CAMP ANSWERS QUESTIONS

By God's grace, and through many camp related experiences, Alex B. has developed a burning heart for serving God. Staff and campers at Mountain Pass Camp like him because he is skilled in building relationships, consistent, organized, and overcomes difficulties well. Mountain Pass, a tent camp, had 270 campers this summer; 90% of the campers had never been to a church. "Many teenagers," reported Alex, "leave camp having experienced the love of Christ in their lives. I see how the seed of love which was planted in my heart long ago, grows in the hearts of teenagers."

Read Alex' story as he related it:

I am the youngest of four children. My mom is a music teacher and my father, a truck driver. He left home when I was 10, so Mom did her best to take care of us.

I had difficulty pronouncing five sounds so it was difficult



to understand me. My classmates as well as my neighbourhood never accepted me. Until age 12, I only saw people hurting, humiliating and offending one another. The only person who showed love and understanding was my Mom. I wondered why life was so tough and why good things were so far away from me.

I heard about Shelter+ at school and got interested in the photography, journalism, video and English classes they offered. (Shelter+ is a successful yearround Christian youth ministry in Kriviy Rig, Ukraine, which grew out of Green Pastures, a camp with KVI roots). They accepted me even though it was difficult to understand me. The staff sincerely loved one another and cared about me. I learned to pronounce all sounds. It was a miracle from God. I started to read the Bible and my life changed. I felt God was alive and lived in me. My life became meaningful.

At age 15, I had the opportunity to attend Camp Vertical. I was thinking about my life a lot. The ten Biblical values that were taught and the ten Bible ...cont'd page 2

verses I memorized made a great impact on me. I promised God I would serve Him only. Those values were stored in my memory and whenever I make a decision, I remember them.

The next Spring, I wanted to attend the KVI sponsored Staff Training Workshop. The minimum age was 18 and I was only 16! By special permission, I was admitted. I was impressed by the number of Christians who wanted to serve God, were dedicated to one cause and wanted to do it right. I took the counselor course. Everything Dave told us about being a counselor, taking care of children, loving and accepting them, was very useful for me a few weeks later when I was counseling at Mountain Pass Camp.

The atmosphere at Mountain Pass Camp was so special that I wanted to return the next season. The director invited me! I served wherever something needed to be done. The changed hearts of children and youth inspired me. Eventually I was asked to be the Program Director. This year I became the Director of Mountain Pass Camp.

Camp answers questions which cannot be answered by parents or friends. Camp unleashes campers' potential. I am thankful to God for His leading in my life. I want to be faithful wherever He places me.

HOT SUMMER

Irina S, director of Camp Friends for Life, attended KVI's Staff Training Workshop about 20 years ago. Today she is the coordinator of the camps in their denomination in a country where Christian camps are prohibited. For this reason they used tents and moved from one location to another for safety.



The temperature was 50 degrees on the first day of one of their Day Camps. Thirty-two teenagers showed up. "We played games, sprayed water on the campers and prayed that there would be no sunstroke or heat exhaustion," Irina reported. "The heat continued but the teenagers showed up every day. The highlight of the camp was when six teenagers repented and decided to follow Jesus. The mother of one of the boys called Irina to thank her and the staff for operating a great camp and said they deserved the highest title and award from the Ministry of Education.

A VERY HAPPY PERSON

My mother is a Christian. In order not to offend her, I went to church. Because I was not close to the Lord, I became friends with bad guys. We did the usual bad things. But even worse, I participated in roof-walking on high story buildings putting my life at risk.

At age 14, I attended Camp Shalom. The atmosphere was great – lots of love and genuine friendships among

people. My counselor showed me by his own example that to live with God is much better than to live without Him. I really saw Jesus at camp.

I couldn't resist. A few months later I knelt, repented and asked God to forgive my sins. I quit all my bad habits, and most importantly, I stopped swearing. God changed my life. Today I am a very happy person.

These are parent responses after their sons returned from Camp Vertical. Vertical has a ten month Discipleship Program to guide the boys in becoming godly men. The boys restudy each Bible lesson for one month to learn and apply the principle. **Thank**

- For the mentors as they call the boys each week to hold them accountable
- For Igor, the Vertical Prayer Coordinator, who encourages prayer partners to pray passionately, like Daniel
- For a suitable campsite in Ukraine for Vertical to purchase to stabilize the camp.

Five of the orphans who wanted change in their lives, arrived at camp. They were assigned to various tent groups in order to avoid problems. Except for a few incidents, the camp ran smoothly. The intense sports program, canoe trips, cooking their own dinners, the manly camp atmosphere, made the boys wish the camp session was longer and gave them the desire to return next year.

In a telephone conversation with Elena after the five boys returned home, Viktor heard the following comments:

- The Bible is read often. Prayers are not only about themselves but also for others. Loyalty to each other has increased.
- Vladimir now thinks before he speaks.
- Edward became calmer. He prays and seeks God more.
- Rustam became more confident in his behaviour. He said, "I want to be at Vertical as often as possible. I want to become a counselor."
- Andy matured. He was surprised to be with so many men and teenagers who pray together.
- Nikolai is a difficult boy. We hope his camp experience will help him find the Truth in life. He learned all ten Bible verses and wants to recite them.

The five boys decided to be baptized and on September 2 it happened. Elena ended the conversation by thanking Viktor for accepting her boys at camp and spending time with each one. They are looking forward to attending the Vertical reunion this fall.
