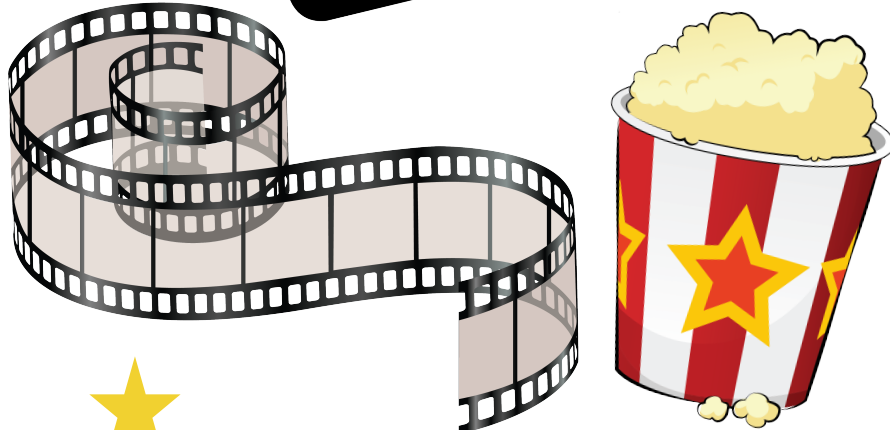
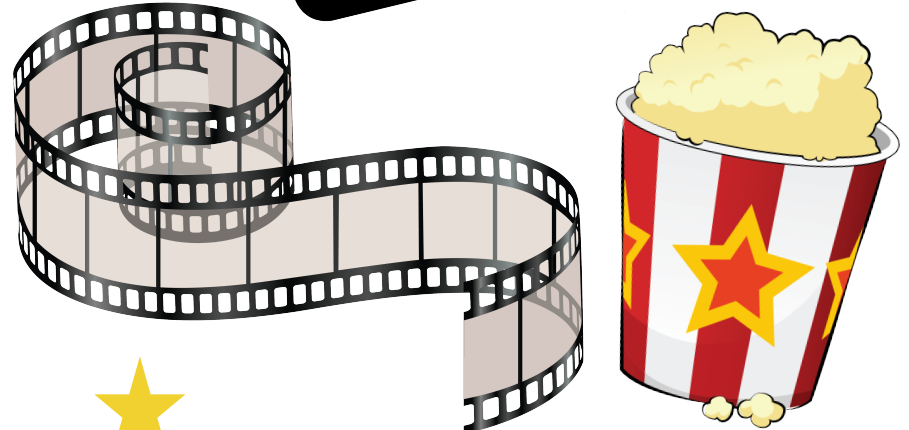

Lesson Review Questions

Purpose: To review previous lessons and to challenge students to slow down during the week and “think about” what they learned, and to assist students who don’t attend regularly to become familiar with previous lessons.

Suggestion: Include questions from the previous week’s Tracker’s Treasures (jokes, missions, etc.) to encourage kids to do it. Reword questions to better suit the developmental age level of the students you’re working with or to better fit the game/activity. They can be revised to be multiple choice, true or false, or fill in the blank. The purpose of the review questions is to reinforce what students have learned, not to stump students. Incorrect answers should always be kindly and positively corrected, so all students clearly hear the correct answer.

Topical Lesson: Big Picture of the Bible

1. What is your favorite part of the Bible?
2. Is the Bible true? (Yes)
3. What book would you go to if you wanted to praise Him? (Any of the poetry books)
4. What book would you go to if you wanted to learn about when Jesus was born? (Any of the Gospels)
5. Where would you go if you want to learn about a missionary journey with Paul? (Acts and some of the letters)
6. When can you study God’s Word? (Anytime)

Lesson 1

1. What was the first thing God told Gideon to do? (To save Israel from the Midianites and to destroy the altar to the make-believe god Baal)
2. Was Gideon afraid to do what God wanted him to do? (Yes)
3. How did God help Gideon obey? (God gave Gideon the proof he asked for - 1) the fire consumed the offering, and 2) the wet and dry fleece)
4. Did Gideon trust in God? How do you know? (Yes, because Gideon obeyed God even though he was scared and even though God wanted him to do hard things)
5. How did Gideon and his 300 men attack the Midianites? (They used trumpets and torches and shouted, “A sword for the Lord and for Gideon!”)
6. Who defeated the Midianites? (God worked through Gideon to defeat the Midianites)
7. Do you really trust that God is always with you? Why is it important to believe this truth?

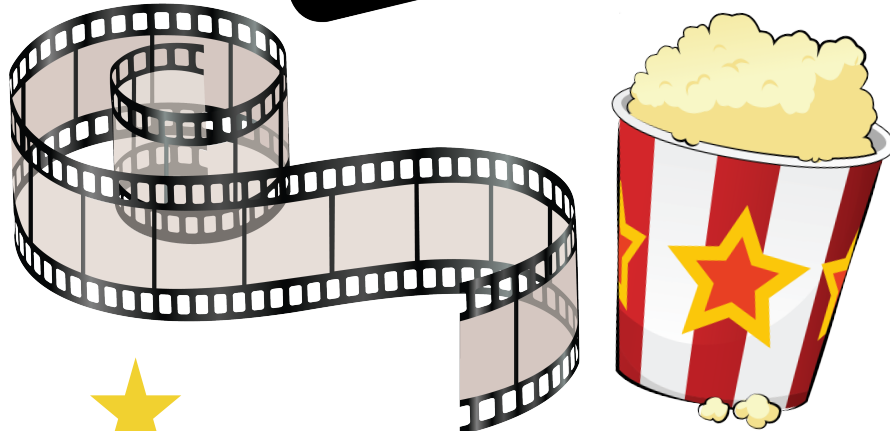
Lesson 2

1. What did God want Samson to do? (To save Israel from the Philistines)
2. What did God tell Samson never to do? (Cut his hair)
3. Why did Samson tell Delilah his secret? (He loved her, and she nagged him until he told)
4. What happened after Samson told Delilah about his hair? (She told the Philistines, and they cut off Samson’s hair)
5. What happened when Samson’s hair was cut? (He suffered a consequence, and he became weak)
6. What made Samson strong — his hair or God? (God)
7. What should Samson have done? (He should have repented of his disobedience)
8. When you disobey God, will you repent? How do you repent? (Admit your sin, confess it to God, and then change your actions)

Lesson 3

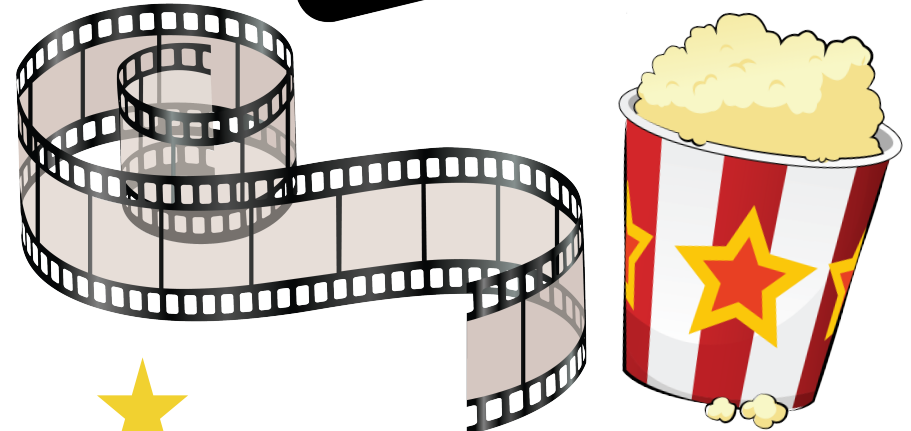
1. What made Naomi very sad? (Her husband and two sons died)
2. Why did Naomi’s daughter-in-law Ruth go to Israel with her? (She loved God, and she loved Naomi)
3. Who was Boaz? (A man in Naomi’s family who was supposed to take care of relatives who were in trouble or in hard times; the kinsman-redeemer)
4. At first, how did Boaz help and show love towards Ruth and Naomi? (He protected Ruth and made sure she and Naomi had enough food)
5. What did Naomi want Ruth and Boaz to do? (To get married)
6. How did God bless Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz? (After Boaz married Ruth, God gave them a baby boy)
7. Many years later, what two people were born into Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz’s family? (King David, then Jesus)
8. What is something you can do right now to obey God and love others?

1. Why was Hannah sad? (She couldn't have a baby)
2. Did Hannah obey God when she was sad and her life was hard? How? (Yes; she prayed to God from her heart, and she trusted Him)
3. What did Hannah say she would do if God gave her a son? (She vowed to give her son back to God)
4. What did God do? (He gave Hannah a baby boy)
5. Did Hannah keep her vow to God? How? (Yes; when Samuel was old enough, she took him to the place where he could serve God)
6. What did Samuel do all his life? (He served God)
7. What are some things need you need to pray about?

Lesson 5

1. Where did Samuel live? (In the tabernacle, the place where the Israelites came to worship God and make sacrifices for their sins)
2. Who was the priest in God's tabernacle? (Eli)
3. Were Eli and his two sons obedient or disobedient to God? (Disobedient)
4. What happened to Eli and his sons? (They were punished for their disobedience)
5. Did Samuel listen to God? (Yes)
6. How can you listen to God this week? (Read your Bible or think about verses you have memorized)

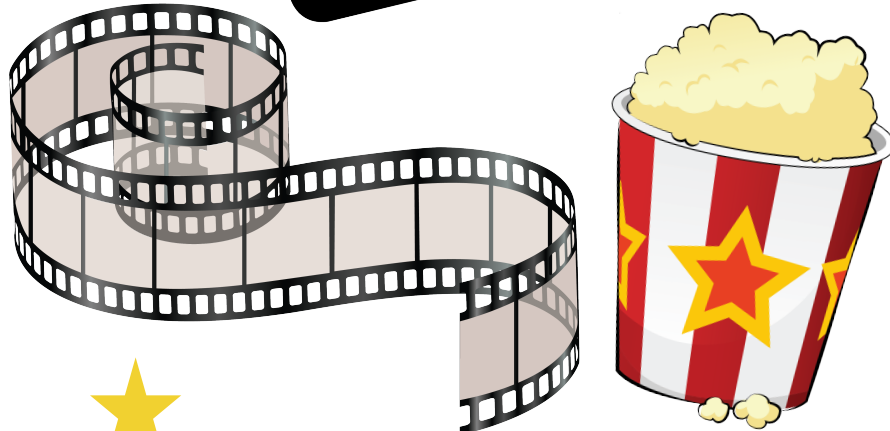
Lesson 6

1. After God saved Israel from the Philistines, what did the people ask for? (A king)
2. Why did Israel want a human king to lead them instead of God? (They wanted to be like all the other nations)
3. What did God tell the Israelites would happen if they chose a king instead of Him? (The king would take their best for himself, and he would take their families and make them work for him)
4. What did the Israelites choose? (They chose a king instead of God)
5. What did God do when the Israelites chose a king? (He gave them a king)
6. Who was Israel's first king? (Saul)
7. Do you think Israel made a good choice when they chose to do things their way instead of God's way? (No)
8. What do you choose: your way or God's way?

Lesson 7

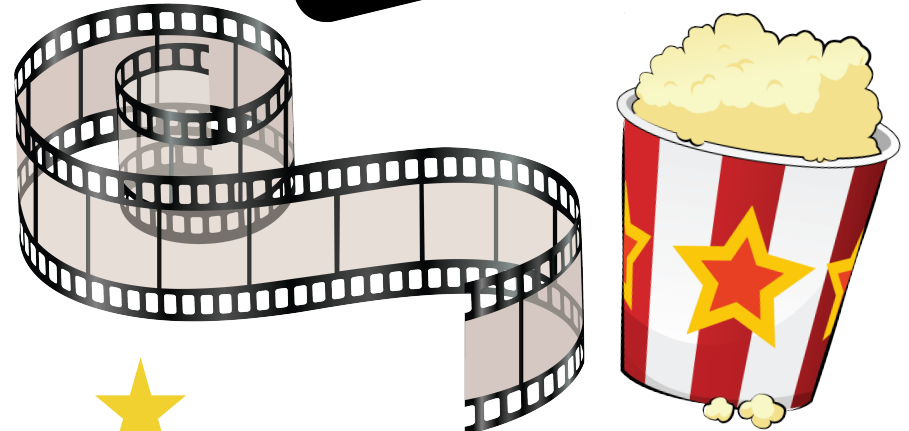
1. What did God order King Saul to do? (To totally destroy the Amalekites and not leave anything alive)
2. Why did God want the wicked Amalekites destroyed? (They tried to destroy the Israelites, and they would not turn to God)
3. Did King Saul humbly obey God? What did he do? (No; he let the Amalekite king and all the good livestock live)
4. Was King Saul humble or proud? How do you know? (Proud; he was so proud he made a monument of himself)
5. Why did King Saul say he let the good livestock live? (He said they were going to be sacrificed to God)
6. What decision did God make when King Saul did not obey Him? (Saul could not be the king anymore because he wouldn't obey)
7. What are some ways that you need to humbly obey God?
8. Do you struggle with being prideful? Take time to confess your sin to God.

1. Why did God tell Samuel to go to Bethlehem? (To anoint the new king of Israel)
2. Why was Samuel afraid to go to Bethlehem to anoint the new king? (He was afraid King Saul would find out and kill him)
3. Which one of Jesse's sons did God choose to be the next king? (David, the youngest)
4. What was David doing when Jesse and his other sons met with Samuel? (He was tending the family's sheep)
5. Why did God choose David to be the next king of Israel? (He knew what David was like on the inside)
6. Why did it take so long for David to become the new king? (God was preparing David to be the king)
7. When God sees your heart (the real you inside), what does He see?
8. When you look at others, what do you see?

1. Who was Goliath? (A mighty Philistine soldier)
2. What did Goliath want to do? (Fight a soldier from Israel, so Israel would become slaves to the Philistines)
3. What weapons did Goliath have? (Heavy armor, a huge spear, a sword, and a shield bearer)
4. Who was the only one willing to fight Goliath? (David)

4. Who wrote the book of Proverbs? (King Solomon)
5. What should we do with our mouth? (Call out for wisdom)
6. What is God's Word like? (Hidden treasure)

Topical Lesson: Proverbs in Action

1. Who gave King Solomon his wisdom? (God)
2. Can we ask God for wisdom? (Yes)
3. What book of the Bible is known for giving wisdom? (Proverbs)
4. What are some examples of wisdom that we find in Proverbs? (Wise children bring joy to their parents, we should refresh others, we should watch what we say, etc.)
5. How can we apply what we learned from Proverbs? (Bring someone a meal or treat, donate toys or clothes, write an encouraging note to someone, pause to think before speaking, etc.)

Worship / Names of God

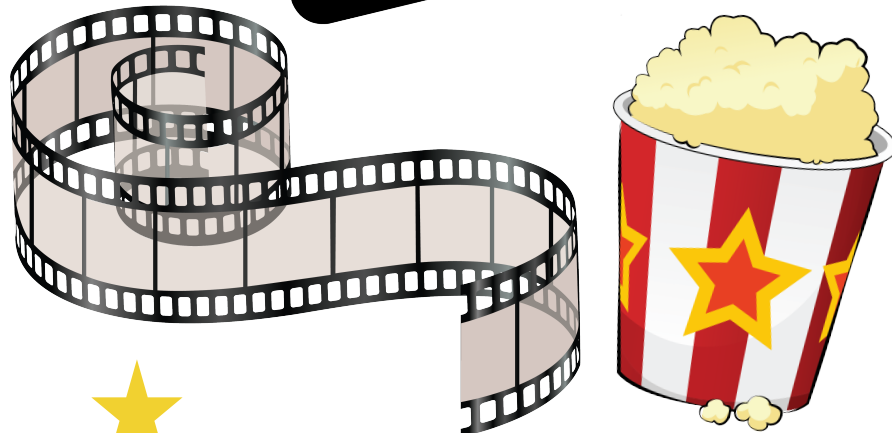
Purpose: To challenge students to know God and then use those thoughts/facts/characteristics to help direct their hearts and minds during worship.

- Fill in the blank: My God is called _____. (Father, Lord, Counselor, Prince of Peace, Creator, Savior, King, etc.)
- What is the difference between singing and worshiping through song?
- How can you prepare to worship God before you arrive at church?
- How can you worship God during the week?

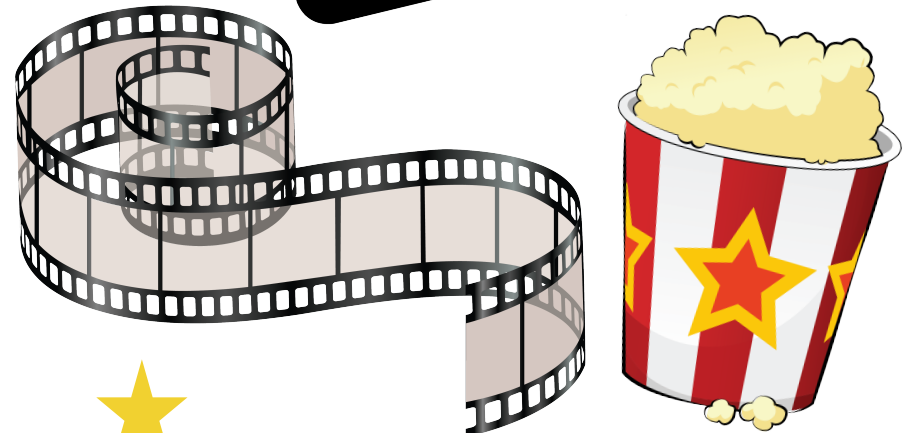

Witnessing Skills and Gospel Facts

Purpose: To encourage basic witnessing skills using the Wordless Book (Gospel points) and to assist students in confidently knowing why they can be saved.

Sample questions:

- What is one of the first things I should communicate when witnessing to my friends? (God loves them, John 3:16)
- What separates us from God? (Sin, Romans 3:23)
- What is the definition for sin? (Anything we think, say, or do that is against God)
- Who is the only Person who can save us from our sin? (Jesus)
- Why Jesus? (Because He is the only One who is Perfect)
- What did Jesus do for us on the cross? (He took the punishment for our sin)
- Why is important to know that Jesus rose again after three days? (He had victory over death)
- Did Jesus instantly go to heaven after He rose again? (No, there were eyewitnesses who saw Him after He rose again)
- Why is this important? (It's proof that He is alive)
- What should a person do if they want to be saved? (Pray, admit their sin, and acknowledge Jesus as their Savior)
- How does a person change after they become a Christian? (Desire to grow, Jesus is now the leader of their life, they have the Holy Spirit, etc.)

Big Questions Kids Often Ask

Purpose: To provide answers for common questions kids ask.

Sample questions:

- How do you know God is real? (We can see the evidence of who He is)
- How do you know the Bible is real? (Historical evidence)
- Are the devil and demons real? (Yes)
- Do all people go to heaven? (No) Why? (Romans 3:23)
- Are all religions true? (No, John 14:6)
- Can I lose my salvation? (No, Ephesians 1:13-14 – “And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the Gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in Him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God’s possession—to the praise of His glory.”)

Top 12 – Know and Use

Purpose: To challenge students to slow down and think about verses they know, and how to use them in everyday situations.

Sample questions:

- At night before you go to bed, what is your favorite verse to think about?
- Your friend said that good works can get you saved. What verse would you share? (Ephesians 2:8-9, John 14:6, John 3:16)
- Before a big game, what verse can you think about? (Joshua 1:9)
- When you are sad, what verse can you think about? (Proverbs 3:5-6, Joshua 1:9, John 3:16)
- When you are tempted to sin, what verse could you think about? (1 Corinthians 15:58)
- A friend tells you that all religions can get you to heaven. What verse would you share? (John 14:6)
- If you are nervous about a situation, what verse can you think about? (Proverbs 3:5-6, Joshua 1:9)
- When you are having a hard time liking a kid at school, what verse could you think about? (Mark 12:30-31)
- Why is it important to think about God’s Word? (2 Peter 3:18a, Mark 12:30-31)
