At 9:02 a.m., Chairman Kiesling called the meeting to order in the Commission Chambers located in the Union County Administration Building. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Bennett moved to approve the agenda and the regular meeting minutes of December 9, 2024 with minor corrections. Commissioner Miller seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: ALL AYE. The minutes were signed.

HOSPITAL REPORT

Tammie Stump, CEO, reported on statistics for September. The “County Commissioner Monthly Hospital Report” was distributed to the board prior to the meeting. Items covered and discussed included the following: *Provider Recruitment Update, Financial Assistance, Business/Financial Update, Compliance, Radiology Report, Plant Services, Therapy Services, Pharmacy, Laboratory/Infection Control, Union County/Des Moines Health Center, IT and Special Projects.*

Tammie Stump, CEO, reported on financials for December. The “Union County General Consolidated Executive Financial Summary” and the “Clayton Health Systems October 28, 2024 Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements Period Ending November 30, 2024” was distributed to the board prior to the meeting. Items covered and discussed included the following: *Key Statistics, Statement of Revenue and Expenses – YTD and Balance Sheet.* The board was informed a temporary CFO has been hired and will fill in until a permanent replacement has been hired and interviews have been started. It was also brought forth there are steps being taken to look into bringing a Mental Outpatient program to the community, more information will be provided as this progresses.

Amanda Archuleta, CNO, reported on the following: *Nursing, Swing Bed, Social Work Consults and Trauma.*

Public Hearing-Low Income Tax Rebate Ordinance Consideration

The floor was opened to discuss the Low Tax Rebate Ordinance, after no discussion was brought forth, the ordinance was denied.

CITIZENS FORUM

There was a total of 25 in attendance to discuss the NIETC-National Interest Electric Transmission Corridor. Chairman Keisling welcomed all guest and began the forum giving information concerning the Quay Commissioners meeting with the DOE regarding the grid deployment of the corridors for potential transmission lines. There are 3 phases regarding the corridors and the third phase of the process is for public engagement. The Southwest Corridor is located in Union County, Chairman Keisling gave information for viewing the proposed corridor by visiting the NIETC website. It was stated that private energy companies will have the ability to work with landowners regarding transmission lines, if there are problems DOE could

become involved and imminent domain could be enforced. The floor was open for discussion, Michelle Frost Maynard of the New Mexico Cattle Growers Association began the discussion.

Mrs. Maynard gave an introduction to herself and gave information how the corridor would affect not only her family ranch but others as well if the government becomes involved. Mrs. Maynor gave detailed information on how the corridor could affect the lively hood of not only the landowner but the environment, stating this corridor would give all the power to the energy company and the government. Mrs. Maynord also stated that the corridor would affect the county by taking the land off of the tax roll, effecting the money that supports the county. Mrs. Maynord is visiting all counties and asking each county commissioner to send letters requesting the DOE for personal meetings. She is also asking that all landowners stand together.

Commissioner Bennett made a statement commending the former commissioners for already drafting a letter to the DOE requesting a meeting and stating our county's concerns and read it to the forum.

Cliff Copeland spoke next, he also attended the Quay Commissioners meeting, giving a little more insight into the topic. He appreciated all the steps the board is already taking and thanked them. Mr. Copeland started with saying the concern is not against the major powerlines, stating he knows it is good for growth and for private negotiations between the power companies and the landowners and against the government coming in and taking the land. This will not only affect the private land owned, but federal and state land as well. Mr. Copeland stated it would be helpful to get the information out to landowners that may not even have knowledge of the corridor and requested if the commissioner could get out the county mapping system and overlay it over where the proposed corridor is to be and send out a letter and information to the land owners that would be affected and may not have that information. Chairman Keisling stated the commissioners would work with the assessor's office to see what could be done to help with this request. Commissioner Bennet gave a website where the public can visit to view the map, www.gem.anl.gov on the main page look for NIETC. Mr. Copeland requested that the commissioner's may look into a coalition with the other county commissioners effected by the corridor and come together as a group to put forth information and requests and show unity and address issues that may affect not just one county but many. Mr. Copeland stated this in not just a Union County issue, but an Eastern New Mexico issue.

Shelly Carter requested the letter that has already been issued to the DOE, be issued again to the new DOE once the new administration takes office.

Ben Creighton asked if the corridor was for any renewable source, or just wind energy. Charman Keisling stated he understood it was any renewable energy source.

Sharron Morris asked where landowners needed to send their letters, the following email address was given nietc@hq.doe.gov

Chairman Keisling thanked all that attend and for the input and questions and closed the forum.

RESOLUTION 2025-38 SIGNATURE AUTHORITY COUNTY MANAGER

Manager Thompson presented resolution 2025-38 discussion was held and was agreed the county manager has the authority to sign contracts with vendors, contractors and professional service providers and State and

Federal Agencies with stipulations funds must be budgeted and available. County Manager must consult with Chairman for any amount over \$500,000.00.

Commissioner Bennett moved to approve Resolution 2025-38 Signature Authority County Manager. Commissioner Miller seconded. There was no further discussion. VOTE: ALL AYE. Resolution signed.

REPORT AND PRESENTATION- DWI COORDINATOR JOE REESER

DWI Coordinator Joe Reeser presented to the board a detailed overview of the DWI program and the services provided to the community.

Discussion was held regarding the DWI Grant Application and Distribution program.

Manager Thompson presented information concerning the cell tower permits and negotiations stating once they are done a Resolution and Ordinance will be presented to the board.

Commissioner Bennett moved to approve bills in the amount of \$579,439.84 and to give the county manager authority pay any outstanding bills. Commissioner Miller seconded. There was no further discussion. VOTE: ALL AYE. Motion carried.

INVENTORY ITEMS DISPOSITION – ROAD DEPARTMENT INTERNATIONAL WATER TRUCK

No items were presented for disposition.

STRATEGIC REVIEW

Manager Thompson presented the Board with reviewing the Counties Strategic plan. Updates were given on time line where next steps are to start.

COUNTY TRAVEL REQUESTS

A number of requests for travel to Legislative Luncheon in Santa Fe

COUNTY MANAGER REPORT

Manager Thompson started her report with recognition of the Volunteer Fire Departments and the good jobs they are doing. An update was given on the Hospital Operations agreement and project for the generator for the Magistrate/Courthouse building.

ROAD SUPERINTENDENT

Road Admin Rachel Farnum along with Road Superintendent Gary Wright gave updates on removal of tires, And equipment that is in need of repairs. It was suggested to calculate if leasing vs owning road equipment would be more cost efficient for the county. Road Administer Rachel Farnum is going to gather the information and bring to the Commissioners. Contracts are out for new caliche and water pit. Road Admin Rachel Farnum gave an update on new road signs that have been ordered.

EMERGENCY SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORT

Emergency Manager Kris Lawrence reported about up coming Fire Academy and equipment to be used, it will be hosted locally but take place in Raton at Philmont. There will be a Fire Chiefs meeting coming up in February. Kris wanted to comment and commend the local fire departments on a recent structure fire in town. He was very impressed with the way it was handled, especially since this is not something that the departments see regularly. An update was given on the Communication Radios. Commissioner Bennett brought up concerns about differences in Google Maps and our GPS maps when emergency calls come in. Commission Bennett would like to bring this up at next Joint Comm. to find ways to help dispatch more efficiently when emergencies come in.

ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORTS

Treasurer Arnett reported 60% of taxes have been collected as of right now. Treasure Arnette stated they are still in the process of getting the signature cards for the bank completed and the online payment system still isn't working.

Assessor Sandoval reported that the Tyler transition is going well and fixing issues they are finding. They will be conducting a second training in January. Tyler will go live in March. The office is preparing for Tax Notices. Assessor Sandoval also wanted to let the commission know of Constitutional changes that may affect the county. As of right now all assessors are on hold, if bill passes, implementation will begin in 2026.

Chief Deputy Clerk Mitchell Nothing to report

Sherriff Skaggs reported about programs that are in the works to help with transportation of inmates. Offices will be moving into their new building soon and start utilizing old Rabbit Ear Fire Dept building, looking into getting the south end of the building insulated and heated. Sherriff Skaggs also stated his concerns about

getting better information for dispatch when emergency calls are made stating that different map apps give different information and confusions can happen when trying to find where emergencies are located.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 11:37 a.m., Commissioner Bennett made motion to enter into Executive Session-Pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 10-15-1(H)7-Pertaining to threatened or pending litigation in which the County is or may be a participant. Rabbit Ear Fire Dept Class A. Commissioner Miller seconded. Chairman Kiesling request vote. Vote: ALL AYE.

Commissioner Bennett moved to come out of Executive Session at 11: 45 a.m., Commissioner Miller seconded. No action was taken. VOTE: ALL AYE. Motion carried.

Regular meeting resumed at 11:46 a.m.

ADJOURN: At 1:46 p.m., Commissioner Bennett moved to adjourn after lunch. Commissioner Miller seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: ALL AYE. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 7-38-21 property owners have the right to protest the value or classification determined for their property for property taxation purposes, and;

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 7-38-25 provides in pertinent part that there shall be a county protest board in each county, to hear and decide protest of determinations made by county assessors & protested under Section 7-37-24 NMSA 1978, consisting of three voting members & three alternatives who shall not hold any elective public office during the term of their appointment nor shall any such member of alternate be employed by the state, a political subdivision or a school district during the term of his appointment, and;

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 7-38-25 further provides that "one member and one alternate shall be a qualified elector of the county and shall be appointed by the board of county commissioners for the term of two years; one member and one alternate shall be a qualified elector of the county, shall have demonstrated experience in the field of valuation of property and shall be appointed by the board of county commissioners for a term of two years; and one member and one alternate shall be a property appraisal officer employed by the department, assigned by the director and shall be the chairman of the board."

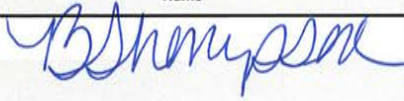

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Union County meeting in regular session on February 11, 2025 did propose to make budget adjustments; and

WHEREAS, the County of Union does, through Budget Resolution 2025-41 ask that authorization for the budgetary adjustments be granted, as summarized in the attachment; and

RESOLUTION 2025-43

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF UNION COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONTROL AND PARTICIPATION AS A COOPERATING AGENCY UNDER THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT (NEPA).

WHEREAS, the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969, 42 U.S.C. § 4321 et seq., established a national policy to promote the enhancement of the environment and requires federal agencies to assess the environmental effects of their proposed actions prior to making decisions; and

WHEREAS, the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) regulations implementing NEPA at 40 C.F.R. § 1501.8 specifically recognize the importance of including local governments as cooperating agencies due to their unique expertise, jurisdiction, and proximity to proposed projects; and

WHEREAS, local governments possess specialized knowledge, historical perspective, and practical experience concerning their respective regions that are critical to evaluating potential environmental, social, and economic impacts of federal actions; and

WHEREAS, inclusion of local governments as cooperating agencies ensures that NEPA analyses are comprehensive, well-informed, and reflective of local priorities, which leads to better project outcomes and enhanced public trust; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Union County believes that effective governance and the protection of local interests are best achieved when local governments are granted meaningful opportunities to participate in NEPA processes as cooperating agencies; and

WHEREAS, the active engagement of Union County in NEPA processes will support the county's ability to safeguard its natural resources, protect public health and safety, and promote economic development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF UNION COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, THAT:

1. **Support for Local Government Participation:** The Board strongly supports the inclusion of local governments, including Union County, as cooperating agencies under NEPA, pursuant to 40 C.F.R. § 1501.8, to provide special expertise and ensure that local concerns and priorities are addressed.
2. **Commitment to Cooperation:** Union County is committed to cooperating with federal agencies in NEPA processes to contribute its knowledge and expertise in evaluating

environmental, social, and economic impacts of proposed federal actions within its jurisdiction.

3. **Advocacy for Local Control:** The Board urges federal agencies and policymakers to uphold and strengthen local government participation in NEPA analyses, ensuring that local governments have a meaningful voice in decisions that affect their communities.
4. **Communication of Resolution:** A copy of this resolution shall be transmitted to the CEQ, relevant federal agencies, and the New Mexico Congressional Delegation to emphasize the importance of local government involvement in NEPA processes.
5. **Impact Study Request:** We additionally request comprehensive impact studies for all proposed projects to ensure thorough evaluation of environmental, economic, and social effects within Union County.
6. **Threatened and Endangered Species:** The analysis must consider the protection of 10 critical habitats and 37 threatened and endangered species that may be impacted by proposed projects.
7. **Hydrological Studies:** Hydrological studies should include detailed water use plans for proposed energy projects to ensure sustainable water management and protection of local water resources.
8. **Check Cultural Sites:** The evaluation process must include a thorough review of potential impacts on cultural and historical sites, ensuring their preservation and compliance with applicable laws.
9. **Landowners' Rights:** Landowners reserve and retain surface and subsurface rights, and fair compensation must be provided for any takings resulting from federal actions. The improper use of eminent domain to seize private property without just cause or fair compensation is expressly opposed.
10. **Categorical Exclusions:** Any categorical exclusions proposed under NEPA must be discussed with the Union County Commissioners before enactment to ensure alignment with local priorities and concerns.

The purpose of this letter is to request that Union County, New Mexico be designated as a cooperating agency for drafting, analysis and completion with the Department of Energy for its analysis of the Southwestern Grid Connector National Interest Electric Transmission Corridor pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

NEPA applies to "every major Federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment." 42 U.S.C. § 4332(2)(c). The proposed decision for the potential designation of the Southwestern Grid Connector National Interest Electric Transmission Corridor is a major federal action because it will reduce land availability for grazing or planting, especially during the construction phase, with ongoing maintenance impact in the operation phase as well. It will have direct impacts on critical habitat for wildlife and native species. As well as, increased exposure to radiation from EMF (electromagnetic field) frequencies.

As part of the requirements for completion of an environmental analysis, the Council of Environmental Quality ("CEQ") regulations state that "a state or local agency of similar qualifications [one who has special expertise] may be a cooperating agency." 40 C.F.R. § 1501.8. The analysis of whether an entity is a "local government" and has "special expertise" is a matter of state law.

Union County is a local government with special expertise. By statute, this local government is charged with providing safety, preserving the health, promote the prosperity and improve the morals, order, comfort, and convenience of any county or its inhabitants. Given this statutory authorities, Union County certainly has the "special expertise" necessary to assist the federal agency in completing its required NEPA analysis.
