FIRE DISTRICT FACTS

- *LMRFD established in Dolan Springs 1980
- *GMFD and LMRFD Consolidated in 2010
- *At time of consolidation, assessed values: LMRFD \$37,763,616 GMFD \$7,102,875
- *LMRFD is governed by a 5 person elected volunteer Board.
- *LMRFD is supported by property tax payers in the 144 + sq. mile fire district, and the LMRFD ambulance service, roughly 50/50.
- *LMRFD Certificate of Necessity (C.O.N.) for Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulance service established 1983, covers 2200+ square miles NW Arizona. Includes Hwy 93 from Hoover Dam to near Chloride junction; Pierce Ferry Rd. from Hwy 93 to Colorado River and all points in between.
- *Combined tax and ambulance revenue support 2 full time Firefighter/Paramedics, 1 full time Fire Chief/Paramedic, 1 part time office Administrator, and required professional, financial and legal support stationed in Dolan. Additionally, approximately 17 days a month are covered with 1 FF/Paramedic in Meadview.
- *LMRFD relies on volunteer firefighter support as the 2 on duty personnel are frequently out on extended ambulance calls. As of April 2024, Dolan has 5 FF volunteers, Meadview has 0.

Tax"? FDAT is a separate County tax regulated by A.R.S. 48-807, to be disbursed among Fire Districts based on their tax base. LMRFD's portion is currently about \$90,000/yr

What about Meadview?

When the flag is flying at Station 43, the station is manned for the shift, but personnel may be out on a call and not available to answer the door.

Current tax and ambulance revenue in the Meadview/
Lake Mead City area limit the ability to fully man Station
43. Chief Bonnee currently attempts to maintain at least
17 days of coverage with 1 Firefighter/Paramedic, more
than the tax base in Meadview area supports. He has
submitted a grant to fund full time coverage, but it will
only serve for 3 years. After that, other funding or
volunteer services will need to pick up to carry on.

What Meadview Has:

- 1. Station house with upgrades and repairs done regularly as funding allows, approved by the Board, accomplished by Management and paid for by the taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 2. Fire apparatus and ambulance, upgraded regularly. Currently, LMRFD's newest fire engine and one of the newer ambulances are in the Meadview station, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 3. Communications with a direct 911 connection to Kingman Dispatch, up to date radios and phone system, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 4. Functional management, qualified personnel, including a Fire Chief who supports and encourages volunteers, with training and educational resources WITH EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES available to qualified participants, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
- 5. Meadview has 17-22 days of coverage with 1 person on duty. That is not enough, but it is more than the Meadview tax base supports, provided by taxpayers in the LMRFD.
