She started out volunteering in the St. Joseph County jail with a group from Riverside Church where they would meet with inmates dealing with issues of addiction. Their work with these women led to the vision of a recovery home where women like the ones they were meeting could have a safe place to go and continue their recovery. Anna and her husband were also a part of the team that renovated the home that would eventually become Amanda's House.

Her next volunteer position was as a House Angel. "I was really nervous to get started. I didn't know what to expect." After some time as a House Angel Anna found out that her days at Amanda's House were extremely fulfilling. A House Angel's day starts out by leading the girls through their current Bible Study. "Most of the rest of the day is spent with helping the girls, spending time with them, working through life skills, and taking the girls to their appointments." Anna's focus during her days as a House Angel was just to be there for the girls as much as possible. "I made sure to



always eat lunch with the girls when I was there and made sure that I was investing time with them." Anna says that she sees this time spent with the girls as planting seeds in her relationships with them.

In the new year, Anna became an employee at Hope United as the coordinator of Amanda's House. She says that she is excited to get to spend time doing what she is passionate about and to be a part of continuing to grow the ministry of Amanda's House.

Anna says that as long as you have time and can be yourself, you have everything that you need to be a House Angel. When asked what is the most impactful part of being a House Angel? Anna says that it's having the opportunity to become friends with the girls. Showing them a level of authenticity is something most of these girls haven't had in their lives. It helps to establish a true relationship with the girls. "Scripture says we are blessed to be a blessing. It's a boomerang of blessings." - His love was **responsive**. He chose to take action when he saw his neighbor's needs.
- His love was **sacrificial**. He chose to give his time and resources to meet his neighbor's needs.
- His love was **merciful.** He chose to show love to one who may not have been loving to him.
- His love was effective. He chose to care for his neighbor in ways that brought
- healing and hope to one who was broken and lost.



Love of God and neighbor is central to every aspect of Hope United's ministries.
