flakebelly Announces New Album "The Boy in The Diving Bell" - A Lo-Fi Folk Album Rooted in Memory and Noise

Stornoway, Scotland – flakebelly, the multi-instrumentalist and experimental recording artist, is set to release his highly anticipated new album, The Boy In The Diving Bell, on 15 August 2025. This profoundly introspective and boldly experimental record marks the first part of a trilogy exploring memory, perception, and identity through a unique fusion of alt-folk and fractured psychedelia.

At the heart of the record lies a 1960s reel-to-reel tape machine, manipulated in real time to produce warping loops, mechanical blurps, and ghostly echoes. Treated as an instrument rather than a recording device, it helps twist the album's timeline into something dreamlike and unstable - stretching songs into surreal abstractions or tearing them into fragments. These raw performances are captured directly to tape, resulting in unpredictable, tactile textures that feel lived-in and unrepeatable.

The songs veer between short, uncanny vignettes and longer, hypnotic meditations. Field recordings of wind & water bleed into finger-picked guitar laments; ambient interludes act like postcards from a disintegrating consciousness. Recorded and mixed entirely alone at home, the album leans into its own instability - mistakes are left in, first takes often stay, and the rough edges are kept deliberately raw. It's the sound of someone following a thread in the dark, embracing the friction and fragility that make the music feel human.

The first single, At The Prow of The Lifeboat, offers an early glimpse into this world. A sweeping folk lament threaded with strings and haunted by the sea, it sets the emotional tone for the journey ahead. Flakebelly's voice drifts through the murk like a warning bell - intimate, cracked, and unsure of the shoreline. What follows is a record that collapses time and sound into a singular, unvarnished expression of inner life.

"I wanted the album to sound like a water-damaged attic box filled with your most precious things," says flakebelly. "Like finding someone else's memories behind the wallpaper - warped, forgotten, a little unsettling. It's part time capsule, part ghost story. Something intimate and cracked that maybe shouldn't have been found."
