

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2023-49 A RESOLUTION

RESCINDING RESOLUTION 2023-38 PROCLAMATION OF EXTREME DROUGHT AND BAN ON THE SALE AND USE OF CERTAIN FIREWORKS IN THE UNINCORPORATED PORTIONS OF UNION COUNTY

WHEREAS, The Union County Board of Commissioners approved and adopted Resolution 2023-38 proclaiming extreme drought conditions and restricting the sale and use of certain types of fireworks withing the unincorporated areas of Union County on May 16, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the duration of the resolution was effective for 30 days from May 29,2023 at which time the Board of County Commissioners could extend, modify, or rescind within the 30 days; and

WHEREAS, current drought indices published by the National Weather Service show improved drought conditions within the unincorporated portions of Union County due to significant amounts of rainfall.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Resolution 2023-38 proclaiming extreme drought conditions and to ban the sale and use of certain fireworks in the unincorporated portions of Union County be rescinded effective upon the adoption of this resolution.


