At 8:57 a.m., Chairman Kiesling called the meeting to order in the Commission Chambers located in the Union County Administration Building. The pledge of allegiance was recited.

<u>Commissioner Bennett moved to approve the agenda and the regular meeting minutes of March 11, 2025</u> with minor amendments. Commissioner Miller seconded. There was no further discussion. Vote: ALL AYE. The minutes were signed.

HOSPITAL REPORT

Tammie Chavez, CEO, reported on statistics for March. The "County Commissioner Monthly Hospital Report" was distributed to the board prior to the meeting. Items covered and discussed included the following: Provider Recruitment Update, Financial Assistance, Business/Financial Update, Compliance, Radiology Report, Plant Services, Therapy Services, Pharmacy, Laboratory/Infection Control, Union County/Des Moines Health Center, IT and Special Projects. She informed the Board that Brownell Keeth is retiring.

Terry Lancaster, CEO, reported on financials for February. The "Union County General Consolidated Executive Financial Summary" and the "Clayton Health Systems February 2025 Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements Period Ending February 28, 2025" was distributed to the board prior to the meeting. Items covered and discussed included the following: *Key Statistics, Statement of Revenue and Expenses – YTD and Balance Sheet.* More information was provided for starting a Mental Outpatient program for the community.

Amanda Archuleta, CNO, reported on the following: Nursing, Swing Bed, Social Work Consults and Trauma.

CUCEDP Budget Request - CUCEDP Director Lynette Keeth presented a request for \$45,000.00. This money is used for Luna Theater projects, Dino Days and the Legislative luncheon. She did inform the Board that she is seeking funding from the Town of Clayton as well.

Clayton Schools Budget Request- Clayton School Board members Gus Wood and Janna Lees presented a request for \$45,000.00 for June 2025 and July 2025 to fund the Summer Recreation program, the school is also seeking funding/assistance from the Town of Clayton.

Des Moines Senior Center Budget Request-The request was submitted through Manager Thompson. The Senior Center is requesting \$15,000.00 for operational costs. The Senior Center also requests funds from the Village of Des Moines and the Village of Folsom.

Youth Heartline Budget Request- Colleen Shaughnessy and Misty Gomez presented a budget request. The funds they request help them in assisting roughly 10 families and 4 individuals a year.

Clayton EMS- Chief Drumm presented a request for funding for the education and licensing for EMT's. Monies will also be used for operational costs.

Johnnie Matthews with the Clayton Chambers of Commerce presented a budget request to help fund the Chamber's advertising.

BUDGET HEARING

Treasurer Arnett presented her budget with no adjustments.

Assessor Sandoval presented her budget with no adjustments.

Clerk Fields presented her budget with increases from the prior fiscal year. Budgeting for meeting software to improve audio and minutes. She is also budgeting for a new position. There was discussion on the details on a Records Specialist position.

Sheriff Skaggs presented his budget with no adjustments.

Manager Thompson presented the Road Department and Emergency Services GGRT budget. Increases are being anticipated across all budgets for increases in insurance.

COUNTY MANAGER REPORT

Mgr. Thompson reported on a software meeting at the end of April for the Treasurers and Managers office.

- a. Lodger's Tax Mgr. Thompson presented a letter from Rosie DeHerrera regarding Lodgers Tax. There was no discussion.
- b. LEDA GRT Mgr. Thompson presented a letter from Grant Taylor regarding gross receipts tax increment that can be dedicated to economic development projects and plans. They would like to present to the Commission. Discussion was held and the Board directed Mgr. Thompson to respond that a presentation isn't needed at this time.

ROAD SUPERINTENDENT

Road Superintendent Gary Wright reported on road sign issues. He would like to have more budget to purchase sturdier/better materials for signs due to the winds destroying what they are currently using.

EMERGENCY SERVICE COORDINATOR REPORT

Mgr. Thompson presented on behalf of Emergency Manager Lawrence. Manager Lawrence reviewed Ordinance 2022-44 and would like to update the ordinance to better find the County's needs. The Board directed Mgr. Thompson to advertise for an Ordince hearing.

ELECTED OFFICIALS REPORTS

- a. Assessor's Annual Report- Assessor Sandoval presented the Annual Report, which included the break down of the land value increases. She also reported that the current \$5.00 minimum tax bill will be increased to a \$10.00 minimum. GIS Brayden Walker will be completing his fourth certificate in July.
- b. Clerk NMC Board nominations and election- Clerk Fields conducted the election for NMC Board Representative for June 2025-June 2027. Commissioner Bennett and Assessor Sandoval were nominated. Votes were cast and the final count was 3 votes for Commissioner Bennett and 5 votes for Assessor Sandoval. Assessor Sandoval will be the representative for Union County.

Sheriff Skaggs reported that his department will no longer be assisting with Town of Clayton calls. Any calls that fall in the Town of Clayton's police departments jurisdiction will be handled by that agency. He is also looking into bringing a K9 into the department and is in the beginning stage to hire a public service aide.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-44

AN ORDINANCE LIMITING OPEN BURNING IN UNION COUNTY UNDER SPECIFIED WEATHER AND CLIMATOLOGICAL CONDITIONS; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS, PROHIBITING OPEN BURNING WHEN CONDITIONS DO NOT WARRANT, PROVIDING FOR EXCEPTIONS, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2022-44

WHERAS, when climatological conditions of low relative humidity, high winds, lack of precipitation, and high fuel content combined with the probability of ignition and fire spread, an unacceptable risk of brush fires, grass fires, forest fires, and structure fires in the State of New Mexico exist generally and Union County specifically and open burning in those times is dangerous and potentially destructive;

WHERAS, the Board of County Commissioners recognizes that open burning can be safely accomplished when severe weather conditions do not exist and that a balanced regulatory approach is therefore necessary to identify when open burning should be restricted and when it should not:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners relies on current drought indices published by the National Weather Service, and on information provided by the United States Forest Service and the New Mexico State Forestry Division, to identify when conditions of extreme fire risk pose an unacceptable risk to unincorporated areas of Union County;

WHERAS, when conditions of extreme fire risk exist, the possibility of emergency response taxes current local, state and federal resources;

WHEREAS, the State of New Mexico has enacted the "Prescribed Burning Act" as NMSA 1978, Section 68-5-1 *et seq* to address the unacceptable risk of uncontrolled fire; and

WHERAS, when extreme fire conditions exist, the Board of County Commissioners finds that a serious and immediate danger to the public health, safety, and welfare of Union County exists.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. Short Title. This Ordinance shall be referred to as the Emergency Fire Ordinance of Union County, or simply "the Ordinance."

Section Two. Definitions.

A. "Prescribed burn" means the controlled application of fire to existing vegetative fuels through pile burning or the burning of vegetation over predefined areas under appropriate weather and environmental conditions for purposes of community protection, watershed resilience, silviculture, wildland fire hazard reduction, fuels reduction, rangeland improvement,

wildlife management, habitat improvement, invasive species management and ecological maintenance or restoration, but does not include agricultural burning to clear fields of stubble or slash or to manage invasive species impacting crop production, as part of orchard management or to clear irrigation ditches of vegetation and debris in order to improve or restore efficient water flow and delivery. "Prescribed burn" includes open fires or flames of any kind including, but not limited to, campfires, weed or grass burning, burning of trash barrels, pits or brush piles; welding or operating acetylene torches other than inside a building, the use of explosives, outdoor smoking unless accomplished in areas at least five feet in diameter that are barren or cleared of all flammable material.

- B. "Pile burning" means the burning of vegetation, usually sticks, limbs or boles of trees and brush, resulting from land management activities, that have been stacked in piles, but does not mean the burning of a single or few small piles of yard waste or pruning debris on an individual's property; and
 - C. "Act" means the Prescribed Burning Act, NMSA 1978 Section 69-5-1 et seq.

Section Three. Prescribed Burning

- A. Except as limited in Subsection B of this section, a private landowner or a private landowner's agent, contractor or legally authorized designee shall have a right to conduct a prescribed burn on the landowner's property,
- B. A prescribed burn shall not be started in the area where the prescribed burn is to take place when the National Weather Service has issued a red flag warning or a high wind warning, or when the Union County Emergency Management has issued a "no burn" instruction on its internet web site or Facebook page.
- C. Union County Emergency Management or the applicable Fire District Chief shall be notified each time a prescribed burn is to take place.

Section Four. Exceptions.

- A. A prescribed burn may take place when the National Weather Service has issued a red flag warning or a high wind warning or when the Union County Emergency Management issues a "no burn" instruction only with written authorization of Union County Emergency Management.
- B. Union County Emergency Management may authorize a prescribed burn but may condition its authorization on the use of appropriate precautionary measures, the use of sufficient personnel and equipment, prior notification of local fire official, comprehensive burn and contingency planning, and the use of appropriate prescribed burn techniques that cause the fire to be confined to a predetermined area. Applicants shall use the form provided by the Union County Emergency Manager to make application for an exemption under this paragraph.
 - C. Union County Emergency Management shall memorialize its approval in writing.

D. Union County Emergency Management may revoke its authorization to burn if conditions at the time of the proposed burn are too extreme to permit burning.

Section Five. Severability

If any provision of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unlawful or unenforceable, such unlawfulness or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance that was not found unlawful or unenforceable and such other provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

Section Six. Violations.

Engaging in prescribed burning in violation of this Ordinance shall be punished as set forth in NMSA 1978, Section 4-37-3.

Section Seven. Repeal.

Ordinance No. 2022-44 shall be and hereby is repealed.

Change in Service:

- We don't yet know how much our HD route will increase, but it will increase.
- Our biggest area of growth during the past year has been in those who come into the center to eat, and we are likely to keep those folks.
- We will be continuing to offer programs and services that may encourage people to maintain their relationship with the center.

Union County's initial funding was crucial in keeping our center open and operating at full capacity. I will be requesting more money from Non-Metro AAA in the coming year to cover our CURRENT participation numbers and will continue to see an increase.

Inflation is still a major factor in our request this year. Union County has given the center \$15,000+ for the past few years. Folsom Village was unable to commit to any funds in FY 25 and failed to meet the balance of their commitment in FY 24. This has been a great burden on our village. Due to the Senior Center change of directors, the Village had failed to secure monies for the FY 25. This left the Village General Budget account adjustment of \$51,000. We had a flooding at the beginning of the year 2024. While the building was being renovated to fix the water damage, meals were being purchased from different restaurants both here in Des Moines and Raton. Units were more expensive as well as the fuel used to go pickup the food daily to bring back the food. We did have more consumers during this time as meals could be picked up and taken during this time.

For this current fiscal year, I am requesting \$15,000.

Other local money given in FY 24 as a reference for comparison:

- Des Moines (not including in-kind): \$18,000
- Folsom: 0.00

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE LAND LEASE

This Amendment No. 1 to the Land Lease by and between the Board of County Commissioners of Union County, a political subdivision of the State of New Mexico, Lessee hereunder, and Clifford J. Gilbert II and Sheila Gilbert, Lessors hereunder is entered into this ____ day of May, 2025.

WHEREAS, the Union County Assessor has assessed the property which is the subject of the Land Lease as taxable property;

WHEREAS, the lease was predicated on the assumption that the property was not taxable and that the lease was a donation to Union County;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to address the changed circumstances and provide for rent equal to the real property taxes now being assessed on the property to restore the original intent of the parties that neither party would have continuing financial obligations to the other;

WHEREAS, the fire department has installed water storage tanks and entered into an agreement with an adjacent land owner to provide water to the fire department and no longer requires Lessor to provide water to the department;

WHEREAS, it was not the intent of the parties that Lessee would acquire title to the property under any circumstances and this provision should be adjusted to reflect the original intent of the parties;

WHEREAS, the parties hereto hereby agree to address these issues and to amend the Land Lease as described.

AMENDMENT

1. Article 3 ("Rent") of the Land Lease shall be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

3. Rent.

Lessee agrees to pay as rent on or before December 31 of each year, the total amount of property taxes due and owing on the property in any given tax year, as rent. Lessor will provide to the Lessee a copy of the paid taxes for reimbursement annually.
