FEBRUARY SPEAKER HERNANDO COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE COLONEL HAYDEN

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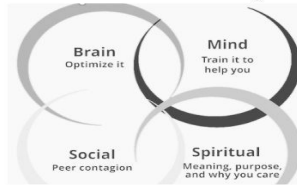
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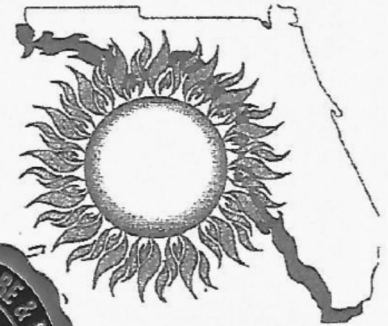

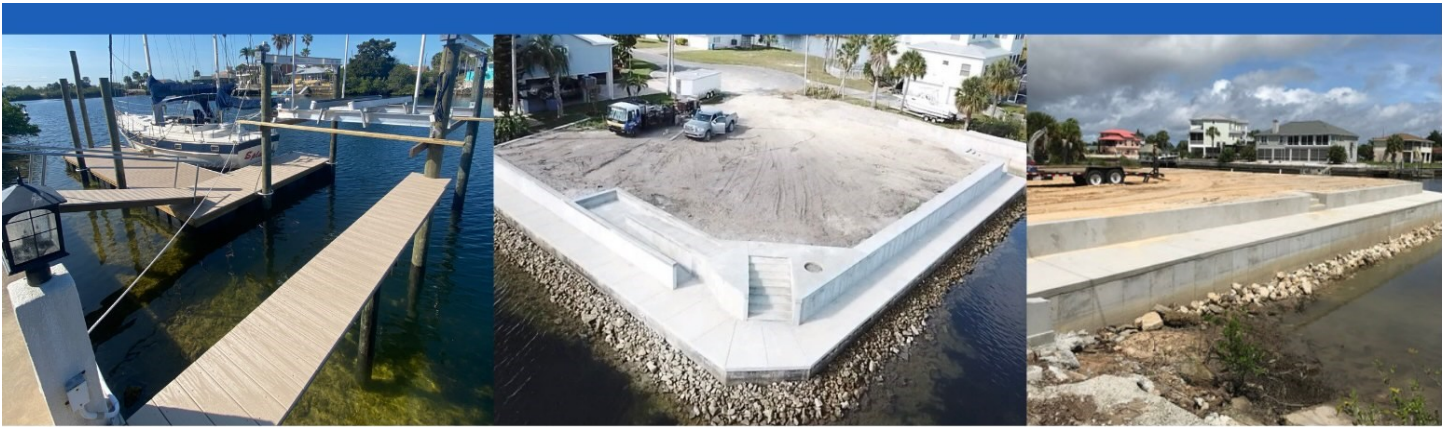
HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

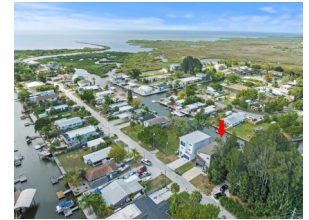

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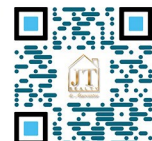
