At 9:46 a.m., Mayor Ernest Sanchez called the meeting to order. Those Council Members appearing remotely announced their presence: Trustee Judy Steen, Trustee Leroy Montoya, and Trustee Deano Arellano.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

DOCUMENT APPROVAL:

Mayor Sanchez called for agenda approval.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve the agenda. Trustee Beckner seconded. There was no further discussion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Kiesling – YES, Chairman Bennett – YES, Commissioner Vincent – YES, Trustee Montoya – YES, Trustee Arellano – YES, Trustee Beckner – YES, Trustee Steen – YES, All YES. Motion carried.

Mayor Sanchez called for the approval of minutes for the March 10, 2020, April 22, 2020, and May 18, 2020 meetings.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the minutes of March 10, 2020, April 22, 2020, and May 18, 2020. Trustee Beckner seconded. There was no further discussion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Kiesling – YES, Chairman Bennett – YES, Commissioner Vincent – YES, Trustee Montoya – YES, Trustee Arellano – YES, Trustee Beckner – YES, Trustee Steen – YES. All YES. Motion carried.

VISITORS:

Main Street President Shirley Carter Union County Extension Agent Talisha Valdez Union County Administrative Assistant Kylie Armstrong

Union County Extension Agent Talisha Valdez thanked the Town Council who voted in favor of having the County fair which was a success. Valdez reported that the fair's in-door exhibits were displayed in storefronts this year. Both the community and businesses enjoyed the displays.

NEW BUSINESS:

• Update on UCCDC/Mainstreet

TOC Mgr. Lucero reminded attendees of past discussions of revitalizing and combining both the Union County Community Development Corporation (UCCDC) and Main Street. The following was discussed but not limited to the following: director salary; updated job description for a director should be available for review on Friday, September 11th. Lucero will share the job description with the County Manager, Town Council, and Board of Commissioners for review and consideration; establishment of a review committee for the hiring of a director; an analysis for combining the two organizations will be done; Commissioner Kiesling suggested that Keith Barrus be informed/included in these discussions; and, Chairman Bennett reminded attendees of the necessary involvement of Local Economic Development Act (LEDA).

Trustee Steen asked if UCCDC is a viable organization and in good standing with the State of New Mexico.

• Discussion and determination of split of Local Government Cares Act Funding, and Small Business Grants Allocation

The Town of Clayton and Union County are recipients of Cares Act Funding for \$958,456. The CARES Act funding provides that payments from the fund may only be used to cover costs that are necessary expenditures due to the public health emergency concerning COVID-19; costs that were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020 (the date of enactment of the CARES Act) for the State or government; and costs that were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.

TOC Mgr. Lucero reported on the funding and allocation, which included the following (but not limited to the following): the municipalities and county governments submitted a joint application; how should the funding be split between the Town and the County; the award letter has already been signed off on and submitted; there will be a webinar on how these funds can be used; all expenses will have to be submitted and followed up with requests for reimbursement.

Mgr. Thompson reported that between herself and Mgr. Lucero, the two are gathering information. Guidelines for spending the funding have been provided by DFA.

How the funding was to be split was discussed. Both the Town Council and the Board of Commissioners agreed to a 50/50 split.

Chairman Bennett moved to ratify the actions of Mgr. Ferron Lucero with his decision to submit the signed application and to proceed roughly with the 50/50 split of the CARES Act Funding, and to spend every penny possible. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner

<u>Kiesling – YES, Chairman Bennett – YES, Commissioner Vincent – YES, Trustee Montoya – YES, Trustee Arellano – YES, Trustee Beckner – YES, Trustee Steen – YES. All YES. Motion carried.</u>

• Hospital Mill Levy

Chairman Bennett wanted to make sure that all elected officials were aware that the hospital's mill levy question was on this November's General Election ballot. This is not a new tax but a continuation of the current mill levy. The hospital CEO is planning an advertising campaign for public awareness. Bennett encouraged the elected officials to promote and encourage their constituents to pass this ballot question.

• Dispatch/CAD System/Records Management

Sheriff Lobb spoke about the following (but not limited to the following): updating the records management/CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) system; discussions with Chief Julian; cost-effectiveness; both departments need to participate in NIBRS (National Incident-Based Reporting System), which is a Federal Program by January 1, 2021 so that applications can be made for JAG grants; a new records management system would prove to be effective and beneficial with public record requests in light of the recent IPRA (Inspection of Public Records Act) changes; software consideration has been given to Crimestar and Spillman Flex, which both work together with a records management system as well as the court's systems; the CAD system has to been run through the Clayton Dispatch; Sheriff Lobb encouraged the use of a modern CAD system for the public's first responder's and law enforcement's safety and a records management system for efficiency and accountability. Sheriff Lobb asked that the Board and Council considering funding an updated and modern CAD and records management system.

Trustee Steen asked if there were any funding sources available. Sheriff Lobb reported that grants may be available through Homeland Security. Lobb suggested that together, with the Chief, they should also work with the Emergency Manager to work towards seeking grants. Lobb also spoke about the various items he would like to secure through the JAG grants should one be awarded.

Chief Scott Julian and Dispatch Supervisor Sandy Palmer (appearing telephonically) reported that they have met with Sheriff Lobb, Emergency Management, and the Fire Chief Drumm about the systems. Chief Julian spoke of his concerns: expense; small jurisdictional needs; the need for multiple CAD system user licenses; system efficiency; currently uses CJIS (Criminal Justice Information Services) which they are satisfied with; Chief Julian commended Sheriff Lobb for trying to modernize the system(s); current priorities for the TOC are funding a jail and increasing salaries for dispatchers; Julian asked that whatever happens, make sure that the systems are compatible with one another; if Homeland Security funding is available, then the TOC would consider the updates.

Shirley Carter, in her capacity as a Plateau Telecommunications Board Member, reminded the Town and the County of the match grants (up to \$5,000) available through Plateau for law enforcement training and equipment. The grant deadline is quickly approaching. Information can be had by going to Plateau's web-site.

Fire Chief Drumm commented that these upgrades need to be considered and the modernization needs to be made. The Town and the County both need to be proactive and begin searching for funding options.

This meeting was recorded and shall be made available to the public upon request.

Mayor Sanchez announced that the next regularly scheduled Joint Communications Meeting will be on Tuesday, December 8, 2020, at 9:30 a.m., at the Union County Courthouse Annex Building.

BOARD OF UNION COUNTY COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING September 10, 2020

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Bennett called the meeting to order in the 8th Judicial District Courtroom, located in the Union County Courthouse. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve the agenda and regular meeting minutes of August 11, 2020. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. The minutes were signed.

HOSPITAL REPORT

Tammie Stump, the CEO, provided copies of the "County Commissioner Monthly Hospital Report, Union County General Hospital, Tammie Stump, CEO, September 10, 2020", attached as an exhibit (six pages). Stump gave a lengthy report on the following (but not limited to the following): Provider Recruitment Update; Des Moines Clinic; Financial Assistance/Compliance Update; Compliance and Social Work; Home Health Care Report; Radiology Report; Plant Services; Laboratory Services - "The BioFire Film Array Panels"; "Coronavirus Vaccine Candidates" & "New Mexico Department of Health COVID-19 Vaccine Planning" information provided; Union County Health Center; IT; Pharmacy; HVAC; Clinical Area; Therapy Services and Price Transparency. Stump ended her report with a discussion about the upcoming mill levy question which will be on the November 3rd General Election ballot. This mill levy ballot question is not a new tax, but is a continuation of the current mill levy which is in place. Stump provided a marketing piece that she intends on using to promote the tax during the election.

Melissa Prante, CFO, reported on various financials and statistics for July. The following reports were e-mailed to the County Manager before the meeting, for distribution to the Board: "Union County Consolidated, Consolidated Operations Review, for the period ending July 31, 2020"; "Union County General Hospital Acute Hospital Operations Review for the period ending July 31, 2020"; "Union County Clinic, Clinic Operations Review through the period ending July 31, 2020"; "Clayton Health Systems, August 26, 2020 MOR, Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements, Period Ending July 31, 2020 - attached as an exhibit (one page); "Union County General Consolidated, Executive Financials Summary, 1st Month FY 2021"; and, "Clayton Family Practice, Executive Financial Summary, 1st Month FY 2021". A brief discussion followed.

At 9:40 a.m., the meeting recessed for attendance of the Joint Communications meeting. At 10:55 a.m., the meeting resumed.

DISCUSSION / POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS

RESOLUTION #2021-13 CERTIFICATION OF TAX RATES

Proposed resolution #2021-13 together with the Certificate of Property Tax Rates in Mills for Union County's Tax Year 2020, and a letter dated September 1, 2020, from the Acting Secretary of Finance and Administration, was reviewed and discussed. NMSA 1978, Section 7-38-34 requires that the Board issue and deliver to the County Assessor its written order imposing rates within five days of its receipt of this rate-setting order. Assessor Cruz reported that the certification deadline had been extended to September 31, 2020, due to a state-wide mill levy miscalculation. A brief discussion followed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution #2021-13 Certification of Tax Rates together with the letter from the Secretary of Finance & Administration and the Certificate of Property Tax Rates in Mills for Union County's Tax Year 2020. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. Resolution signed.

ORDINANCE #2020-7A AMEND DEDICATION LOCAL OPTION GRT

Proposed comprehensive Ordinance #2020-7A, Amending the Dedication of County Local Option Gross Receipts Tax, was reviewed and discussed. The proposed ordinance amends "Section 4 of Ordinance Number 7A, effective July 1, 1988, and imposing 1/4 of one percent" and is amended to read: "Section 4. Dedication. Revenue from the Gross Receipts Tax will be unrestricted: The effective date of this amendment shall be January 1, 2021, whichever date occurs first after the expiration of at least three months from the date this ordinance is delivered or mailed to the Taxation and Revenue Department." Per Mgr. Thompson, the ordinance advertisement was made in the Albuquerque Journal, fourteen days before the hearing, and was made available for viewing in the clerk's office.

Chairman Bennett commenced the public ordinance hearing and read the ordinance aloud. The floor was opened for public comment. There being no public comment, Chairman Bennett called for a motion.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve Ordinance #2020-7A Amending the Dedication of the County Local Option Gross Receipts Tax. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Kiesling – YES, Commissioner Vincent – YES and Chairman Bennett – YES. Motion carried. The Ordinance was duly adopted and signed. The hearing ended.

ORDINANCE #2020-28 AMEND DEDICATION CORRECTIONAL GRT

Proposed comprehensive Ordinance #2020-28, Amending the Dedication of County Local Option Gross Receipts Tax, was reviewed and discussed. The proposed ordinance amends "Section 4 of Ordinance Number 28, effective July 1, 2005, and imposing 1/8 of one percent" and is amended to read: "Section 4. Dedication. Revenue from the County Correctional Facility Gross Receipts Tax will be unrestricted: The effective date of this amendment shall be January 1, 2021, whichever date occurs first after the expiration of at least three months from the date this ordinance is delivered or mailed to the Taxation and Revenue Department." Per Mgr. Thompson, the advertisement was made in the Albuquerque Journal, fourteen days before the hearing, and was made available for viewing in the clerk's office.

Chairman Bennett commenced the public ordinance hearing and read the ordinance aloud. The floor was opened for public comment. There being no public comment, Chairman Bennett called for a motion.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve Ordinance #2020-28 amending the dedication of the County Local Option Gross Receipts Tax. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Roll Call Vote:

<u>Commissioner Vincent – YES, Commissioner Kiesling – YES, and Chairman Bennett – YES. Motion carried.</u> The Ordinance was duly adopted and signed. The hearing ended.

ORDINANCE #2020-15 REPEAL HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE ORDINANCE 15-2016

Proposed Ordinance #2020-15, repealing an ordinance which is the Union County Indigent Hospital and County Health Care Ordinance by the Union County Government to address all indigent health care concerns, including rules and regulations was reviewed and discussed. Ordinance 15-2016 was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners on the 9th of February 2016 and recorded as document #201600108, pages 1 through 13. Mgr. Thompson reported that the ordinance advertisement was made in the Albuquerque Journal, fourteen days before the hearing, and was made available for viewing in the clerk's office.

Chairman Bennett commenced the public ordinance hearing and read the ordinance aloud. The floor was opened for public comment. Discussion: Mgr. Thompson further explained the necessity of this ordinance. There being no public comment, Chairman Bennett called for a motion.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Ordinance #2020-15 repealing an ordinance which is the Union County Indigent Hospital and County Health Care Ordinance by the Union County Government to address all indigent health care concerns, including rules and regulation. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Roll Call Vote: Commissioner Vincent – YES, Commissioner Kiesling – YES, and Chairman Bennett – YES. Motion carried. The Ordinance was duly adopted and signed. The hearing ended.

RESOLUTION #2021-14 HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE RESOLUTION

Proposed resolution, #2021-14, makes certain changes to its healthcare policy for indigent persons to reflect changes made by the Legislature to the Act, and to update policies under which the program operates, was reviewed and discussed.

Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve Resolution #2021-14 Health Care Assistance Program. Commissioner Vincent seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried. The resolution was signed.

RESOLUTION #2021-15 DISASTER DECLARATION DRY CIMARRON BRIDGE

Proposed resolution, #2021-15 (with attached photographs), whereby the Commissioners of Union County requests the New Mexico Department of Transportation to survey the damage and to make plans for a permanent fix of the bridge located at 35.970927-103.267458 on NM Highway 456 was reviewed and discussed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution #2021-15, Disaster Declaration Dry Cimarron Bridge. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. The motion carried. The resolution was signed.

RESOLUTION #2021-16 CERTIFICATION OF INVENTORY FY20

The proposed resolution, #2021-16, whereby Union County completed a physical inventory in accordance with NMAC 2.20.1.16 Annual Inventory requirements, inventorying all items with a historical cost of five thousand (\$5,000) or more under the control of the governing authority was reviewed and discussed.

<u>Commissioner Kiesling moved to approve Resolution #2021-16 Certification of Inventory FY20. Commissioner Vincent seconded.</u> There was no further discussion. Vote: All – YES. Motion carried. Resolution signed.

VACATION OF ALLEY BLOCK 850 HOMER J FARR ADDITION & PINON AVENUE EAST AND NORTH OF BLOCK 850 – JAMES FLETCHER

A letter dated May 5, 2020, and a plat prepared by Shield's Survey was submitted by James A. Fletcher requesting that a portion of the alley and street that is situated between the property he owns within the Homer J. Farr Addition in Dedman (Capulin) was reviewed and discussed. The property to be closed and vacated is the alley within Block 850 of the Homer J. Farr Addition and the street east and north of block 850 of the Homer J. Farr Addition known as Pinon Avenue. All property surrounding the requested closure area is owned by James. A. Fletcher. Discussion followed. An application for closure was presented to the Board for consideration.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the vacation of the alley within Block 850 of the Homer J. Farr Addition and the street east and north of block 850 of the Homer J. Farr Addition known as Pinon Avenue. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. The application for vacation was signed.

APPROVAL OF BILLS

The Board reviewed and discussed bills in the approximate amount of \$933,412.81 which included the following additional bills: Kofile Technologies - \$10,552.00, Sedan Fire Department - \$200,000. Colt Builder's incoming bills were discussed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve the payment of bills in the approximate amount of \$933,412.81 and permission was given to the manager to pay Colt Builders as needed. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

CITIZEN'S FORUM

Talisha Valdez, Union County Extension Agent - Agent Valdez introduced new hire, Kylie Armstrong. Armstrong spoke to the Board about the various types of programs, specifically water conservation, that she would like to introduce to the local schools. Valdez gave a lengthy report on the many summer programs (most done virtually) and administered by her and her staff which included the following (but not limited to the following): State and District contests; braiding and origami program in partnership with the museum; helped facilitate the States' virtual conference; baking workshop; home visits were done to weigh and tag 4-H and FFA animals. Farm Safety Day will be done virtually this year.

The local office has officially opened up as of last week and Valdez has been allowed to have a 5 to 1 ratio with the kids; the local fair was successful. All indoor fair exhibits will go to State. Photographs will be taken of each exhibit and uploaded and judged virtually; been involved in diseased tree and cattle death assessments; will be assisting with preparation for the upcoming livestock shows in Artesia, Capitan, and Roswell; 4-H clubs are still inactive until COVID restrictions are loosened.

ROAD CROSSING PERMITS

There were no road crossing permit requests presented for consideration. No action was taken.

HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE - Approval of Claims

There were no health care assistance claims presented for consideration. No action was taken.

COUNTY TRAVEL REQUESTS

There were no travel requests submitted for consideration. No action was taken.

ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING UPDATE

Mgr. Thompson reported on the following (but not limited to the following): update on data/electrical receptacles for the server; 400-amp building service; concrete testing will be done in the vault; roof drain; and fire suppression system.

ICIP WORKSHOP

Mgr. Thompson distributed copies of the Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) FY 2022-2026 for reference. Priorities were revisited and discussed.

RESOLUTION #2021-12 APPROVAL OF ICIP 2022-2026

Proposed Resolution #2021-12 together with an attached Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) was reviewed and discussed.

Commissioner Vincent moved to approve Resolution #2021-12, approval of ICIP 2022-2026. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All – YES. Motion carried. Resolution signed.

COURTHOUSE UPDATE

Mgr. Thompson reported that Southwest Consultants recently did a property assessment (courthouse, old sheriff's office, annex, and portable building) so that the sheriff's department, district attorney's office, and the magistrate and district courts are adequately housed. The following items (but not limited to the following) were considered: access points, evidence lockers, building key entries, holding cells, overall property security. The following items were also discussed: bathrooms; ADA building compliance; election machine, extension office, and maintenance storage; and, fire suppression system. Thompson reported that a report will be forthcoming from Southwest Consultants regarding the assessment. Mgr. Thompson will reach out to the sheriff, district attorney, and judges for accommodation recommendations.

JAIL AGREEMENT WITH NEIGHBORING COUNTIES

Sheriff Lobb reported that he has attempted to reach out to the Colfax County Jail administrator, but has been unsuccessful in making detention arrangements.

ROAD SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Kear reported on the following (but not limited to the following): Ridge Road project update; cattle guard replacement and cleanouts; creek crossing and road repairs near Cotton and Black Mesa and on Wagner Road; Rainbow Road is now a bus route and requires road repair; ready for snow removal.

EMERGENCY MANAGER'S REPORT

Emergency Manager Wingo was not present.

FIRE COORDINATOR REPORT

Fire Coordinator O'Bryant was not present.

ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORTS

Sheriff Lobb reported on the following (but not limited to the following): Deputy Grice will not be deployed after all; Curtis Skaggs has been rehired; Deputy Franco is completing field training; Undersheriff Schear is working on policies and procedures.

Assessor Cruz reported that she hired a new mapper, Andrea Callis. Cruz is training both her new Chief Deputy, Cassie Newton, and Mapper Callis. Cruz would like to arrange other training options for the mapper.

Treasurer Arnett reported that she will be working with Assessor Cruz on the new property tax rates; will begin preparation for this year's tax bills; and briefly spoke of the Village of Des Moines and its uncashed disbursement checks.

Clerk Harkins reported on the 2020 General Election preparations. There will be two Constitutional Amendments, three bond questions, and the County's mill levy question on the General Election ballot. Sample ballots will be available at the end of the month. Early voting begins on October 6, 2020.

Commissioner Kiesling reported on his virtual participation of the NERTPO (Northeast Regional Transportation Planning Organization) meeting on August 26, 2020; 2020 Census update. The Census deadline has been moved up to September 30, 2020.

Chairman Bennett reported on the difficulty of contacting a local Game & Fish officer when needed. Bennett recommended calling Operation Game Thief for assistance. Sheriff Lobb suggested calling the Sheriff's Department and he would try and reach out to the Game and Fish. Lastly, Trich (Trichomoniasis) testing for bulls had been delayed and is now being done again.

Mgr. Thompson reported that on behalf of the county employees, the County has opted out of participation in the employee payroll tax deferral program option after consulting with New Mexico Counties.

ADJOURN: At 12:45 p.m., Commissioner Vincent moved to adjourn after lunch. Commissioner Kiesling seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: All YES. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, Sections 4-62-1 through 4-62-10, NMSA 1978 (the "Act"), authorize New Mexico counties to issue gross receipts tax revenue bonds which, pursuant to the Act, may include loan agreements; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the County may secure its gross receipts tax revenue bonds with the revenues of a one-eighth of one percent (0.125%) increment of County Gross Receipts Tax imposed by the County's Ordinance No. 7A adopted on February 10, 1988 pursuant to Section 7-20E-9, NMSA 1978, as amended, with an effective date of July 1, 1988, which Ordinance has been amended by Ordinance No. 2020-7A adopted on September 10, 2020, with an expected effective date of January 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to consider for adoption an ordinance authorizing, in accordance with the Act (the Ordinance"), the execution and delivery of a Loan Agreement and an Intercept Agreement by and between the Finance Authority and the County in a principal amount of up to \$1,265,405; and
