ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

Five Board members (one by speaker phone), Fire Chief, and 5 guests (limited by COVID-19 recommendations) attended the April meeting. After the pledge, minutes and treasurer's report were approved.

Joint Task Force meetings with Chiloquin and Sprague River Fire Departments have been put on hold, so there was no report.

Board report: Bruce announced that from now on requests for any department information, like files, must be brought to the Board President who will take it for Board vote. If approved, the Board President will request the information from the chief. Likewise, anybody wanting to ask questions from SDAO must first submit request to the Board President for Board approval. He also encouraged all Board members to become familiar with the SDAO Handbook.

Good and Welfare: Judy Teagarden said it was her opinion that all mail correspondence regarding fire department matters be addressed and delivered to the fire station instead of to individual board members.

Old Business: It appears the Lake of the Woods Homeowner's Association lacks interest in being annexed into our department, so the Board approved removing that item from the agenda until such time there is interest. Greg shared an SDAO-generated fire chief description, which will be added to descriptions

offered by Sandy and Greg for examination. Board approved tabling the issue until all Board members can review the drafts, with fire chief job description to be listed on the May agenda. Greg reported that Chiloquin Fire Department has both Zoll defibrillators, Series E & M, and are willing to loan either to our department, should the need arise.

New Business: Board readdressed the O2 trailer earlier considered for an auction item at the Summer Festival. Now it seems it can serve another function, so the Board approved retaining the trailer as Fire Department property. Board approved appointing Sandy as chair of the Budget Committee. She will begin contacting interested parties to serve on the committee, with the first meeting scheduled for May 18th, 10 AM. Fire Chief announced 2 of our volunteers have become certified Advanced EMTs. They will be reimbursed for their expenses.

Chief Report: Forest Service has made available a spot off Cold Springs Road for dumping yard debris only. USFS recommends no outside burning due to COVID-19. Volunteers responded to 3 outdoor smokes and 1 medical call in the past month.

Ambulance license is renewed, as are Standing Orders and Attending Physician contract. Diann received a 2-year extension for service on the Ambulance Advisory Board. Pelican Guard Station has been offered as an overnight venue for our out-of-area volunteers when it's available. Diann is enrolled in online board classes and working on joint volunteer training classes.

Summer Festival – April meeting cancelled. Pepsi paid half of the \$400 cost of a new banner. Donations continue to arrive.

VFA Report – Linda reported the pancake breakfast was cancelled. The Association accepted a collectable Winchester firearm from Board member Larry Dugger to auction as a fundraiser.

After Diann asked the Board if they wanted her to provide the reasons for a local EMT no longer being associated with the department, the Board adjourned to executive session. Following that session, the meeting reconvened for adjournment.
