YOU DON'T KNOW ME, BUT...

Late at night, Lev – my interpreter – and I entered a scenic forested former communist campsite nestled in the rolling hills near the Finnish/Russian border, two hours north of St. Petersburg. I had not slept for 40 hours. We were served a warm dinner before bedding down for the night. I rested well. It helps to have hundreds of people praying. Thank you, my friends.

Saturday, February 3, I met the rest of the faculty for an orientation where we were given the schedule and our assignments for the CCI-Russia 25th Anniversary Conference. Three hours of interactive teaching each day was to be my contribution. During every meal I had scheduled interviews with camp leaders who had stories to tell. Lev interpreted while Julia (second interpreter) transcribed the stories into my journal.

In between classes and meetings, camp leaders, with **The Book for Counselors** and a pen in hand, asked for my signature. Alexander Kharitonov, CEO of CCI-Russia since its inception in 1993, informed me that the book is still the number one selling camping

book. Elfrieda and I authored the first edition of the book in 1994.

With all this interaction, I began to get a feel for what has developed in the Christian camping community in Russia since 1991. The average age of the 320 persons present at the conference



was 32, much the same as the 310 camping leaders who attended the conference held in Kiev, Ukraine in November, which I also attended. The average age of the 134 leaders attending the CCI-Transcaucasus Conference in Tbilisi, Georgia, in March was 35.

Over and over the conference attendees in Russia told me; "you don't know me but I know you. I was a camper in your camp." They told me of their camp memories from their years of experience. They

spoke of becoming helpers in their camps, working their way up the camp system from dishwasher to sports assistant to counselor's helper, to counselor. After directing program for a few years, many of them became directors of their camps.

This second generation camp leader is very different from the first generation leader. The first generation leaders could not lead from experience, only from cognitive knowledge. **The second generation leader leads with knowledge and experience.** He remembers well what camp meant to him and now he is engaged in camping to pay back the debt he feels he owes because of all that camp did for him. **He leads with heart and passion.** That is why the number of camps in the former Soviet Union is growing. I was told at the conference that the number of Christian camps in the FSU today is 1,530.



It was an absolute joy to teach these eager-to-learn camp directors. Our classes were filled with lively conversation, probing questions, laughter, and inspiration. The Holy Spirit's presence was evident. At the end of the conference I was given a handwritten sheet of 28 comments by my students. Here are a few of their comments:

- Thank you, Dave you came for me! The questions you asked made me change my ways and my ministry.
- You are special and, after listening to you, I want to love my team and my campers even more.
- Dave's seminar was very spiritual. It gave me
 the foundation every camp director should have.
 There was much to think about in spiritual preparation for the new camp season.
- You motivated us to memorize God's Word so that the Word would live inside us.

ALMOST EVERYTHING CHANGED

Michael is second pastor of a 500 person church in Riga, Latvia. He was the general session speaker at



the CCI-Russia 25th Anniversary Conference. Our first meeting with Michael occurred at our model camp in Anapa, on the Black Sea, in 1994. Michael has been engaged in camping ever since.

"Almost everything changed in our church since we came in contact with Christian

Camping International (CCI)" said Michael. "The camp atmosphere is passed on to the church. Relationships are improved. Camp provides opportunity to develop skills and leadership abilities. Camp provides an opportunity for service. About 150 people from our church serve at camp every summer. Most of the commitments to Christ happen at camp.

"We do Fall, Christmas and Spring camps. Our camp is financially self-sufficient. It operates legally so parents who cannot pay the camp registration fee can apply to the government for a campership subsidy. Churches in Latvia are growing."

FINDING WAYS

Katya is the director of a camp in Crimea. "We cannot call it a Christian camp because we have to find a way to work within the 2016 Russian religious law. We cannot preach or invite children to church. But we invite them to 'after camp activities' such as Alpha Course.

Samaritan's Purse gift boxes are prohibited in the Crimea so we made our own Christmas gift boxes to give to needy families. The government liked that. We are learning to work under the religious law. Some camps have been closed but we have been given permission to operate our camp because we accept children from needy families. We are not "officially" Christian, but by God's grace we find ways to be Christian. Our camp is growing."

Protestant Christians are not welcome in Russia. Camp workers and churches sending them are exercising great faith in continuing to operate camps. They appreciate our prayers.

CAMP VERTICAL DEVELOPMENTS



Camp Vertical is a tent camp for teenage boys ages 13-18. It is located in Ukraine and began operating in 2011. The vision for Camp Vertical grew out of the need for responsible male leadership throughout Ukraine. Alcohol abuse has eroded the characters of husbands and fathers and families are in disarray. Unfortunately society has become used to this tragic situation and few, if any citizens or institutions, have the vision or will to address the problem. Our Vertical team has heard and accepted God's call to change this paradigm.

Every aspect of Camp Vertical is designed to develop character. The counselors are God-fearing men who model responsible living. Boys learn godly character traits from the study of Biblical characters like Abraham (faith), Daniel (prayer), David (delight in the Word), Joseph (purity), Jacob (tithing), Paul (servanthood), Jonathan (loyal friendship), Nehemiah (responsibility), 5th Commandment (Honor Parents). All recreation activities are designed to achieve cooperation and to shoulder responsibility. In the 10-month follow-up program the boys memorize scripture and do an indepth study of the Bible characters they studied at camp.

Vertical is expanding to two 12-day sessions in 2018. In future we hope to operate the entire summer. Viktor K, our energetic Vertical Camp director, is passionate about developing teenage boys into men who will live up to their divine calling of being the Priests

of their families and pillars in their churches and communities. Viktor and his team are working with determination to bring all staff, campers and logistics together for a successful camp this summer.

Finding a permanent home for the tent camp is a huge task. Rural land ownership in Ukraine is not possible. So we are in search of recreational land with field, forest, and lake or river that can be leased long-term. We believe God has reserved this parcel of land for Vertical somewhere near Kiev. Being centrally located is important for a project like Vertical. Pray for God's will to be done.

VIKA - GOD'S MIRACLE

Victoria (Vika) was teaching in the classroom next door to me. Her class was very lively – much activity and laughter. She was teaching the program leaders how to create and operate successful camp programs. I wondered what made this short, cheerful 38 year-old instructor tick, so I invited her to join me for lunch. Lev was interpreting while Julia was filling page after page in my journal as fast as she could write.

Vika's story was almost unbelievable: "I ran away from home at age 14 with seven broken ribs after having been beaten by my brother and father. I told

God, "You aren't just and I don't want to know you!" Offended, I formed a gang of 18 rebellious street boys and we became criminals...until I was invited to a camp."



Today, Vika is the director of Camp Joy, a camp for street kids. "REVEREND MATVEY"



It was Matvey's first camp. His father, a drug addict, was in prison so this seven year old was in the care of his mother and grandparents. Tatiana, the camp director, noticed that Matvey was very kind and intelligent. He engaged in all camp activities and made many friends.

During camp, Matvey received several phone

calls from his mother and grandfather. His reply was always the same: "I'm very busy and have no time to talk." One day during a phone call, his grandfather asked Matvey, "What are you so busy with that you

don't have time to talk?" "We sing and pray," was the reply. There was no mention of all the games, swimming, crafts and so on that Matvey was enjoying. He only told what was impacting him.

A week after camp, the director received a phone call from Matvey's Sunday School teacher saying, "Matvey's mother told me that he told his family to pray before meals. Surprisingly the family agreed. Now this seven year old boy leads the family in prayer before every meal. His grandfather began to call him 'Reverend Matvey'. Matvey is counting the days until summer camp." The power of camp...it changes families through children.



sands of summer staff needed in the 1530 camps in the former Soviet Union.

Some day Matvey will be a Third Generation Camp Director who will lead his staff and campers with a double passion for spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. Tens of thousands of potential "Reverend Matveys" will be in the 1530 Christian youth camps in the FSU this summer. Pray that God would open their hearts so they confess their sins and become His faithful disciples. Ask God to remove every obstacle for children who want to attend a Christian camp and enable them to go to camp. Ask God to fill every camp.

CAMP VERTICAL

Viktor K and his team have already recruited 52 teenage boys towards the 120 spots for the two

sessions of camp this summer. Thank God for this progress and ask Him to call and send the remaining 68 boys who want to become God-honoring husbands, fathers and "salt of the earth". Eight of the 24 counselors are recruited. Ask God to send the remaining 16 and to bless the Staff Training Workshop to be held June 2-3.

Vertical needs a larger and more centrally located campsite. This is difficult to find in Ukraine where there is no private rural land. Several people are searching. Ask God to lead them to the territory He has chosen, that it would become available, and that all funds needed for Vertical to operate this summer would be supplied.

TRANSCAUCASUS CAMPS

Valeri is encouraging us to continue to thank God for the blessings that churches, families and individuals have experienced as a result of the camps. However, after 20 years, as a result of wars and other hardships, camps are struggling. Pray for a renewed vision for youth camps in the churches. Ask for faith to move forward in the midst of a host of obstacles. Churches need courage to take risks even though religious freedom is restricted. They need to recognize the need for training and support and send their people for training. Ask God to provide all staff and campers and fill every camp with the Joy of the Lord this summer.

WATER SAFETY

Gerald and Bev Huebner from Arborg, Manitoba, are joining us to teach water safety to our camp leaders at the May National Camp Leaders Training Camp in Ukraine. They will also teach a four
