ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

Four Board members, fire chief, and 9 guests attended the March meeting. Bruce opened with the flag salute. Diann summarized amount received from grant reimbursement and the status of outstanding bills and recovery receipts. In answer to Greg's question about \$200,000 being included for grants, Diann said they just pick a number to avoid an amended budget. report approved Treasurer's after clarification, as were the minutes from the previous meeting.

For the Board, Greg reported from the most recent 3-department task force that Chiloquin has offered to loan us a defibrillator, and Mike Cook wants to standardize equipment among the 3 departments for greater interoperability. Following discussion on Article 69, Greg continued that both Chiloquin and Sprague River require burn permits, but probably Rocky Point doesn't need them. Board member training will be offered in Chiloquin at a future date. Mike Cook demonstrated a battery-operated Jaws of Life that he would also like to see at each of the 3 departments. Greg expressed dissatisfaction at the current rotating member system for attendance at the 3-department task force monthly meetings, citing a lack of continuity from one meeting

to the next and the inefficiency of nonattending members getting up to speed on discussions when it's their turn. Board approved appointing Greg as the permanent member with the others rotating. Larry said Josephine County might donate some of their recovery gear surplus to our department.

During Good and Welfare, Judy announced Marci will be taking over the web page and reminded the Board to send agendas and minutes to Marci for inclusion. David Reed and Tom Barrett complimented the department on responses and improvements.

Under Old Business, Larry said there was no progress on visiting with Lake of the Woods Home Owners Association President for discussions on annexation. Greg added that he visited the ODOT station, and there's no room for one of our pieces of equipment to be parked there. Steve has a draft of a strategic plan that the Board needs to work on. Greg handed out potential versions of the Fire Chief position description, made from the best parts of other departments' job descriptions, as well as an SDAO version. (Cont. P. 2)

Ten to twelve people are enrolled in the Firefighter I class, we have 4 new volunteers, the March training calendar is available, and our department is prepared for the coronavirus. Volunteers responded to 2 smoke alarms, 2 public assists, and 1 medical in the past month.

Donations continue to arrive for the Summer Festival, and Klamath County School District will let us use chairs for the event. Still need a chairperson for the parade.

From the VFA, they were able to be part of a fire prevention booth, they're reviewing their bylaws, and have a mission statement established. They're still examining options for the BBQ booth banner.

Following discussion on how best to generate the most income from a gun Larry Dugger is donating, the meeting adjourned.
