



Metedeconk Questers Fund Raiser for the State's P&R Fund

Because Metedeconk Questers had a State Questers payment coming due in Fall 2025, we decided to start thinking about how to raise \$1500 (the expected contribution at the time) in the Fall of 2023. We explored several possibilities before past president Sheila Williams suggested that we team with the Algonquin Theater in Manasquan who planned a May 2024 presentation of Grease.

We all loved the idea and pursued how we could turn this concept into a success! We asked all our Metedeconk members to either purchase two tickets, sell two tickets, or contribute to the profit we would make from the sale of two tickets, 100% of our members agreed and did this! In addition, we received support from another Questers chapter, Olde Cape Lighthouse, as well as members from other chapters purchasing tickets for this great show. So, we settled our bill with the Algonquin months before the show in May and realized a profit of \$1,780.00 with NO expenses incurred. Then, NJ State Questers approved reducing the donation to them to \$1,250.00. We ended up adding \$530.00 to Metedeconk's P&R fund raising account! It was a win-win all around!!

SANDPIPERS #1501

In June we had a wonderful, educational trip to the Mickleton, Swedesboro and Pitman area of New Jersey. Many of us had never been to this area of New Jersey before and we were fascinated by all the history the area offers.

We visited the Little Red Schoolhouse (built in 1809), the Quaker Friends Meeting House (Quakers have been in the area since 1726), and the Pollinator Garden in Mickleton. After lunch had a tour of the Trinity Episcopal Old Swedes Church, whose history dates back to 1706, and the Schorn Cabin, circa 1750 or earlier. Many of us stayed overnight in the area and the next day had a docent-led tour of the Pitman Historical Museum in Pitman Grove. The Pitman Grove Area is on the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places and developed from a summer "tent camp" meeting beginning in 1870. In the center of the park is the Pitman Grove Auditorium. Twelve avenues, numbered one through twelve, radiate like spokes on the hub of a wheel from the park circle. The community is much like Ocean Grove in Monmouth County. Several Sandpipers then visited Duffield's Farm Market in Sewell, NJ, before heading home.

NJ Questers State President, Beth Wipperman, gave a short speech explaining the purpose and mission of our Questers organization to the audience gathered. Beth also mentioned the many projects the NJ Questers have supported and helped finance at the Village including a fireplace hearth restoration and the repair and restoration of a "Star and Eagle" flag c. 1850s, the History Kid's Club, as well as the herbal tea garden. Also being celebrated that day was Mr. James Allaire, founder of Allaire Village on what would have been his 240th birthday. We enjoyed birthday cake and lemonade in what was Mr. Allaire's home on the property. It was a lovely event!



New Jersey Questers Chapter Matching Grant

Olde Cape Lighthouse #1212 received \$1,000.00 NJ State Questers Matching Grant for the restoration of Dr. Physick's Davenport Sofa at the 1879 Emlen Physick Estate in Cape May.

Olde Cape Lighthouse #1212, based in Cape May County, has always had a special interest in the historic sites maintained by the non-profit organization Cape May M.A.C.

The chapter was named for the iconic lighthouse at the tip of the Cape, the second structure to be restored by M.A.C., and over the years many of the chapter members have been volunteers and/or employees of the organization. While the chapter has given funds for a variety of preservation and restoration projects around the region, most recently for window restoration at Naval Air Station Wildwood Hangar #1, we return time and again to Cape May M.A.C.'s original P&R project, the Emlen Physick Estate Victorian House Museum. Over the years Olde Cape Lighthouse #1212 has contributed funds for the restoration of multiple objects in the museum including a commemorative book from the 1876 Centennial celebration, a hand-colored etching which belonged to Dr. Physick, several oil paintings and the reupholstery of Dr. Physick's Morris Chair. Most of these projects were accomplished with State Grants from our NJ State Board.

This year we were delighted to receive another Grant from the NJ Board that will go toward the reupholstery and refurbishing of Dr. Physick's Davenport that is displayed in the Family Parlor of the museum. This unusual piece is the "original futon," as some have claimed, since the arms of the sofa can be adjusted to allow the back to drop down making it into a "sofa-bed" of sorts.

The fabric on the Davenport has faded and worn due to its many years of exposure to light and humidity, and the wooden frame is also in need of repair and refreshing. A team from the museum division of M.A.C. has worked with an expert in restoration to choose a fabric that will most closely reflect the original, and our chapter members are anxiously awaiting the completion of the project.

INTERNATIONAL P&R GRANTS PROGRAM

3RD VICE PRESIDENT REPORT, Carol Duffy

This is the year New Jersey Questers chapters can apply for International Preservation & Restoration Grants. Application forms and guidelines are available at www.questers1944.org under "Grants."

All completed application forms must be postmarked on or before the deadline date of November 15th of this year and submitted to:

International PRESERVATION & RESTORATION Chair

Gene Serbus

It is suggested to start early and send in application to P&R chair to make sure you have sent in everything before the deadline date. He will let you know if missing anything.

All chapter projects must be completed within one year from the date of the award. The chapter must contribute at least 20% of the grant requested, i.e. grant requested = \$5,000; chapter must contribute at least \$1,000 (20%). A copy of the Project Approval Letter(s) from your State/Provincial Board must be submitted with this application: 1. Project approval 2. Fundraising approval if done OUTSIDE of the chapter. It is important to follow all instructions!

Applications that do not TOTALLY COMPLY with instructions WILL NOT be considered. Return completed application with copies of required forms, letters, and any additional information to THE QUESTERS International P&R Chair. Keep a copy of this application for your file. All fundraising Approved grants are announced and checks awarded at the Annual Luncheon held during the Questers International Convention. At the 2024 International Questers Convention, 17 international grants were awarded going to 11 states.






News for Qs

37 min (41.4 mi)

Merge onto Garden State Pkwy S

Use the right 2 lanes to take exit 98 for NJ-34 N/NJ-34 S toward I-195 W/Trenton

Use the left lane to merge onto NJ-34 S via the ramp to Brielle

Merge onto NJ-34 S- go thru light south ↻

At the traffic circle, exit onto Allaire Rd- 3rd turn 2.2 mi

Keep right, follow signs for NJ 138 E and merge onto 138 E. Travel to third light New Bedford Road turn right at light. Travel to 2nd light, turn left onto Allaire Rd. take the immediate right onto Warren Ave.

At 3rd light, Turn right onto NJ-71 S, travel down road to Spring Lake Manor on right side of road. Will have just missed it if you hit a light at the 7/11.
