Need to Know

- ARG, a third-party contractor, reviews disability claims.
- ARG has 90 days to make a determination; follow up as the deadline approaches.
- If no determination is received after 90 days, reach out to Slope Cares for assistance.
- If you receive a denial, and you disagree contact Slope Cares for assistance



Helpful Tips

- Bypass the Department of Human Services and Peak Portal for quicker support.
- Denver Health manages the Buy-In Program and submits your DD Application.
- Submit all documents reflecting a disability; evlautations, IEP,504 etc
- Write a cover letter (see next page)

I am writing to explain my child's need for support. My son, (child's name), faces challenges in school, community, and home, prompting us to pursue various interventions due to his diagnosis.

He struggles with self-care tasks, emotional regulation, and social interactions. His disability requires assistance with daily activities beyond typical expectations for his age. He has excessive energy and seeks sensory input, which can pose safety risks and requires constant supervision. He also has difficulty verbally expressing his needs outside, often leading to emotional dysregulation and potential risks of self-harm or harm to others.

Common Terminolgy



- Health First Colorado: This is the state's Medicaid program, distinct from CHIP +.
- <u>Medicaid Buy-In</u> (CMAP) This offers affordable healthcare for children and working adults with disabilities who exceed the income limit for state Medicaid.
- <u>Home Based Commuity Services</u> (HBCS): These waivers provide additional Medicaid benefits to support caregivers and help keep children with their families.
- <u>Community First Choice</u> (CFC): Set to launch in July 2025, this program will offer some waiver services to individuals who previously did not qualify, expanding access to services not available under their current waivers.
- <u>Case Managment Agency</u> (CMA) A regional agency responsible for managing HCBS waivers and CFC disability services.
- Long Term Support Services (LTSS)
- <u>Disability Determination (DD) Application</u> This application is required for Colorado to recognize individuals with disabilities
- Arbor Action Review Group) (ARG) This group evaluates disability criteria to determine
 Medicaid eligibility based on SSI criteria
- <u>Supplemental Security Income</u> (SSI) This may provide federal financial support for caregivers and those who are determined to have a disability have direct access to Medicaid, bypassing ARG and CMAP

The Children's Extensive Support (CES)



What is it?

The Children's Extensive Support (CES)
Waiver helps children and families by
providing services and supports that help
children with developmental disabilities
establish a long-term foundation for
community inclusion as they grow into
adulthood. If your child receives services
through the CES waiver, your child will
also receive state Medicaid coverage.

Criteria for Elegibility

- Under 18 years old
- Diagnosed with a developmental disability
- · Resides in the family home
- Requires direct human intervention for behavior or medical conditions on average of at least every two hours during the day and weekly every three hours at night
- Conditions must exceed typical ageappropriate behaviors
- Meets the Federal Social Security
 Administration's definition of disability

The Children's Habilitation Residential Program Waiver (CHRP)



What is it?

The Children's Habilitation Residential Program Waiver (CHRP) offers services and assistance to children and their families, establishing a strong foundation for community inclusion as children transition into adulthood. CHRP helps children stay in the community and access support to prevent crisis or institutionalization.

Criteria for Elegibility

- Under the age of 20 years old
- Intensive behavioral or medical support needs that put them at risk or in need of out-of-home placement
- diagnosis with mental disorder by a licensed professional
- Functional impairments affecting family, social, school, or community life
- Emotional disturbances in the past 12 months, not related to substance abuse
- Your has an intellectual or developmental disability or developmental delay if under age 5 (no longer required)

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Children's Home & Community Based Services (CHBCS) Waiver



What is it?

The Children's Home and Community-Based Services Waiver (CHCBS) is available for children with significant medical needs and at risk for institutional care in an acute hospital or skilled nursing facility. CHCBS also works with the support that families and communities provide.

If your child receives services through the CHCBS waiver, your child will also receive state Medicaid coverage.

Is my child eligible?

- Under 18 years old
- The child requires medical care that would typically be provided in a skilled nursing facility or an acute hospital.
- Meets criteria for disability under the Social Security Administration
- Based on the child's income
- · Lives in the family home

What are the benefits?

The Wellness Education Benefit (WEB)
 aims to reduce the need for higher care levels by providing educational materials that help members and families prevent disability progression, enhance community engagement, combat isolation, and improve Medicaid service awareness.
