Using Grids

A grid is an arrangement of blocks that are made by vertical and horizontal lines intersecting on a page. Numbers and letters are used on the grid to help you name the blocks.

You can find something on a grid by putting a finger of your right hand on a number and a finger on your left hand on a letter. Then, slide your fingers together until they meet. When grid points are identified, the letter is written before the number.


