ROCKY POINT FIRE/EMS BOARD

All 5 Board members, Fire Chief, and 4 guests attended the August meeting. After preliminaries, the minutes were approved, and the treasurer’s report tabled, pending further review. Of note is the \$16,500 deposit from the online auction, plus donations, generated this year in lieu of income from the Annual Summer Festival. Special thanks to Julie Black and Marcie Menon for their hard work on the auction.

From the Board, Bruce recapped the busy month for volunteers and compliments from other agencies. Steve summarized the multi-department board training class in Chiloquin he, Sandy, Diann, and Greg attended. Larry discussed the possibility of “wrapping” the new engine, rather than painting it.

Good and welfare consisted of discussion on forming a community task force to help in strategic planning, one of the areas covered in the Joint Task Force training session. Old business covered the condition of vehicles 2111 and 2141.

Fire Chief Contract was tabled, pending information gathering and a meeting with the attorney. At issue is the 3-week paid vacation, definition of “salary”

vs. “hourly” conditions, and legal boundaries for compensation. More discussion occurred on the job description, which had been approved unanimously at last month’s meeting.

Fire chief report had a lot you should read in the full minutes, but highlights include new volunteers, new certifications, and just how busy this last month was – 11 medical calls, 3 brush fires, 2 smoke calls, and 2 MVAs. Diann emphasized the need for structure fire turnouts and that there are times when our community has no EMT coverage.

After Linda again thanked Julie and Marcie for their major contribution to the auction success and announcing the VFA will be helping at the Lake of the Woods Car Show, Sept. 12, the meeting adjourned. Please note that the next meeting will not be held on its normal day but will instead be on September 28th.
