#### SUNCOAST WOODCRAFTERS GUILD GENERAL MEETING MINUTES March 16, 2021 at 7:00 PM via Zoom

## CALL TO ORDER: Pat Crawford, President, called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

**MEETING PROGRAM:** There were two video presentations; one provided by Patrick Skidd on coloured veneer art and another by Jonathan Weintraub on the construction of a Thuma bed. Both presentations were introduced by Rick Budd, Education Committee Chair.

**Jonathan Weintraub** showed a detailed video (PowerPoint) about the design, fabrication and assembly process of his 'Thuma bed'. An excerpt of his presentation can be viewed in this short video.

The bed's assembly (and disassembly/reassembly) is of a 'knock-down' (KD) design requiring only 2 small pieces of hardware. The legs/corner joints are of a 'castle joint' design.

During question period Jonathan informed the attendees the wood was walnut from his own trees on his property in Virginia (he brought the walnut out west when he moved to the Sunshine Coast). Final finish on the bed frame is tung oil.

Rick thanked Patrick and Jonathan for sharing their creations and video productions.

The Business meeting followed immediately after the presentation.

• Ron Johnson; Chair and Bench





Both pieces designed by Ron are made from local big leaf maple. The bench design is adapted from a bench he previously built. The chair was bleached before the wax finish and the bench was just waxed. All joinery is mortise and tenon. Ron used two different patterns for the Danish cord woven seating.

- Dave Beauchesne; Offered 20 pounds of 2" thick cottonwood bark from the Tulameen, BC area.
- Frank Rodgers; Piece of an Ash Tree



Frank explained it's a root cap that grew above ground level and when the tree was cut he cut this piece off as he had never seen one before. He hollowed out the bottom or the side facing down to make a bowl. Using an overhead router to do most of the work he used a carving gouge to deepen it. Being a root, it is very close grained and irregular in grain direction so it is a challenge to carve.


As you can see it is not finished but after about 30 years of being in this unfinished state without any checking it deserves to be finished. Interested parties contact Frank.
