We have had a productive year of preventing human trafficking through education here in the Pee Dee region. At the beginning of 2020, we educated over 2000 children in just a few short months. I had the privilege to educate in churches, schools, and other civic organizations. 2020 was turning out to be a successful year indeed.

..... and then COVID-19 spread throughout the world.

There are no words to describe how unprepared we all were when this deadly virus spread throughout our country, state, city, and towns. We could not foresee what would happen next, it was like the world stood still. However, this is how my faith in God works. I know that God is sovereign and that His plans are always perfect. I had to trust Him and wait! As our calendar began to drop off with dates of speaking engagements and One Child At A Time's fundraisers were put on the back burner I prayed, "Lord, where do we go from here?"

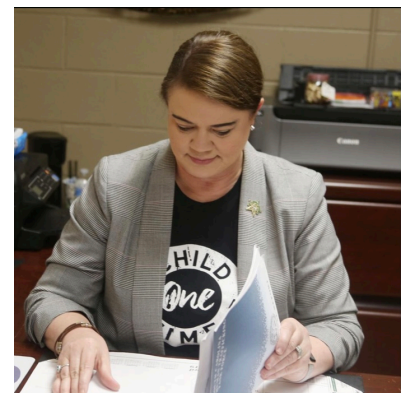
Then, in March 2020, I received a call from Sarah Mobley, a Marketing Manager from RATP-DEV USA. Molly said she heard me speak at a Hilton Head conference earlier that month and asked if I would like to help write a "White Paper" with her and another organization fighting against Human Trafficking. RATP-DEV USA was founded in 2002 and operates and maintains urban transportation systems in 12 countries on four continents. So, I spent the next two months in isolation helping to write the white paper titled Using Public Transportation to Combat Human Trafficking. Operators of public transportation are in a prime position to recognize when human trafficking is happening and take appropriate action to report it.

RATP-DEV USA introduced the white paper in May to its corporation and I spoke with over 200 district managers via zoom. It was nerve-racking, to say the least, but here is how God works! The white paper was published in the fall of 2020, reaching 1.5 billion people from the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Switzerland, Algeria, Morocco, South Africa, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, China, the Philippines, and the United States of America. I had no idea, such a small organization from Florence, SC could impact so many people. William Cary once said, "Expect great things from God and attempt great things for God."

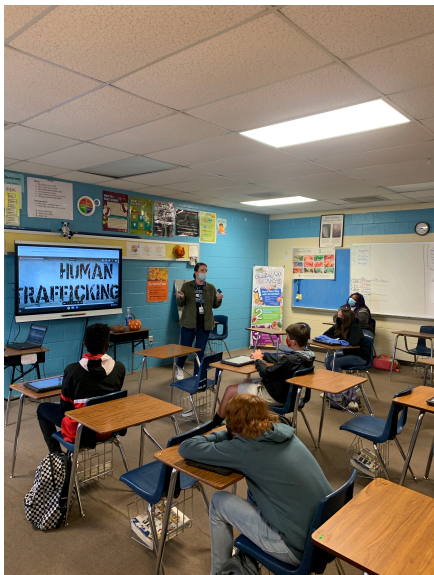
