

# Child Extensive Support (CES) Waiver



The Children's Extensive Support Waiver offers services and assistance to children (under 18) and their families, aiding in establishing a strong foundation for community inclusion as children transition into adulthood.

## What is it?

The Children's Extensive Support (CES) Waiver is designed for children with medical or behavioral conditions that necessitate continuous supervision for their safety and that of others, and assistance for daily living. The child should need an average of two to three hours of interventions throughout their bedtime routine beyond a simple verbal reminder to return to bed.

## Am I eligible?

### Age

Birth to 18

### Under age 5 ?

Must be determined to have a developmental disability or delay

### Supervision

Requires constant line of sight supervision to maintain safety

Based on child's income

### Determination

Meets criteria for disability under Social Security Administration

Needs support with some or all activities of daily living

# CHILDREN'S HABILITATION RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM WAIVER (CHRP)



The Children's Habilitation Residential Program Waiver (CHRP) waiver is for children whose intensive behavioral or medical needs put them at risk or in need of out-of-home placement. CHRP helps children up to age 20 stay in the community and access support to prevent crisis or institutionalization.

## What is it?

The Children's Habilitation Residential Program (CHRP) Waiver provides support for children and young adults (birth to age 20) This program is specifically for children and young adults who need or are at risk of out-of-home placement.

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# Children's Home & Community Based Services (CHBCS) Waiver



The Children's Home and Community-Based Services Waiver (CHCBS) is available for children with significant medical needs and who are at risk for institutional care in an acute hospital or skilled nursing facility. A waiver is an extra set of Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid program) benefits that your child could qualify for in certain cases. These benefits can help you remain in your home and community. Waivers have extra program rules, and some programs may have waitlists.

## How can it benefit me?

- **In-Home Support Services (IHSS)** lets you direct and manage the attendants who provide your care, homemaker, and health maintenance services with the added support of an agency. Through IHSS, you are empowered to select, train, and manage attendants of your choice to best fit your unique needs, or you may delegate these responsibilities to an authorized representative.
- **Case Management** is assistance provided by a case management agency on behalf of an eligible member, which includes referral of needed Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program) services and supports that enable you to remain in your community-based setting.
- A case manager is responsible for:
  - Assessing your long-term care needs,
  - Developing and implementing your care plan,
  - Coordinating and monitoring the delivery services and providers,
  - Evaluating the effectiveness of the services, and
  - Periodically re-assessing your needs.
- **The Wellness Education Benefit (WEB)** is designed to reduce the need for a higher level of care by offering educational materials that provide members and their families with actionable tools that can be used to prevent the progression of a disability, increase community engagement, combat isolation, and improve awareness of Medicaid services.

## Am I eligible?

### Financial

- Your child's income must be less than three times the current Federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) limit per month, and their countable resources must be less than \$2,000.
- Due to your income and resources, your child would not be otherwise eligible for Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program).

### Age

Must be under 18 years of age

### Determination

Meets criteria for disability under Social Security Administration

### Daily Living

Need medical care that would typically provided in a skilled nursing facility and/or an acute hospital.

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# Children with Life-Limiting Illness Waiver (HCBS-CLLI)



## What is it?

If your child has a life-limiting illness, the CLLI Waiver can provide support in the home to allow you and your family to seek curative treatment while your child is receiving palliative or hospice care. For medically fragile children.

## How can it benefit me?

- Palliative/Supportive Care
- Care coordination including a care plan, regular home visits to monitor health and safety
- Pain and symptom management
- Counseling/Bereavement Services
- Expressive Therapy
- Massage Therapy
- Respite Care
- Therapeutic Life-Limiting Illness Support

## Am I eligible?

### Age

Birth to 18

### Financial

Based on child's income

### Determination

Meets criteria for disability under Social Security Administration. Have a life-limiting illness certified by a physician

### Level of Care

At risk of needing to live in a hospital setting without in home care support
