



## **Moving Checklist**

$\cup$	<b><u>Declutter your items</u></b> . Now is a great time to declutter unused items to gift items or donate them to
	an organization of your choice such as the Goodwill, Salvation Army, or your local homeless shelter.
	Start by tackling the little items that are not being used at this moment. Trash expired items and
	items that are mismatched or that you cannot find all the pieces to.
	Start with one room at a time. Do not overwhelm yourself by attempting to do it all at once. whether
	you choose to start in the bathroom or the kitchen, start with one drawer at a time, one area at a
	time, filling one box at a time. Start with the tedious small items and work your way to the larger
	items. Your goal is to fill the boxes.
	Get your "Vacation Bag" ready! Pretend you are going for a 2 week vacation and pack all the items
	you would need for a 2 week vacation. This is a great idea since it might be awhile before you get all

	Shorts, Pants, etc" get specific too.

	Notify your utilities: Contact your utility companies to schedule disconnection date and
	reconnection of services in your new home. This includes electricity, gas, water, internet, garbage,

	<u>Change of Address notifications</u> . Update your address with the post office, banks, credit cards, and
	other important organizations. It would also be a great time to start selecting a "We've Moved

Announcement" to your friends and family.
