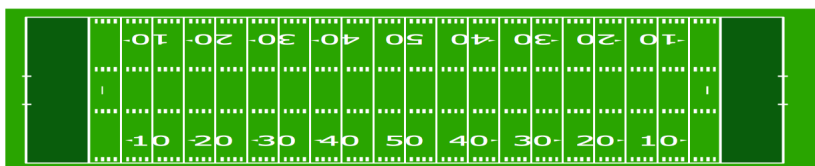

So with nothing to do but feel the morning chill, we headed into the senior center for their pancake breakfast. We met several fellow marchers who complimented us on our costumes and gave us a place to eat. We still had plenty of time to check out other entries such as "the Men of Leisure synchronized nap
