

ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

Four Board members, fire chief, and 9 guests attended the October meeting, called to order by Bruce. After the pledge, the Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting as well as the ones from the Oct. 7 special meeting. The Board addressed the August treasurer's report, tabled at last meeting. After clarifications on items relating to individual billings on the VISA card and a fee of \$675 for a CPR class, the Board approved both August and September treasurer's reports. Sandy has completed the required audit report and will soon learn how to fill out an additional form.

Under Old Business, Diann reported on progress in finding previous minutes and policies. Then the Board held discussion on applicants applying to fill the vacant board position. By majority vote, Larry Duggar was chosen to fill out the term vacated by Fred. He will be sworn in at the next meeting. The item Success of the Fire Department will be addressed on along as relevant items surface. The new copier arrived, damaged, with refund in hand. The search will continue for another.

New Business kicked off with determining the disposition of vehicle 2170, the previous rescue vehicle, which has a number of mechanical problems, and we

don't have enough volunteers to get it out the door. Board approved offering it to Jim Kelly for \$1000. If he doesn't want it, they'll look into getting it repaired enough to sell. Diann also proposed selling the air filtration trailer, pointing out the only volunteers we have certified to use SCBA don't live in the district and there's no place to store it. After Chiloquin fire chief Cook said his department would help keep our tanks filled, the Board approved letting it become surplus.

Chief's report included the following: All vehicles are ready for winter; volunteers will move rigs for Fall festival and sell tee shirts at the event; the department responded to 5 smoke reports, 5 medicals, and 1 MVA; volunteers attended a Fire Prevention event at KCC and received support for being involved; we have \$33,000 in outstanding ambulance billings; our only EMT will be having surgery and there will be times during her healing when the ambulance won't be available for service; two volunteers resigned and are moving to town; and the Board approved updating the Facility Agreement with Public Works to park the grader at the department.
