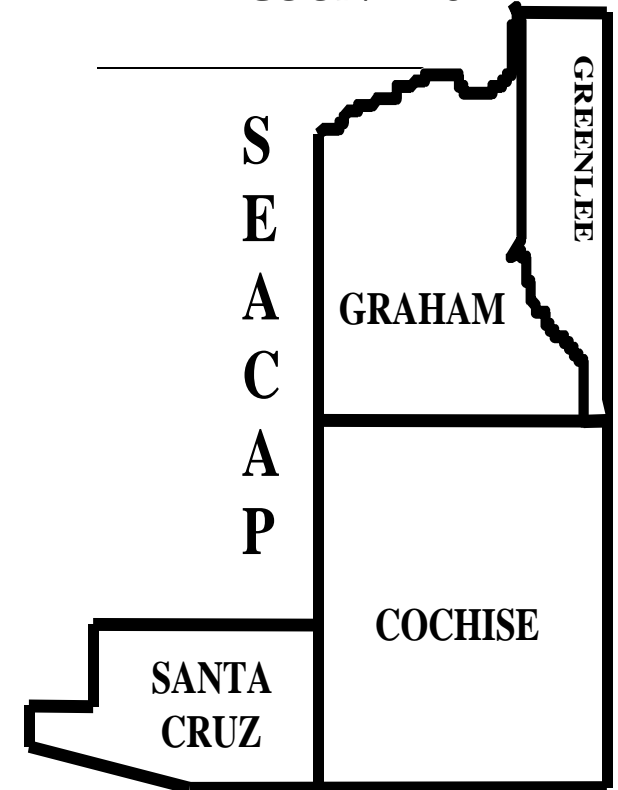

## ***SERVICES AVAILABLE***

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### ***ALL SERVICES ARE PROVIDED BASED ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS***

Program to assist low-income families, which are vulnerable to the rising cost of energy with a one-time assistance on their utility bill. \*\*

Program to assist low-income families with deposits for utility services, and/or make needy repair/replacements to utility related appliances or systems.

Program to assist low-income households with the prevention of rent eviction payments or utility assistance. \*\*

Program providing utility and/or shelter assistance to families with a crisis. There must be children under the age of 18 living in the household. \*\*

Program to provide free cellular phones to low-income households who qualify for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.

**WEATHERIZATION:** Program to increase energy efficiency of dwellings owned or occupied by low-income persons, reduce their residential expenditures and improve their health a safety. \*\*\*

**TRANSPORTATION:** Provide transportation services to elderly and/or handicapped individuals for doctor visits, dialysis treatment, cancer center, hospital, grocery shopping, paying bills and to attend the local community college. (Only available in Graham & Greenlee Counties)

**MONEY MANAGEMENT CLASS:** Learn how to spend your money by learning how to budget.

**FOOD BANK:** To provide a food box to families and/or individuals who are in the process of applying for and/or waiting to receive Food Stamps. (Verification from the Az. Dept. of Economic Security is required) (Only available in Graham County)

**TAX REFUNDS:** We will complete your Federal and State income tax returns and *e-file* free of charge.

**HEALTH INS. MARKETPLACE:** Certified application counselors who provide assistance in helping consumers prepare electronic and paper applications to establish and enroll in coverage through the Marketplace. This includes steps to help consumers find out if they qualify for insurance affordability programs (including premium tax credit, cost sharing reductions, Medicaid) and if so, to get enrolled.
