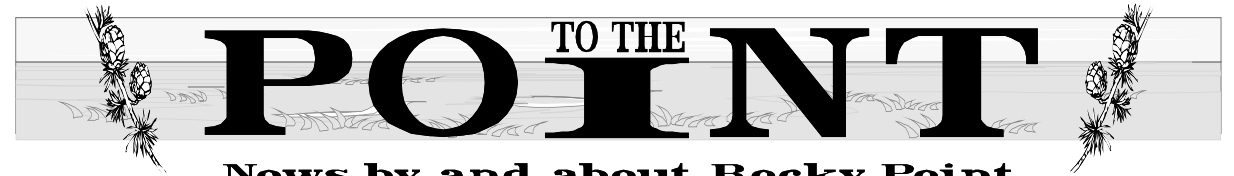

ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

Five Board members, fire chief, and 7 guests attended the November meeting, called to order by Bruce. After the pledge, the Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting, as well as the treasurer’s report after a clarification on the fuel bill.

For the Board, Diann summarized a meeting in Chiloquin that she, Sandy, and Bruce attended with Chiloquin and Sprague River fire departments. The group will meet once a month to address volunteers and training, with the 3 departments sharing training at different sites, using the different departments’ apparatus and gear. Rocky Point’s attendees will rotate among the 5 Board members.

Old Business first addressed selling the rescue rig. Larry will write a description for a sealed bid sale and Diann will advertise. The air trailer is already advertised. The Board thanked Steve for securing a donation of a super printer for the fire department. Next was a request for an update on grants, with a request from Steve that the Board talk about department priority needs and to not apply for ones that don’t appear on the priority list. One issue is the application for 17 sets of structure turnouts and a question about the urgency of that request, considering

other immediate needs to protect the community. No action taken.

New Business began with the election of Board officers, which are President, Bruce Harp; Vice President, Steve Jensen; Treasurer, Sandy Handsaker; Secretary, LaJean Yates; and member at large, Larry Duggar. Bruce was also chosen as Sargent At Arms.

Chief’s report included the following: We have additional volunteers certified to offer more classes; Jan. 4 will be the fire department holiday party; last month the volunteers responded to 6 MVAs, 8 medical, and 2 smoke calls; the VFA is presenting an award to an 8-year-old who bravely led responders to his unresponsive grandmother; we have \$29,000 in outstanding medical charges; the gurney is being reconditioned; and we need \$30,000 for a new defibrillator. To the last item, LaJean asked if everything we have is old, should we start searching for funding sources. Steve offered that the 3-department workshop is assessing equipment needs for all three districts and that there’s more to address than defibrillators.
