

Letter from the Editor

Hello everyone and thank you for taking the time to read the first full issue of Cosplay Kingdom Magazine! I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself and give you a little background information on how this all got started and where I plan to head with it.

It should be noted, my experience in the cosplay world, at the time of writing this letter, has spanned the length of about 20 total days. Yes, you read that correctly, 20 days.

Let me start with a little background information on me. I've been a photographer for several years, the bulk of my work being comprised of shooting weddings, senior portraits, musical events, and occasionally some video work here and there. Rarely do I go anywhere without my camera, and a cosplay convention would certainly be no exception.

Recently, I had been hired to do some videography work for a local music festival and



while shooting the festival, I met Michelle (IG: @zadrabug), who is an avid cosplayer that also practices the art of hooping (otherwise known as hula hooping or hoop dance). I was instantly intrigued when I saw her hooping at the music festival and to ask if I could film her while she performed. She consented and provided me with some great footage. Afterward, we had some time to chat, and started talking about the cosplay community. During our conversation, she suggested that I check out a cosplay conference sometime, and I thought it sounded like a cool idea.

After filming the festival, I packed my gear and left for the evening, but continued to think about getting involved in cosplay photography. My first thought was that this sounds like a great opportunity to get some really cool images. I've always been a big fan of Halloween, horror movies, and costumes in general, and cosplay really seemed to fit that genre.

I'll admit, I wasn't totally oblivious to things like cosplay and Comic Con. In the past, I had frequented and photographed renaissance faires in both Maryland and Pennsylvania, and also recalled several friends who spoke of Comic Con and attending conventions. The concept of cosplay events and the community surrounding them was nothing new, but I never actually attended.

I needed to do my due diligence and complete some research. I searched the internet looking for examples of cosplay work done by other photographers and videographers. During my search, I found some amazing work. Of course, my goal was to see the work and style of images that other photographers and videographers produced while working a convention. After viewing more than a few images and videos I found the cosplayers and costumes to be quite interesting and exciting.

The craftsmanship, the functionality, the dedication, the sheer beauty all pushed me over the edge.

I was hooked immediately and knew I had to make solid plans to attend. At the end of August 2022, the next upcoming convention in my area was Colossalcon East 2022. I locked it into my calendar.

As the date of the convention approached, I started preparing by cleaning my lenses, charging my batteries, packing my gear, and I even put a raft in the back of my Mazda 5 to sleep on since I didn't have a room booked. By the way, I don't recommend Hotel Mazda, but that's an entirely different story.

Once I arrived, parked, and walked into Kalahari Convention Center, I just took a moment to look around and absorb the atmosphere. There were cosplayers waiting in line for registration and there were a LOT of them. My immediate impulse was to break out the camera and start filming. But I didn't do that. Instead, I walked around a bit to get the lay of the land and see what locations at the resort would be best for capturing some footage.

Kalahari has some awesome features, such as the arcade, the back patio, the wave pool and indoor water park. It was immediately easy to see that this would be a pretty awesome chance to get some cool footage.

I fell in love with cosplay immediately, and know that this will become a life-long interest on many levels. In the two short days I was at Colossalcon East, I was introduced to a completely new world. I am intrigued by the costumes, the creative process, and the cosplayer's level of enjoyment they experience from bringing a character to life. It is all truly and art and I am thrilled to be a part of it. Cosplayers are fun, energetic, and friendly people and I made more than a handful of new friends during the event.

The key takeaway from this experience, and something I've known for a long time, is that I love being involved with the editing aspect of photography and videography. I can sit for hours on end, editing photos and videos, because I love learning the software and producing digital products.



For me, Cosplay Kingdom Magazine will be a personal way to express and share elements of cosplaying. It will feature cosplayers and photgraphers, articles, reviews, vendors, and more from conventions around the world. My hope is that readers will find it enjoyable, useful, and fun to read.




