

After relocating to Michigan in 2016, Patti embarked on a healing journey through Celebrate Recovery, eventually leading Step Studies, sponsoring women, and serving in jail ministry. Her passion for walking alongside women in recovery deepened, leading her to mentor training with Hope United where she had volunteered since 2018.

In January 2023, Patti was hired by Hope United as the House Coordinator at Amanda's House. Although Patti once doubted her worth for this role, she now embraces the opportunity to uplift women in their journey toward healing and self-sufficiency. Amanda's House offers structured programming, peer-to-peer relationships, and a space where every woman is seen, heard, and valued. Each victory—big or small—is celebrated, and watching the transformation of those who pass through the house fills Patti's heart with gratitude.

Patti says, "God doesn't always call the equipped, but He equips the called." "It is an honor to believe in these women when they struggle to believe in themselves, guiding them toward hope and restoration."

Kara's journey is one of profound loss, redemption, and renewal. After struggling with meth addiction, she was incarcerated at 40 and faced isolation from her family. In jail, fear of homelessness gripped her—until, just days before her release, she was accepted into Amanda's House, a faith-based recovery program.

During her time here, she rekindled her faith, found emotional support, and experienced safety for the first time in decades. The program's extended structure allowed her to build stability and a strong support network. Volunteer opportunities helped her connect with her new community.

Now, Kara works full-time and shares her experiences as a facilitator for Getting Ahead classes through Hope United. She's living proof of restoration and the power of faith in rebuilding a life. Hope United continues its mission to support individuals like Kara, standing in the gap to bring healing through Jesus Christ.
