Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve the agenda and regular meeting minutes of May 12, 2020. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. The minutes were signed.

#### HOSPITAL REPORT

Tammie Stump, the CEO, provided copies of the "County Commissioner Monthly Hospital Report, Union County General Hospital, Tammie Stump, CEO, May 12, 2020", attached as an exhibit (five pages). Stump reported on the following (but not limited to the following): Provider Recruitment Update; Des Moines Clinic; Business Office/Revenue Cycle Update; Financial Assistance Update; Radiology Report; Plant Services; Laboratory Services; Union County Health Center; IT; Pharmacy; and Clinical Area; Therapy Services, and COVID update.

**Melissa Prante, CFO**, reported on various financials for April. The following reports were e-mailed to the County Manager before the meeting, for distribution to the Board: "Union County Consolidated, Consolidated Operations Review, for the period ending April 30, 2020"; "Clayton Health Systems, May 27, 2020 MOR, Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements, Period Ending April 30, 2020"; "Union County General Hospital Acute Hospital Operations Review for the period ending April 30, 2020"; "Union County Clinic, Clinic Operations Review through the period ending April 30, 2020"; and, "Clayton Family Practice, Executive Financial Summary, 10<sup>th</sup> Month FY 2020". A brief discussion followed.

#### EMERGENCY MANAGER REPORT

Manager Wingo reported on the following (but not limited to the following): National Guard duties; COVID and Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) update; final draft of the Hazard Mitigation Plan is ready and on schedule. The plan needs to be reviewed and considered before final Board adoption. Wingo will share the draft plan with the manager so that she can forward it to the Board. Wingo will address the City Council about the draft plan; Considering the recent serious emergencies (gas leak, electricity outage, and large fires), there is a severe need for a practical Emergency Operation Center (EOC) large enough to accommodate eighteen (18) different local departments plus other outside agencies. Today, the EOC is located on Chestnut Street, upstairs

in the fire department. Both the Town and the County should consider and agree on another EOC location. Discussion followed.

#### DISCUSSION /POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS

#### RESOLUTION #2020-46 NMFA ROAD DEPT CRUSHER LOAN PPRF-5219

Proposed Resolution #2020-46 was reviewed and discussed. Mgr. Thompson explained the resolution in detail. The resolution authorizes the execution and delivery of a loan agreement and intercept agreement by and between Union County, New Mexico and the New Mexico Finance Authority, evidencing a special, limited obligation of the County to pay a principal amount of up to \$442,112 together with interest, for the purpose of purchasing a new crusher and respective equipment for the County and funding a loan agreement reserve account; evidencing a special limited obligation and providing for the pledge and payment of the principal and interest due under the loan agreement solely from the fourth one-sixteenth of one percent (.0625%) increment of County Local Option Gross Receipts Tax imposed, and distributed to the County by the State Taxation and Revenue Department; providing for the distribution of County Local Option Gross Receipts Tax to be redirected by the State Taxation and Revenue Department to the Finance Authority, or its assigns for the payment of principal and interest due on the loan agreement pursuant to an intercept agreement, ratifying actions taken, repealing all action inconsistent with this resolution; and authorizing the taking of other actions in connections with the execution and delivery of the loan agreement and intercept agreement.

Superintendent Kear indicated that the crusher will be ready for delivery at the end of June or the 1st of July.

Commissioner Vincent moved to adopt Resolution #2020-46 - NMFA Road Department Crusher Loan PPRF-5219. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. The resolution was signed.

#### RESOLUTION #2020-47 UNION COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT GUIDELINES

Proposed Resolution #2020-47 with attached fire department guidelines was reviewed and discussed. The guidelines follow the Joint Powers Agreement between Energy, Mineral and Natural Resources Department, and Union County for Wildland Fire Protection and Suppression and all amendments, as well as, National Wildfire Coordination Group guidelines. The current Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) was discussed. Commissioner Vincent suggested that the current JPA be reviewed by the Board and updated through legal counsel. Fire Coordinator O'Bryant agreed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution #2020-47 - Union County Fire Department Guidelines.
Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. The resolution was signed.

**FIRE COORDINATOR REPORT** - Coordinator O'Bryant reported on the following (but not limited to the following): gave updates on recent fires. During the last week there have been at least twenty (20) fires; commended the dedication and work of Union County's volunteer firefighters; and, the available fire resources with Kiowa Grasslands, Capulin Monument, and the US Forrest Service.

At 11:11 a.m., the meeting recessed for a short break. At 11:20 a.m., the meeting resumed.

#### CITIZENS' FORUM

Collin Rhodes, Chief Operations Officer - Osceola Energy (OE) introduced himself and expressed his desire to work with Union County by proposing a potential Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) contract. The following was discussed (but not limited to the following): a proposal was made for a secondary source of energy, which would offset current power costs. OE is interested in working with the Town of Clayton (TOC), the prison,

hospital and local farmers; interest was expressed in setting up a solar farm in the TOC's industrial park, as well as, an office in Clayton; employing 5-10 people full-time; partnering with Central New Mexico Community College to set-up a renewable energy training facility in Clayton, and a possible reintegration program for prison inmates; production and pricing would be guaranteed for the next twenty-five years; OE would be self-financed; the terms of the PPA would be that the County would pay for a certain amount of power for the next twenty-five years; and, available tax incentives and their deadlines. Discussion followed. Mgr. Thompson will work together with Rhodes to supply requested energy information. Rhodes will then supply a preliminary proposal to the County.

#### RESOLUTION #2020-48 COMMERCIAL LOAN APPLICATION SEDAN FIRE DEPARTMENT

Proposed Resolution #2020-48 allows for the acquisition of fire equipment for the Sedan Fire Department. The following copies were contained in the meeting packet: a Lease Financing Proposal dated May 26 2020; an apparatus "offer" from Firefighter Trucks Inc. dated May 15<sup>th</sup>; and a copy of a letter dated May 19, 2020, from the New Mexico Fire Marshal's Office which indicated "approval to expend fire protection fund monies to finance the cost of the Initial Attack Fire Apparatus". These items were reviewed and discussed. Mgr. Thompson explained the need for the resolution in detail.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to adopt Resolution #2020-48 - Commercial Loan Application for the Sedan Fire Department. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. The resolution was signed.

#### RESOLUTION #2020-49 BUDGET INCREASE REFD AND SEDAN FIRE DEPARTMENT

Proposed Resolution #2020-49 was reviewed and discussed. Mgr. Thompson explained the resolution in detail. This resolution allows for the authorization of Union County to receive the Rabbit Ear Fire Protection Grant Council Award (410) (DFA #20900) budget increase and Sedan Fire District Fire Protection Grant Council Award (408) (DFA#20900) budget increase.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to adopt Resolution #2020-49 - Budget Increase REFD and Sedan Fire Department. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. The resolution was signed.

At 11:59 a.m., the meeting recessed for lunch. At 1:40 p.m., the meeting resumed.

#### PRIMARY ELECTION CANVASS

Clerk Harkins presented the 2020 Primary Election Canvass. A total of one thousand fifty-eight (1,058) voters participated in this election. There were five (5) hand tallies that were included in the official vote totals. The State's official canvass will be on July 23, 2020. Once the State's Canvass is complete, the Secretary of State will issue the Certificates of Nomination.

<u>Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the 2020 Primary Election Canvass as presented. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. Vote: All YES. There was no further discussion. Motion carried.</u> The Certification of Canvass Results was signed by the Board and the Clerk.

#### RESOLUTION #2020-50 EPCOG PARTICIPATION AND APPOINTMENTS

Proposed Resolution #2020-50 was reviewed and discussed. This resolution allows for participation as a member of the programs and policy development for the Eastern Plains Council of Governments (EPCOG) for the Fiscal Year 2020-2021. Annual membership dues are for \$1,241.00. The membership period begins July 1, 2020, and ends June 30, 2020. Chairman Bennett will remain as the County's designated member and Mgr. Thompson will be the alternate member.

Commissioner Vincent moved to adopt Resolution #2020-50 - Eastern Plains Council of Governments (EPCOG) participation and the appointment of Chairman Bennett as the designated member and Mgr. Thompson as the alternate member. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES: The resolution was signed.

#### AWARD OF RFP #19/20-003 WATER STORAGE TANKS

Mgr. Thompson provided copies of a bid opening, "Bid #19/20-03 Water Tank Storage". The bids were opened in the Union County Manager's Office on June 8, 2020, at 3:00 p.m. and witnessed by Mgr. Brandy Thompson, Commissioner Clayton Kiesling, and Bobby Longwill - Assistant Fire Chief of the Rabbit Ear Fire Department. The following provided bids: Contain Water Systems (2), Power Pipe 3 Tank (2), and United Fiberglass Inc. The bids were discussed.

Chairman Bennett stepped down as Chairman and moved to award the bid proposal from United Fiberglass Inc. from Amarillo, Texas. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

#### APPROVAL OF BILLS

The Board reviewed and discussed bills in the approximate amount of \$207,186.80.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the payment of bills in the approximate amount of \$207,186.80.

Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

#### ROAD CROSSING PERMITS

**Permit No. 376** with an attached map submitted by Permittee, ENMR Telephone Cooperative, allows Permittee to lay pipe or cable for fiber optic telecommunications lines parallel to the South Row of Heringa Road (aka Co Rd A034);

**Permit No. 377** with an attached map submitted by Permittee, ENMR Telephone Cooperative, allows Permittee to lay pipe or cable for fiber optic telecommunications lines parallel the West Row of Swagerty Road (aka Co Rd A036); and

**Permit No. 378** with an attached map submitted by Permittee, ENMR Telephone Cooperative, allows Permittee to lay pipe or cable for fiber optic telecommunications lines across Gardner Road (2). Legal descriptions contained within the permits.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve road crossing Permits No. 376, 377, and 378. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

#### INVENTORY ITEMS DISPOSITION - ROAD DEPARTMENT INTERNATIONAL WATER TRUCK

An "Inventory Items for Disposition" list was presented by Sheriff James Lobb. A brief discussion followed. The list included the following (but not limited to the following): Blue Colored Chevrolet Impala, military generator; and, a Golds Gym Treadmill.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve the items for disposition as presented. Commissioner Vincent seconded. A brief discussion followed about the International Water Truck. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. The list for disposition was signed.

#### **HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE - Approval of Claims**

There were no health care assistance claims presented for consideration. No action was taken.

#### **COUNTY TRAVEL REQUESTS**

No travel requests were made. No action was taken.

#### KISER BUILDING/ADMINISTRATION BUILDING

Mgr. Thompson gave a project update, which included the following (but not limited to the following): advertisements will be published during the next couple of weeks with a bid opening date of July 1<sup>st.</sup> The Board encouraged a wide distribution for project advertisement.

#### JAIL AGREEMENT WITH NEIGHBORING COUNTIES

Sheriff Lobb reported that the jail agreement with Colfax County has been approved. However, no prisoners are being accepted currently because of COVID restrictions. A brief discussion followed. Current jail agreements will remain in place. Taos and San Miguel Counties are pending. Colfax County remains the best option. Juvenile Detention will remain with Taos County. Discussion only. No action was taken.

#### BUDGET WORKSHOP

Mgr. Thompson provided copies of the preliminary department budgets. The preliminary budget has been submitted to the Department of Finance and Administration. A lengthy discussion followed. Budget allocation adjustments were considered.

Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: Vincent - YES, Kiesling - YES, and Bennett - YES. Motion carried.

At 3:50 p.m., Commissioner Vincent moved to come out of the closed session pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 10-15-1 (H) (2) pertaining to limited personnel matters and pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 10-15-1 (H) (7) pertaining to threatened litigation in which the County is or may become a participant. Commissioner Vincent affirmed that matters discussed in the closed meeting were limited only to those specified in the motion for closure. No action was taken during the closed session. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. Vote: Vincent - YES, Kiesling - YES, and Bennett - YES. Motion carried.

#### **BUDGET WORKSHOP - continued**

Mgr. Thompson reported that during next month's regular meeting, the final budget will be on the agenda for approval as well as a Resolution adopting the FY Budget and 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Reports.

#### ROAD SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Kear reported on the following (but not limited to the following): Water truck is still working fine; finished road project south of Pasamonte; road crusher maintenance; working on the Sophia Bridge; taking care of routine county-wide road maintenance despite drought conditions in an attempt to preserve roads; culvert delivery. Commissioner Vincent relayed to Kear that the Berg Caliche pit is still available if needed. County road maintenance is largely dependent on landowner donations of Caliche.

#### ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORTS

Sheriff Lobb thanked the Road Department for building the partition wall in the Conex storage container at the shooting range; everyone in the office tested negative for COVID-19 during recent testing; Lobb was very complimentary of his staff during recent power outage situation; Under Sheriff Chris Schear reported that new hire, Deputy Sheriff Franco, is being released from the Army and will be starting next week. Still unsure of when the next law enforcement academy will be, but more than likely after January of next year; working on officer policies with the County attorney to reduce risk of liability while following state laws. Commissioner Vincent inquired about the recent gas leaks or fires and his concerns that not all entities were notified. Lastly, the National Guard continues to maintain all building repairs.

Treasurer Arnett reported that 87% of County taxes have been collected.

**Commissioner Kiesling** reported that he continues to work on Census Outreach. Union County's response rate is not that great and is about 33%. The Census deadline is in October.

**Commissioner Vincent** reported that he remains frustrated with the Governor's plan to re-open our State. Vincent is very concerned with the position our State has been put in economically.

Chairman Bennett reported that he received a phone call from the National Guard and that the three (3) year building contract will be renewed later this week. Lastly, as a member of the New Mexico Counties Board, there will more than likely be an in-person board meeting.

Meeting Announcements: The next regular meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 9, 2020, at 9:00 a.m. There was no Joint Communications Meeting this month.

ADJOURN: At 4:11 p.m., Commissioner Kiesling moved to adjourn. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned.

#### RESOLUTION 2021-01 PROPERTY TAX RESOLUTION OF UNION COUNTY, NEW MEXICO

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE Board of Union County Commissioners of Union County, New Mexico, that a question be added to the ballot for the November 3, 2021 General Election.

The following question shall be submitted:

"Shall Union County continue to levy and collect annual assessments of four and one quarter (4 ¼) mills on each dollar of assessed value of property within the county for a period of eight (8) years beginning in the fiscal year starting on July 1, 2021, the revenue to be used to pay for the operation and maintenance expenses of Union County General Hospital, in the discretion of the Union County Board of Commissioners?"

Approval of the question allows the Board of County Commissioners of Union County to continue to impose a tax on property within the county as follows:

- A. Revenue from this property tax may be used only to the extent that the Board deems necessary towards the cost of operating and maintaining Union County General Hospital, presently operated by Clayton Health Systems, Inc., which is obligated to provide hospital care to all persons which includes the citizens of County of Union, State of New Mexico, in need of hospitalization without regard to race, creed, color, national origin, sex, familial status, or financial circumstances.
- B. The property tax shall be at a rate not exceeding four and one quarter (4 1/4) mills on each dollar of assessed value of property within the county. This tax is provided for and authorized by Section 4-48-B-12 and 4-48B-15, NMSA 1978.
- C. The levy shall not go into effect until the election is held and a simple majority of the qualified electors of the county vote in favor of the property tax levy. The tax shall become effective for the ensuing fiscal year, July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022, and future years. The tax shall be collected in the manner as other property taxes.
- D. The Board of County Commissioners may direct that such levy be decreased or not be made for any year, if in their judgment, sufficient funds for operation and maintenance of Union County General Hospital are available or will be obtained from other sources.
