At 9:03 a.m., Chairman Bennett called the meeting to order in the Union County Commissioner's Office, located in the Union County Courthouse. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the agenda and the regular meeting minutes of December 11, 2018. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. The minutes were signed.

### HOSPITAL REPORT

**Tammie Stump, CEO**, distributed copies of the "County Commissioner Monthly Hospital Report, Union County General Hospital, Tammie Stump, CEO, dated January 8, 2019" (5 pgs.), together with an attached e-mail between Stump and Jeff Dye, President and CEO of the New Mexico Hospital Association dated January 2nd and 3<sup>rd</sup> of 2019 (2 pgs.), attached as exhibits.

Stump gave a lengthy report on the following (but not limited to the following): Rural Health Clinic Update; Des Moines Clinic Update; Business Office/Revenue Cycle Update; Construction Updates - Laboratory HVAC, New Addition HVAC & Drainage Corrective Measures; Cost Reports/Revenue Impacts - Cost Reports, SNCP, 340B Program, Financials Audit and CRNA Pass Thru; Financial Assistance Update - Evident: Clinic Module; and S-10 Charity Care (Cost Report) / Financial Assistance and Corrective Measures. In addition to the written report, Stump reported that there will be mandated Patient Satisfaction Training for staff done in January.

Melissa Prante, CFO, gave a lengthy report on the following (but not limited to the following): key statistics, statement of revenue and expenses YTD, and balances. A copy of the Monthly Operating Report dated December 19, 2018 (1 pg), and the Executive Financial Summary for Union County General Consolidated (1 pg.) and Clayton Family Practice (1 pg.) 5<sup>th</sup> Month FY 2018 are attached as exhibits.

Mgr. Gonzales reported that the 4<sup>th</sup> hospital loan is eligible refinancing and Michael Newman, Financial Advisor of First Southwest Company, will be present during next month's regular meeting to explain further. Gonzales has shared the loan information with the county attorney, Steve Ross.

# DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS

### ELECTION OF COMMISSION OFFICER'S & BOARD APPOINTMENTS

The following appointments were discussed and recommended as follows: Chairperson - Justin Bennett; Vice-Chair - Carr Vincent; Equalization Board - Rosie DeHererra and Renee Valdez; Economic Development (CDC) - Clay Kiesling and Carr Vincent; Eastern Plains (EPCOG) - Justin Bennett and Angie Gonzales; Library Board - Clay Kiesling; NERTPO (Northeast Regional Transportation Planning Organization) - Clay Kiesling and Angie Gonzales; Historical Society - Carr Vincent; Chamber of Commerce - Justin Bennett and Carr Vincent; RC&D (Resource Conservation and Development Council) - Carr Vincent and Justin Bennett; NMAC (Elected) - Justin Bennett; NM County Insurance Authority - Justin Bennett and Ports-to-Plains - Clay Kiesling.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve the entire 2019 list of proposed appointments as discussed and considered. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES.

At 10:00 a.m., meeting recessed for a short break. At 10:05 a.m., the meeting resumed.

### CITIZEN'S FORUM

# PROPERTY TAX REBATE ORDINANCE HEARING

A Memorandum regarding the public hearing for the Tax Rebate Ordinance was contained in the meeting packet. The purpose of this hearing was to consider adoption of the Tax Rebate Ordinance in accordance with statute 7-2-14.3(G), and could entertain a property tax rebate for low-income taxpayers. A hearing is to be conducted in every odd year of January. Publication of notice for this hearing was done in the Union County Leader on December 19, 2018. Chairman Bennett asked if anyone wanted the statute or proposed ordinance read aloud, and there was no public comment. Bennett delivered his opinion and recommended against the adoption. Commissioners Vincent and Kiesling concurred. Chairman Bennett asked if there was a motion to approve the tax rebate. No motion was made. The hearing ended.

Avery Christie, Director of Clayton Main Street handed out copies of a "How it Works...At a Glance" item of information regarding Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Christie addressed the Board and explained the following, but not limited to the following: Clayton Main Street is a non-profit chapter of the New Mexico Main Street and operating under the New Mexico Economic Development; Main Street's mission; Imagination Library is a nationwide program for early and beginning literacy which operates in all of New Mexico's counties except for two (2). Union County is one (1) of the two (2) not participating; Avery was approached about participating in the county-wide program. Avery agreed to participate and is now looking for funding to support the program; Christie elaborated on the program details and stated that enough funding has been secured to begin the program; The Clayton Public Library will be the physical registration point; Main Street will be the fiscal agent; Christie asked that the Board considered reinstating funding to Main Street in the amount of \$1,500, which is to be used solely for the literacy program for the next fiscal year. Chairman Bennett and Mgr. Gonzales suggested to Christie that he submit a written budget request for the next fiscal year.

Ryan Smith of Rico Aviation/Air Methods Advantage handed out copies of a bound "Customer Scorecard" presentation. Smith addressed the Board about changes made to the program, specifically that there is no longer a membership program therefore, no longer offering memberships, but works through a patient advocacy program through the patient and insurance, as long as the patient engages. Smith explained various high points of the program, which included the following, but not limited to the following: hiring process of medical staff; clinical data and service quality; operational data; regional education; patient advocacy; Union County's Air Ambulance Mileage and ETA to Clayton; and distance of Rico, Lifestar and Apollo comparison. Those who have signed up for memberships, they will be honored until the end date of the agreement which is the end of May.

On another note, Smith has been coordinating with Emergency Manager Dusty Russell for the facilitation and organization of an MCI (Mass Casualty Drill) involving Union County in lieu of a tabletop exercise.

Robb Hirsch, consultant- PNE (Pure New Energy) / Gladstone New Energy Wind Farm Project addressed the Board, and thanked them for the letter of support that was written last October for the development of the Gladstone wind energy project. Hirsch reminded the Board of the benefits of having the wind farm. PNE USA, Inc. is the owner and developer of the proposed project.

Duane Enger, Director, Project Development & Project Manager - PNE (Pure New Energy)/Gladstone New Energy Wind Farm Project introduced himself to the Board. Enger thanked the Board for their support. Enger reported on the following but not limited to the following: status of the project, which is in an advanced development stage; and various project goals.

# COMMUNICATIONS TOWER LEASE WITH DURRETT CATTLE

A brief discussion was had about the tower lease. No action was taken.

Commissioner Vincent moved to table the tower lease. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

### RFP #18/19-03 ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR COUNTY AND COMPONENT UNIT

Mgr. Gonzales reported that only one (1) bid was received but not until after the deadline. Gonzales will go out for bid again. Discussion followed.

### **RESOLUTION #107-12- OPEN MEETINGS ACT**

A proposed resolution to determine what manner reasonable notice shall be given to the public for the formulation of public policy, discussion of public business, or when formal action is taken by the Board or any of its agencies, authorities, commissions, committees, or other policy-making bodies is made was reviewed and discussed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution #107-12 Open Meeting Act Policy for Union County. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. Resolution signed.

# **RESOLUTION #107-13 CHECKING ACCOUNT DEPOSITORY**

A proposed resolution designating the County checking account depository was reviewed and discussed.

#### RESOLUTION #107-14 SHORT TERM INVESTMENT

A proposed resolution designating authorized officers or successors to order the deposit or withdrawal of monies in the local short-term investment fund was reviewed and discussed.

# **RESOLUTION #107-15 BOARD OF FINANCE**

A proposed resolution which establishes the Union County Investment Policy which was attached as an exhibit and incorporated by reference was reviewed and discussed. Treasurer Thompson suggested making a change to page 3, item #1, to reflect as follows: "Certificates of Deposits, to be collateralized." Discussion followed.

### RESOLUTION #107-16 DEPOSITORIES OF INTEREST-BEARING DEPOSITS

A proposed resolution listing qualified depositories and rules regarding the distribution of county interest-bearing accounts was reviewed and discussed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution #107-13 Checking Account Depository, Resolution #107-14 Short Term Investment, Resolution #107-15 Board of Finance (with the discussed change to page 3, item #1), and Resolution #107-16 Depositories of Interest-Bearing Deposits. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. Resolutions signed.

### COMPREHENSIVE PLAN CONTRACTOR DISCUSSION

A proposal from Stantec, dated December 18, 2018, prepared by Scott Verhines, Senior Principal of Stantec Consulting Services was reviewed and discussed. The proposal was for the Town of Clayton and Union County's combined comprehensive plan. The proposed quote for services was in the surprising amount of \$244,876.00. It was the consensus that the quote was unreasonable. Discussion followed.

Chairman Bennett suggested the organization of countywide "Listening Sessions". Bennett suggested the sessions would assist in determining rural and municipal assets and resources. A collaborated road map with identified resources could be established and used as a tool for the development of the comprehensive plan.

Commissioner Kiesling reported that he has spoken with Ray Melton of USD out of Roswell, NM. Melton suggested applying for a Rural Business Development Grant. Discussion followed.

Judy Steen, Board Member/Town of Clayton Trustee reported that the TOC Mgr. Ferron Lucero has made contact with another consultant who will be making a presentation at the council's meeting tomorrow evening. The quote received by Lucero came in at \$48,000. Discussion followed. Commissioner Kiesling volunteered to attend the council's meeting.

#### SUBDIVISION EXEMPTION JOHN KENNEDY

A proposed Subdivision Ordinance Claim of Exemption and Exception Survey Plat submitted by John M. Kennedy was reviewed and discussed. The purpose of the exemption was for the "division of land resulting only in the alteration of parcel boundaries where parcels are altered for the purpose of increasing or reducing the size of contiguous parcels and where the number of parcels is not increased."

Commissioner Vincent moved to grant John M. Kennedy's claim of exemption for subdivision. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. The claim of exemption and survey signed.

### EMERGENCY MANAGER JPA CONTRACT APPROVAL

A proposed Resolution #107-18 authorizing the renewal of the Union County Emergency Manager Joint Powers Agreement was briefly reviewed and discussed. Mgr. Gonzales reported on recent conversations had with TOC Mgr. Lucero and the County attorney, Steve Ross. The agreement is ultimately approved by the County, the TOC and the Department of Finance for a period of one (1) year and may be terminated within thirty (30) days. The agreement may be extended in one (1) year increments upon written request of either party and subject to written approval by the County and the TOC. Mgr. Gonzales elaborated further on the attorney's recommendations, which included having a "perpetual renewal" term date until terminated by either party. Mgr. Gonzales recommended tabling this agenda item until the Joint Communications meeting in March. Chairman Bennett suggested that the contract approval is made more in line with the County's budget planning beginning in March, since the JPA is budgeted from July to June. It was also discussed to make the current contract effective until June 30, 2019. During the Joint Communications meeting in June, discussion and approval of a one (1) year term with modifications to the "perpetual" term date may be considered.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement between Union County and the Town of Clayton for the position of Emergency Manager with the changes made to extend the contract date to June 30, 2019. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. \* Amendment signed.

#### APPROVAL OF BILLS

The Board reviewed and discussed bills in the amount of \$164,053.62.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the payment of bills in the amount of \$164,053.62. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

# ROAD CROSSING PERMITS

The following permits were submitted by Permittee, Richard Louden. Permits were reviewed and discussed: **Permit No. 331** was for the purpose of laying pipe or cable for a livestock water line across Spool Road, 30 yards North of Spool Ranch Headquarters, and **Permit No. 332** was for the purpose of laying pipe or cable for a livestock water line across Spool Road, 50 yards North of Spool Ranch Shipping Pens. Road Superintendent agreed with approval of the permits.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve Road Crossing Permits 331 and 332. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. Permits signed.

### INVENTORY ITEMS DISPOSITION - ROAD DEPARTMENT INTERNATIONAL WATER TRUCK

No items were presented for disposition. No action was taken. This agenda item is to be tabled.

# **HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM - Approval of Claims**

There were eight (8) claims presented for consideration. Claims were reviewed and discussed in the amount of \$1,119.36.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the payment of eight (8) health care assistance claims totaling \$1,119.36. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

# **COUNTY TRAVEL REQUESTS**

The following employees reported/requested travel approval: Probate Judge Leslie Taylor, Probate Clerk Mary Lou Harkins and Deputy Clerk Brenda Green (Green will be allowed to attend if Judge Taylor is unable to attend the conference) will be attending the **Annual Probate Conference in Albuquerque** on February 5<sup>th</sup> through the 7<sup>th</sup>; Chairman Bennett, Commissioners Vincent and Kiesling, Clerk Harkins, Chief Deputy Clerk Green, Deputy Clerk Gonzalez, Treasurer Thompson, Assessor Trujillo, and Administrative Assistance Garcia will all be attending the **Mid-Winter Legislative Conference in Santa Fe** during the week of January 14<sup>th</sup>. Chairman Bennett, Commissioners Vincent, and Kiesling, Clerk Harkins, Chief Deputy Clerk Green, Treasurer Thompson, Mgr. Gonzales and Administrative Assistant Garcia will be traveling for and attending the Legislative Luncheon in Santa Fe on January 27-28. Commissioner Kiesling will be attending the **NERTPO meeting** on January 23<sup>rd</sup> in Santa Fe. Hollie Cruz will be attending the **Property Tax Workshop** on January 30<sup>th</sup> in Santa Fe. All travel approved.

Mgr. Gonzales reminded the elected officials that if there are any proposed legislative bills that require a resolution of support or opposition that this can be added to the February meeting agenda or a special meeting may be called between now and then. Elected officials briefly spoke about various bills that should be watched closely during this legislative session.

# REVIEW OF THE 5<sup>th</sup> AMENDED OPERATING AGREEMENT WITH CLAYTON HEALTH SYSTEMS

Mgr. Gonzales reminded the Board that this agenda item was for the purpose of reviewing the amended operating agreement for sufficiency and effectiveness. Gonzales is working on the amended agreement together with the county attorney, Steve Ross. This item will be kept on the agenda for review and consideration. No action was taken.

### ROAD SUPERINTENDANT'S REPORT

Superintendent Kear reported on the following but not limited to the following: Holland Road project is almost complete; will begin the project on Pinabetes Road today; Garcia and Harris Road repairs will be worked on soon; recently the southern end of the County received the heaviest snow which required attention; regular countywide routine road maintenance; and the road department is not fully staffed (1 position down), and will be probably be advertising in February. Commissioner Vincent asked that Kear keep an eye on Weatherly Road because the state highway department is hauling millings through Weatherly Road to 370 and Atencio Road.

### FIRE COORDINATOR REPORT

No report was given.

#### EMERGENCY MANAGER REPORT

Mgr. Russell handed out copies of his report dated January 4, 2019 (1 pg. attached as an exhibit). Russell reported on the following but not limited to the following: LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee) & ReTrAC; EMPG (Emergency Management Performance Grant) used for radios; Hazard Mitigation Grant; Communications (Dispatch & Fire Departments) Baca Valley to start radios and console programming at the PD; CAD (computer-aided dispatch) will be going with a Motorola unit; and upcoming meeting dates.

# **ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORTS**

Clerk Harkins reported that all county municipalities have opted-in to the Local Consolidate Election except for Grenville. Harkins reported to the Board that unless something changes during this year's legislative session, the County Commissioners will be the canvass board for the consolidated local election.

Commissioner Vincent reported that he is working towards a resolution regarding the antelope hunts.

Mgr. Gonzales reported on behalf of **Sheriff Lobb** which included working through the heavy Christmas Holiday traffic, roadblocks, and accidents. Mgr. Gonzales reported that there will be a Safety Committee meeting on Thursday. The committee includes herself, Superintendent Kear, Sheriff Lobb and Mgr. Emergency Russell.

Chairman Bennett reported that Colfax County Commissioner Bill Sauble will carry the water study funding for the four-county area of Union, Colfax, Mora and Harding Counties with the sponsorship of Senator Garcia out of San Miguel County.

Meeting Announcements: The next regular meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 12, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. The next Joint Communications meeting is set for Tuesday, March 12, 2019, at 9:30 a.m.

# JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

This JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") is made and entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2017, by and between the VILLAGE OF DES MOINES, New Mexico, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the Laws of the State of New Mexico (hereinafter referred to as "the Village") and the County of Union, a political subdivision of the State of New Mexico organized and existing under NMSA 1978, Section 4-31-1 (1893, as amended) (hereinafter referred to as "the County").

# **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the Village and County wish to enter into an agreement pursuant to the *Joint Powers Agreements Act*, NMSA 1978, Sections 11-1-1 to 11-1-7 (1961, as amended), and the *Law Enforcement Protection Fund Act*, NMSA 1978, Sections 29-13-1 through 29-13-19 (1983, as amended)(hereinafter referred to as "LEP") whereby limited law enforcement services will be provided to the Village by the Union in exchange for apparatus and equipment under a grant to the Village under LEP;

WHEREAS, the Village currently is seeking the sum of \$20,000 through the LEP for purchase of law enforcement apparatus and equipment pursuant to Section 29-13-7(A)(1) of LEP;

WHEREAS, the County desires to utilize apparatus and equipment purchased by the Village pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 29-13-7(A)(1) for the support and assistance of its officers, in exchange for limited police protection for the Village; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to set forth herein their mutual agreements and covenants with respect to the limited police protection afforded by this Agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the promises, terms, covenants and conditions contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

# I. <u>Police Protection.</u>

A. The Village has qualified for LEP funds in the amount of \$20,000, which shall be used to purchase apparatus and equipment as described in NMSA 1978, Section 29-13-7(A)(1) and as otherwise specified in Regulations of the State of New Mexico and the grant agreement. The Village agrees that said monies shall be used to purchase qualified law enforcement apparatus and equipment as set forth in the LEP. The specific apparatus and equipment purchased by the Village for the Union County Sheriff shall be specified by the Sheriff, and may or may not be related to the limited law enforcement protection provided in this Agreement. The Village agrees that the said apparatus and equipment shall be dedicated and maintained for the exclusive use of members of Union County Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff may assist the Village in the purchase of the covered equipment.

- B. The Sheriff agrees, in consideration of the exclusive use of the apparatus and equipment, to provide three (3) man hours of law enforcement coverage within the municipal limits of the Village each day, or, alternately, fifteen (15) man hours of law enforcement coverage per week for five (5) day periods, in a manner suitable to the Village and consistent with assignments and schedules of the Sheriff's Office, over which the Sheriff retains sole authority.
- C. The daily policing periods and schedules are subject to emergencies and subject to statutory prisoner transport responsibilities of the Sheriff's Office.

# II. Term.

This Agreement shall become effective upon execution by the parties hereto, and upon approval by the Department of Finance and Administration, State of New Mexico. The Parties agree that this Agreement will continue in effect for the 2017-2018 fiscal year unless one of the parties hereto notifies the other of its termination as set forth below. The parties also agree.

notwithstanding approval as required in Paragraph XIII, that this agreement is conditioned on receipt by the Village of LEP funds.

# III. Right of Termination.

Either party to this Agreement may terminate the Agreement by written notice to the other party no later than thirty (30) days prior to the actual termination.

# IV. <u>Disposition of Property.</u>

All qualified law enforcement property or equipment acquired by the Village as the result of this Agreement shall, upon termination of this Agreement, remain property of the Village and shall be returned to the Village.

# V. Strict Accountability.

The parties hereto shall be strictly accountable for all receipts and disbursements made pursuant to this Agreement. After termination of this Agreement, any and all surplus money on hand shall be returned to the parties in proportion to the contributions made.

# VI. Liability

Neither party hereto shall be responsible for the liability incurred as a result of the other party's acts or omissions in connection with this agreement. Any liability incurred in connection with this Agreement is subject to the immunities and limitations of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 41-41-1 et seq. as amended. This paragraph is intended only to define the liabilities between the parties hereto and is not intended to modify, in any way, the parties' liabilities as governed by common law or the New Mexico Tort Claims Act, and the parties and their "public employees," as defined by the New Mexico Tort Claims Act, do not waive sovereign immunity, do not waive any defense and do not waive any limitation on their liability pursuant to law. No provision of this Agreement modifies or waives any provision of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

# VII. Insurance.

The County of Union shall include any and all qualified apparatus and equipment as contemplated herein in its current inventory of insured property, until finished with the property.

# VIII. Paragraph Headings.

Paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for convenience or reference and are not intended to define or limit the scope of any provision of this Agreement.

# IX. Merger.

This Agreement embodies the entire agreement of the parties. There are no promises, terms, covenants, or obligations other than those contained or incorporated in this Agreement.

# X. <u>Amendment.</u>

This Agreement shall not be modified, altered, or amended except in writing signed by the Village and the County, and approved by the Department of Finance and Administration.

# XI. Governing Law.

This Agreement shall be governed by the Laws of the State of New Mexico. This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the *Joint Powers Agreement Act,* NMSA 1987 State Statue 11-1-1 through 11-1-7 (1961), and the *Law Enforcement Protection Fund Act,* NMSA 1978, Sections 29-13-1 through 29-13-19 (1983, as amended). Venue for any disputes between the parties shall be in the Eighth Judicial District Court of the State of New Mexico.

# XII. No Third Party Beneficiary

It is specifically agreed between the parties executing this Agreement that is not intended by any of the provisions of any part of this Agreement to create in the public, or any member thereof, a third party beneficiary to this Agreement to sue for wrongful death, personal injury, property damage or for any other form of legal or equitable relief.

# XIII. Approval

This Agreement is subject to the approval of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration pursuant to the *Joint Powers Agreements Act,* NMSA 1987 State Statue 11-1-1 through 11-1-7 (1961.

RE: 2019 Voter Registration File Maintenance

Dear Clerks:

Pursuant to Section 1-4-28 NMSA 1978 of the New Mexico Election Code, the secretary of state, county clerks, and boards of registration, in compliance with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA), shall remove from the official list of eligible voters the names of voters who are ineligible to vote due to a change of residence. This process occurs each odd numbered year and is based upon the results of the confirmation mailing sent by the secretary of state two years prior. In preparation for the 2019 voter registration file maintenance the secretary of state conducted a uniform and non-discriminatory confirmation mailing in August 2016.

The file maintenance process is intiated by each county clerk in corrdination with local political party chairs and county commissioners to establish the board of registration. Pursuant to 1-4-33 NMSA 1978, on or before the first Monday of February of each odd numbered year, in this case February 4, 2019, the county chair of each of the qualified political parties may provide the board of county commissioners with a list of four voters in the county as a recommendation to be a member of the board of registration. Each party chair must indicate their preference for appointment by placing the number 1-4 opposite the name of each person on the list.

Pursuant to 1-4-34 NMSA 1978, the county commissioners must then meet at its first regularly scheduled meeting in February and appoint three voters from the lists who shall constitute the board of registration for the county. The commissioners must give preference to the names in the order indicated by the local party chairs. No more than two of the three persons appointed to the board of registration shall be members of the same major political party at the time of their appointment, provided that if a major party does not have a voter able to fill the position, a voter from another major party may be selected by the county clerk. Additionally, the county commissioners shall appoint two alternates who shall not belong to the same political party at the time of their appointment.

Once the board of registration is selected, the county clerk or authorized deputy shall serve as the secretary to the board. Additionally, the board is required to meet in the office of the county clerk no later than March 15, 2019 and is eligible for per diem and mileage out of the regular county budget.

WHEREAS, the application prescribed by the Authority has been completed and submitted to the Governing Body and this resolution approving submission of the completed Application to the Authority for its consideration and review is required as part of the Application.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE County of Union:

- Section 1. That all action (not consistent with the provision hereof) heretofore taken by the Governing body and the officers and employees thereof directed toward the Application and the Project, be and the same is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.
- Section 2. That the completed Application submitted to the Governing Body, be and the same is hereby approved and confirmed.
- Section 3. That the officers and employees of the Governing Body are hereby directed and requested to submit the completed Application to the Authority for its review, and are further authorized to take such other action as may be requested by the Authority in its consideration and review of the Application and to further proceed with arrangements for financing the Project.

Section 4. All acts and resolutions in conflict with this resolution are hereby rescinded, annulled and repealed.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

I have been in communication with Zack at NMFA today, and can share the attached refunding analysis. Key points are as follows:

- The County is not putting any money into the refunding, with all costs of issuance funded from proceeds of debt based on the attached analysis. Attached analysis provides for all costs of NMFA and \$16,750 to cover costs of Union County and Hospital. If we go over that then someone will need to contribute cash or we can request a small taxable component to the financing. We will need counsel to the County, there is me, and we will need counsel to the Hospital.
- The earliest we can close the refinancing is July 18, 2019 which is assumed closing date in cash flows
- Attached analysis assumes current interest rates
- The refunding of the outstanding loan in the amount of \$1,335,491 yields gross savings of \$165,075.51 or net present value savings of \$111,558 representing 8.35% of refunded principal. As a rule of thumb, most municipal governments move forward with a refunding if they can achieve 3% or 4% net present value savings as a percentage of refunded principal. The attached analysis is structured with level annual savings, \$16,868 per annum after the first year, with the ability to structure savings on a level basis, front-end or back-end basis. If the Hospital needs money or to fund a capital expenditure, it may make good sense to front end the savings to help the cash position, if not then level savings is typical.

You might share this with the Commissioners in January as an information item, and then we can update the analysis and I can join you for the February Meeting, and we can get authority to submit the application to NMFA. We will of course need the support of the Hospital Board, since they are ultimately a party to the financing

Attached is an updated refunding analysis for the loan to the County for the benefit of the Hospital from NMFA. Based on current interest rates. Savings are \$184,509 in total, approximately \$18,854 per annum, or \$130,667 on a net present value basis representing 9.78% of refunded principal, with most people seeking 3-4% to move forward with a refunding. # RESOLUTION 107-18

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING LEGISLATION THAT WOULD IMPOSE RULES, REGULA-TIONS AND RESTRICTIONS EXCEEDING FEDERAL LAW ON ALL PRIVATE FIREARM TRANS-FERS BETWEEN INDIVIDUALS AND ON ALL FIREARMS SALES AT GUN SHOWS

Whereas; during the 2019 New Mexico legislative session, New Mexico state lawmakers will consider legislation backed by the national gun control organization *Everytown for Gun Safety* that will exceed the scope of federal gun laws, restrict the Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens and negatively impact events which directly contribute to the local economy; and

Whereas; Senate Bill 8 and House Bill 8 would criminalize nearly all private firearm sales between individuals -- including among family members, friends, neighbors, co-workers, hunting partners, competitive shooters and fellow gun club members -- and require them to be conducted through a federal firearms licensed dealer with extensive government paperwork and payment of an undetermined fee; and

Whereas; House Bill 40 would specifically apply the aforementioned regulatory scheme and its additional costs and recordkeeping to all firearms sales at gun shows;

Whereas; the restrictions imposed by these measures exceed those requirements found in federal law or laws in the State of Texas, which will result in these and similar events being driven to those neighboring communities; and

Whereas; nearly 80 percent of law enforcement officers surveyed by PoliceOne in 2013 said that a prohibition on private non-dealer transfers of firearms between individuals such as that proposed in Senate Bill 8, House Bill 8, and House Bill 40 would not reduce violent crime; and

Whereas; existing laws governing firearms sales are not being enforced, as evidenced by a September 2018 report by the U.S. Government Accountability Office which stated that of the 112,090 people who were turned down for a gun purchase in FY 2017, there were only 12 prosecutions by U.S. Attorneys Offices as of June 2018; and

Whereas; gun shows aren't a source of crime guns according to a U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics survey of state prison inmates, of whom only 0.8 percent stated that they had obtained a firearm at a gun show; and

WHEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the County of Union the right of private individuals to lawfully sell or transfer their legally-owned property without government interference; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County of Union opposes legislation which exceeds federal laws governing individual firearms sales, as it is ineffective public safety policy, and puts Union County at a competitive disadvantage with our Texas neighbors through additional rules, regulations and restrictions, and cost law-abiding citizens time, freedom and money.

# DECLARING UNION COUNTY TO BE A SECOND AMENDMENT SANCTUARY COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners met in a Regular Meeting on February 12, 2019 at 9:00 am at the Union County Courthouse 100 Court St. Clayton, New Mexico; and,

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 4-37-1 (1995) provides that Counties have the power to, "provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity and improve the morals, order, comfort and convenience of any county or its inhabitants"; and,

WHEREAS, NMSA, 1978, Section 4-38-18 (1976) provides that a Board of County Commissioner has the duty and authority "[t]o represent the county and have the care of the county property and the management of the interest of the county in all cases where no other provision is made by law; and,

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, adopted in 1791 as part of the Bill of Rights, protects the inalienable and individual right of the people to keep and bear arms; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in the <u>District of Columbia v. Heller</u> 554 U.S. 570 (2008), decision affirmed pan individual's right to possess firearms, unconnected with service in a militia, for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home; and,

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in McDonald v. Chicago, 561 U.S. 742 (2010), affirmed that the right of an individual to "keep and bear arms," as protected under the Second Amendment, is incorporated by the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment against the states; and,

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court, in <u>United States v. Miller</u>, 307 U.S. 174 (1939), opined that firearms that are part of ordinary military equipment, or with use that could contribute to the common defense are protected by the Second Amendment; and,

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 6 of the Constitution of New Mexico provides that "[n]o law shall abridge the right of the citizen to keep and bear arms for security and defense, for lawful hunting and recreational use and for other lawful purposes, but nothing herein shall be held to permit the carrying of concealed weapons. No municipality or county shall regulate, in any way, an incident of the right to keep and bear arms;" and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board to declare its support of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution and the New Mexico Constitution protecting citizens' inalienable and individual right to keep and bear arms; and,

WHEREAS, the members of this Board took an oath to support and defend the United States Constitution, the Constitution of the State of New Mexico and the laws of the State of New Mexico (insofar as they are constitutional); and,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Union by the authority granted the Board by the laws of the State of New Mexico and people of Union County, New Mexico to stand and defend their rights and liberties, which are guaranteed by the United States and New Mexico Constitutions, we hereby declare this Resolution as follows:

Second Amendment Preservation Resolution Designating Union County a

Second Amendment "Sanctuary County"

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Board affirms its support for the duly elected Sheriff of Union County, New Mexico in the exercise of his/her sound discretion and affirms its resolve to support decisions by our Sheriff to not enforce any unconstitutional firearms law against any citizen.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Board will not authorize or appropriate government funds, resources, employees, agencies, contractors, buildings, detention centers or offices for the purpose of enforcing law that unconstitutionally infringes on the right of the people to keep and bear arms.

We also oppose House Bill 83 as it violates due process and puts law enforcement in a more dangerous situation and does nothing to protect citizens. This bill could disarm the very people trying to defend their lives and personal property. Furthermore there are already provisions in state law that allow law enforcement to deal with people in crisis. We oppose House Bill 87 as it duplicates a law already deemed enforceable by a court order from a District Judge. We oppose House Bill 130 as there is already provision in state law that allow law enforcement to charge the appropriate crime if a child gains access to a firearm.

The Sheriffs stand to encourage the full and complete enforcement of existing gun regulations and to oppose any executive order or laws that further restrict the rights of law-abiding people to own possess keep and use firearms. As duly elected sheriffs, we are committed to take the lead role in facilitating the discussions in our communities and pledge to collaborate at all levels with those stakeholders to identify and work towards solutions for the complex issue of violence.



 Baca Valley has started working on getting the radios reprogrammed and hope to be finished by February 6, 2019. They may still have several stragglers but they will have to coordinate with Baca Valley on getting them reprogrammed.

## Homeland Security Site Visit:

 My new area coordinator came for a site visit on January 14<sup>th</sup> and stated that everything looks great and is looking forward to work up in this area.

#### **♦** Snow Storms:

• We had a couple weeks of several snow storms...during those storms, we still had several people dodging the roadblocks and taking back roads. I tried working with State Police on trying to close some of those roads and was unsuccessful. It comes down to not enough man power to man the road blocks and not coordinating well with all other agencies and Colorado agencies, this was something I was trying to work on during our Winter Weather Meetings in November.

## **♦** Legislative Luncheon:

I was able to visit briefly with Cabinet Secretary of Homeland Security, Jackie White...After the session, her goal is to visit all the EM's in the state and discuss some of their problems they are encountering. When she comes up, we talked about taking her to our problem areas and also talk about how we can work with NMDOT and NMSP on how to handle our road closure situations.
