*Our Mission is to eliminate modern slavery one person at a time. We work to prevent human trafficking through education, rescue trafficked individuals through intervention, and restore human dignity through affirmation.*

Greetings, Dear Family, Friends, and Supporters,

We are excited to celebrate our fifth year in combating this evil known as human trafficking. We have had the privilege and honor to educate over 20,000 folks on the dangers of online predators and human trafficking. The more we educate, the more youth come forward to expose those forcing them to do unspeakable things. We continue to educate in schools, churches, hospitals, and other civic organizations. We continue to teach *truths* and *myths* about human trafficking and how it affects our community. We have done this **at no charge** for the past five years, and because of the support from folks like YOU, we can continue to offer this service AT NO CHARGE.

This past year, we were overwhelmed with the support from our community. The communities support allowed us to reach so many suffering in silence that did not recognize the red flags and signs of what a victim looks like and that there is help! Our community's support allows this organization to support and train others to educate and help the vulnerable. The tools needed to educate others are so important. Human Trafficking is a Global problem that requires a community solution, and the donations we receive during our fundraisers allow us to continue this fight! We received over \$30,000 in grants this past year, allowing us to educate throughout the Pee Dee region. Educating others on the pattern of a trafficker and how they lure their victims is the only way to combat this evil. Most traffickers are not strangers to their victims; unfortunately, in most cases, trafficking victims - including child victims - know and trust their traffickers. We helped so many families last year whose children suffered from online predators.

Don't be too naive to say it isn't happening because it is not happening to you or your family. They seek the vulnerable, and those suffering do it in silence. We can change this only by educating and bringing this darkness to light. PLEASE partner with us and help us keep our children safe in our community. It is up to all of us! 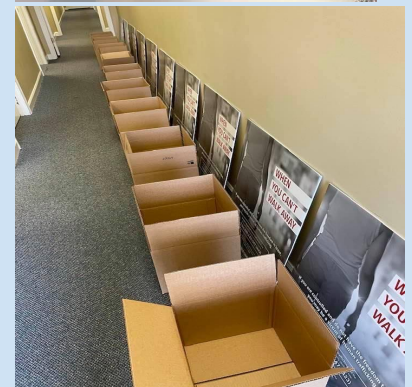
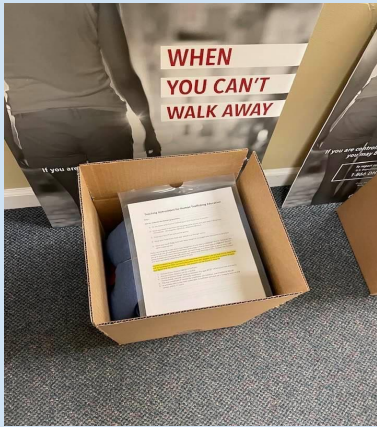

## YEAR IN REVIEW IN SCHOOLS

Educating our teachers on educating our children on Online Safety, and Human Trafficking has **SAVED** lives. In Fsd1, our teachers have educated over 4,000 students, and many have come forward and broken their silence because of ONE's education lesson plans and your support. This lesson plan is taught every quarter.



All students take an Exit Ticket Survey when completing this lesson plan. Did you know out of 3,389 Responses, the following human trafficking analytics were found? 21.6% of students did not understand what Human Trafficking was. 17% said that they would meet a stranger in real life that they met online. The students were asked if they set their social media accounts to private, and 35.7% answered **no**. 98% reported that an online predator was **NOT** threatening them. **2% said Yes**. These stats only display a small portion of the student population. The lesson plans are easy to teach, and the teachers report that the students are interested, engaged, and reporting. **Education is Key!**

### Risks Of Social Media

- Sharing personal information with strangers.
- Cyberbullying
- Uploading inappropriate content (photos and videos)
- Exposure to excessive advertising & marketing
- Exposure to inappropriate content (mean, aggressive, or sexual images)



Talking about social media is the best way to ensure your child’s safety.

### Statistics on Teens’ Usage of Social Media & Dangerous Apps

- The average age of the kids involved in pornography is **11 years old**.
- 73% of all teenagers in the U.S. are exposed to pornography.
- 8 in 10 teens who watch porn say they did so **to learn how to have sex**.
- 15% see it by age **10 or younger**
- Of the 44% who said they intentionally watched porn, 71% reported viewing it in the last week, and nearly 6 in 10 said they watched porn once a week **or more**.
- 30% of teens who consume porn reported exposure **during the school day**.
- 84% said they had seen porn depicting rape, choking, or someone in pain.
- **PORN** is just a click away.

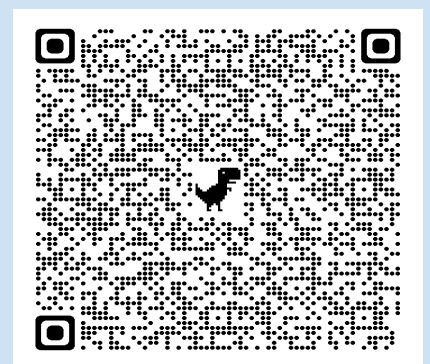

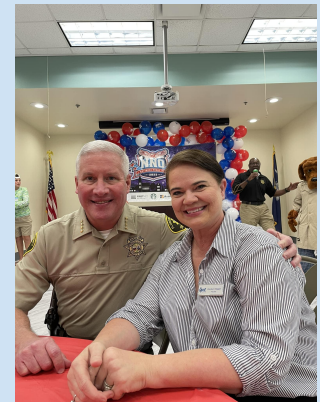
# YEAR IN REVIEW IN CHURCHES

We are excited to announce that our partners Pastor Manoj, his wife Priya, and all the dear children of Rays Of Hope are all doing well. Through our Partnership, we have been able to help them serve the trafficked victims in their community. For those of you who don't know, Rays of Hope is a holistic indigenous mission that was created in 2002. They are located in Mumbai, India, in the Turbhe Red Light Slums. They provide care to more than 120 children daily. Their focus is on the next generation. A rescue program is being established through the development of "The City Of Hope." This community will also cater to orphans, widows, destitute, and terminally ill people. The City Of Hope will provide holistic development to all its residents under one roof. Seeing God bring us full circle in His plans for our lives is remarkable. We ask that you pray for both ministries as we strive to bring Hope to the hopeless.

**One Child at a Time Yearly Projects** One Child at a Time has been blessed to create and work on many projects to better the community and protect our children. **Rehab's Risk** Rehab's Risk is a community project started by One Child at a Time in which women and young girls in need are provided with basic supplies they may not have access to. These supplies include toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, feminine products, clean underwear, clean water, and food. These supply packages also contain educational material about human trafficking and how to get help. These packages are made possible through donations. These packages are distributed to local sex workers and organizations like Pee Dee Coalition, House of Hope, the Palmetto Center, Walmart, and local women's Ministries to get into the hands of women who need them the most.
