
Understanding the Beach

Effects of Weather & Tides

- Weather changes, and can change the beaches
- If possible, scout the beach at dead low tide, this helps tell the story
- As water pushes in during the incoming tide, bait fish and predators come in with it
- As tide goes out, the opposite applies, bait will often cling to the backs of the breakers
- Fish on the steep curve parts of the tide
- Currents are usually controlled by winds and flow

Tidal Curve






Wave and Sand Bar









Seasonal Runs & Catch

- March and April: (March dependent on Water Temps) Puffer Fish, Whiting, Pompano, some Drum activity, Chopper Blues
- May: Whiting, Pompano, Trout, Drum
- June: Whiting, Pompano, Trout, Flounder, Spanish Mack
- July: Whiting, Pompano, Trout, Flounder, Spanish Mack (Water Temps and crowds heavy effects)
- August: Whiting, Pompano, Trout, Flounder, Spanish Mack
- Sep, Oct, Nov: Red Drum, Whiting Pompano, Trout, Flounder, Spanish Mack
- Nov and Dec: Whiting, Drum, Puffer


Baits that work for me!

- Fresh shrimp year round
- Sand Fleas
- Fresh Cut Baits
- Fish Bites
- Blue Crab pieces
- Live Baits: Finger Mullet, Pogies, small Pinfish/Croakers
- Don't go to the beach with only one bait option!




Fish Finder Rig (Beach)

Equipment & Tackle

- Rods: 8,9,10 ft rods (Always check your lure weight rating on rod)
- Reels: 4000 and 5000 series, (always check what line weight and capacity for the reel)
- Braid and monofilament
- Weights
- Sand Flea Rake
- Cast nest, bucket and bubbler in the Fall

Tips that really help me

- Keep your rod and reel out of sand. Always rinse down you rod/reel when you get home.
- Stay close by your sand spikes or cart, pay attention.
- Scent matters! Fish don't like sunscreen and bug spray transferred to your baits. Rinse your hands with water and wet sand.
- Keep your fingers out of the fish mouth. Sharp teeth!
- Have more that one bait option.
- Don't be afraid to move if fishing is not good, fish move too
- Fish different zone lengths don't just blind cast.
