Risks of Social Media

- Sharing personal information with strangers
- Cyberbullying
- Uploading inappropriate content (like embarrassing photos and videos)
- Exposure to excessive advertising & marketing
- Exposure to inappropriate content, including mean, aggressive, or sexual images

Talking about social media is the best way to ensure your child's safety.

Negative Effects of Social Media

- Stress: using social media to vent negative feelings in one's personal life; seeking perfection by comparing themselves to others' false narratives.
- Loneliness: can lead to isolation, jealousy, & the inability to fit in.
- Sleep: blue light hinders the body's ability to rest and sleep because people feel the constant need to check their social feeds; 60% of adolescence look at their phones an hour before sleep.
- Cyberbullying: typical way to tease someone & try to remain anonymous.

Statistics on Teens' Usage of Social Media & Dangerous Apps

- The average age of the kids involved in pornography is 11 years old.
- 73% of all teenagers in the U.S. are exposed to pornography.
- 8 in 10 teens who watched porn say they did so to learn how to have sex.
- 15% see it by age **10 or younger**.
- Of the 44% who said they intentionally watched porn, 71% reported viewing it in the last week, and nearly 6 in 10 said they watched porn once a week or more.
- 30% of teens who consume porn reported being exposed to it during the school day.
- 84% said they have seen porn depicting rape, choking or someone in pain.
- PORN is just a click away.
