Pilocytic Astrocytoma Diagnosed January 2023

Brailee was diagnosed with Pilocytic Astrocytoma, a brain cancer, in 2023. After suffering with migraines and vision issues, an MRI was done. The scan showed a large mass and a cyst that were affecting her pons, her right mid-brain and optic chiasm. Although Brailee's optic nerve was still healthy, the tumor was inoperable due to its location.



She began her first round of chemo in February 2023. Another scan in May showed the tumor had not grown, but it was remaining stable. Although it wasn't the results they had hoped for, knowing the tumor was stable was good news in itself. Brailee fought through her first year of cancer like a true warrior!



February 2024 brought news that recent scans were showing growth of the tumor. The news was followed by episodes of projectile vomiting, headaches and some neck discomfort. Another trip to the emergency room showed no new growth beyond the scan done in January, but there were still concerns over the new growth and the additional symptoms.

In the midst of Brailee's cancer journey, her mom, Natasha, was also diagnosed with brain cancer. Natasha suffered a grand-mal seizure at work. To date, she still doesn't have a confirmed diagnosis of what type of cancer



it is. The tumor has literally been sent across the country from Mayo Clinic to Texas, but still no answers. Natasha underwent radiation therapy between October and Christmas 2023 at KU Medical Center. She currently wears an Optune GIO to help cancer cells from growing and may have to wear it long-term or for the rest of her life.



In August, Brailee was gifted a Make A Wish trip to Hawaii. Both Brailee and Natasha will continue treatment. We ask that you join us in keeping both of these amazing ladies in your prayers.

The Monkey In My Chair program was created by Love, Chloe founder, Heidi Fey-erherm-Smith in memory of her daughter, Chloe, who loved school and monkeys, to keep kids in treatment connected to their classmates in school.



Nearly 1000 Monkey in My Chair kits are sent each year from our office in Salina to families and hospitals across the world, including: U.S., Australia, New Zealand, the U.K., Canada and even Japan!

The Monkey in My Chair kit was recently updated with new components for the first time since the program was created! Each kit comes with a large monkey, a small monkey, a book that helps the class understand what the child in treatment is experiencing, a large backpack, a small backpack, and more!



The small monkey stays with the child in treatment while the large monkey stays in the classroom. It does everything the child would do in school, like field trips, going to the library, recess, and PE. The children often dress the monkey in school uniforms or in conjunction with school spirit days.

Families who have lost a warrior often continue to include their monkey in everyday life, such as the Hall family pictured above. Carson's monkey, Bubba, is very much a part of their family and daily activities.


Warrior Angel Cami

Jacob was diagnosed with DIPG in July 2023. He and his family never backed down from his diagnosis and set out to beat this awful disease.

In addition to lifestyle changes, and homeopathic treatments, Jacob received treatment at St. Jude and Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, Ohio. He was accepted into the SonALAsence trial at Children's National Hospital in Washington, D.C. in December, 2023.



Despite the treatments, the cancer was too much for his young body. Jacob passed away on October 30, 2024.

He was a black belt in Taewando, spoke several languages, played numerous instruments and was an all around brave and courageous warrior!

Warrior Wagons

Our Warrior Wagons program began in 2018. Since then, the requests for wagons has increased ten-fold! In 2023, we delivered twelve wagons, which is more than double the wagons we provided in 2022.



The Warrior Wagons are a gift of love and necessity. We deliver the wagon as quickly as possible after we learn of the diagnosis to help the family begin their cancer journey.

The wagons are a full size, canvas, wagon piled high with grab and go toiletry bags for the parents (and child, depending on age), comfy clothes and warm socks for the cancer warrior, gift cards to the warrior's favorite restaurants, a \$500 VISA card for the parents to use however they need, Love, Chloe awareness items, blankets for the entire family and lots of extras like toys and activities for the warrior and the siblings!

On average, each wagon is valued at \$1,500.

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

