The main target The Amazon wolffish (*Hoplias aimara*), also known as the giant trahira, is a fierce predatory fish found in South America's river systems. Known for its powerful jaws and sharp teeth, it preys on fish and small animals. Highly aggressive and resilient, it thrives in various water conditions, making it a prized catch.

My Goal is to ensure you have the trip of a lifetime, to create those memories that will last a lifetime and keep you dreaming about your return to the Amazon.....



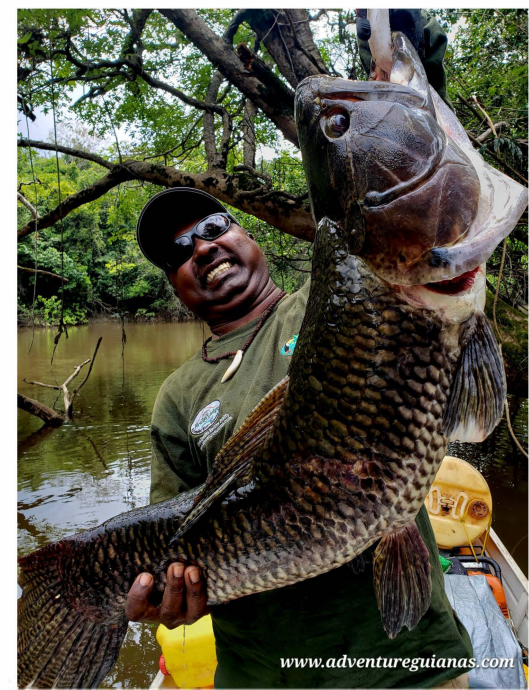

## THE KUYUWINI RIVER - Fly Camp

This location is a "Fly Camp" which is a small, temporary campsite set up in remote areas, often used for short stays during our expeditions. This area we are going to is remote. It offers basic shelter, close-to-nature experiences, and minimal facilities

Your sleeping choices are tents, hammocks, and cots. Tents offer shelter, hammocks provide comfort and airflow, while cots keep you off the ground. All options have bug screens and tarped cover.

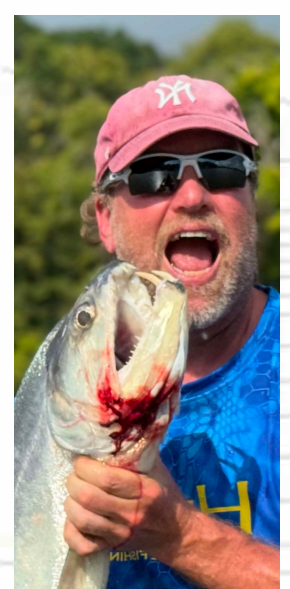
Trained staff cater to your needs, ensuring comfort, safety, and convenience. They handle cooking, setup, guiding, and logistics, allowing you to relax and enjoy your experience without worry or stress. They will also do laundry daily. .

Food, varies from traditional Guyanese and Amerindian meals prepared in the kitchen. Three meals a day including packed lunch and beverages. Snacks and fruit will also be provided.

A mixture of soft drinks, fruit juices, coke and coke zero will also be provided

Alcohol will also be included; however, this is normally limited to Guyanese / Brazilian beers dependent on availability. Spirits will also be included such as Rum. Again, please let me know if you prefer other drinks and I will check on availability prior to trip.





## Transfers and Schedule

**Day 1:** Arrival in Guyana – Cheddi Jagan International Airport (GEO). Collection from Airport and taken to the Ogle Airport for flight to Lethem (Combined Luggage Weight 44 /b) where we will spend the night in a hotel..

**Day 2:** Early morning Departure from Hotel to embark on a 4 hour scenic ride to the Parabara Amerindian Village, than by boat to the "Fly Camp". Half day of fishing once camp is reached.

**Day 3 – 7:** Five Days fishing

**Day 8 :** Early morning departure from camp to Parabara Amerindian Village. to Lethem were we will spend the night. In the am flight back to Ogle Airport. Transfer to Grand Coastal Hotel for an Overnight stay,

**Day 9:** Transfer to Cheddi Jagan International Airport (GEO) for journey home.





## Cost Breakdown

Included: Transfers from Cheddi Jagan and Ogle International Airports and two nights' accommodation in Lethem Hotel TBD and one night after to jungle trip in Georgetown. Flight to and from Lethem, 6 nights at camp, 5 ½ days fishing with local Amerindian guide, three meals a day, water, soft drinks and beer at camp, daily laundry service.

Not Included: International Airfares to and From Guyana, Hotel stays outside of Guyana, Taxi transfers outside of Guyana, Meals, and Beverages at Hotel before and after trip, medical costs (medical advice, medications, and inoculations etc. for your trip) Fishing Tackle. Tipping: we insist on \$200 USD Per person tips to be divided between guides and camp staff.

Payment Terms: 50% on Reservation, 50% due 60 Days before trip start date.
