

# Mission

The Great American Art Competition (TGAAC) is a national initiative created to celebrate America's 250th anniversary by empowering the next generation of artists and motivating contemporary artists to embrace the next Golden Age of our country. Through significant cash prizes, national outreach, a dedicated student competition, and a high-profile exhibition and gala in Washington, D.C., TGAAC will uplift artists of all ages who create works that reflect our shared ideals, heritage, and cultural traditions. We are a great nation - a model for the Ages - The Great American Art Competition intends to recenter the arts in American life.

The Competition is open to all skilled artists with special categories for talented young artists. Credit will be given to artworks that showcase contemporary and historic patriotic scenes, to artworks that embody the indomitable American spirit, and to artworks that inspire pride in American exceptionalism. The project is fiscally sponsored by the American Principles Project Foundation (APPF), ensuring full nonprofit accountability and tax-deductibility for all contributions.

## Overview

- \$125,000 in cash prizes awarded directly to artists
- National call for entries: Expected 2,500–3,500 submissions
- Professional jury and public exhibition in Washington, D.C.
- Student Component with targeted cash prizes for America's top art schools
- Awards Gala (125–150 guests) held during America's Semiquincentennial celebrations
- Acquisition and preservation of selected works, ensuring a lasting legacy
- Under fiscal sponsorship/a project of the American Principles Project Foundation
- 501(c)(3) All donations are tax deductible

While the *Great American Art Competition* begins with a national prize and gala in Washington, D.C., our long-term vision extends far beyond a single event. Our aim is to shape the future of American culture by creating enduring opportunities for artists and audiences alike.

- National Touring Exhibition Following the D.C. gala, selected works will travel to underserved regions across the United States, bringing world-class art to communities that rarely have access to major cultural events.
- Artist Residency Program We will establish residencies for young American artists, providing them with the time, resources, and mentorship needed to develop new work and strengthen their professional careers.
- Artist Registry Enabling art lovers to connect with patriotic and skilled artists.
- Building a New Art Scene in Washington, D.C. Unlike New York or Los Angeles, the nation's capital lacks a dynamic contemporary art scene. By anchoring the competition

- here, we aim to cultivate a vibrant cultural hub that reflects America's ideals and reaches global audiences.
- A Museum-Goers Union We plan to organize a grassroots network of engaged art lovers—an alliance of museum-goers who advocate for high-quality, inspiring exhibitions and speak up against the decline of standards in American cultural institutions.

These initiatives will expand the competition's reach, foster a renewed national art culture, and ensure that America's Semiquincentennial celebration leaves a living, ongoing legacy.
