2 From the Founder

Thank you so much for all the support. You have made it possible for us to help so many families and



make a difference in their lives. The foundation has continued to grow over the years and expand our support to more and more families. It would not be possible without the amazing support of all of you!

When I started the organization in 2008, our main focus was to start the Monkey In My Chair program. The program was inspired by Chloe who loved monkeys and school. We were able to develop this program and start getting them to families within our first year and it really took off with more than 100 hospitals requesting kits by 2010. This left us in a situation of having wait lists for hospitals and families to get the program. As a result of the rapid growth, we decided to partner with the Cure Starts Now Foundation to help to keep up with

the demand and even grow the program to serve more children. This partnership allowed the program to grow but also limited the development of new components. We have ended the partnership, and the program is now being fully funded by the Love, Chloe Foundation.

We are excited to have full ownership back under Love, Chloe but also know that this will require us to raise more funds to keep the program going! We are excited about making the Monkey In My Chair program even better and serving more family across the United States.

I continue to hear from families how important this program is, so I hope that you will continue to support this program in the upcoming year.

hayden Acute Lymphoblastomic Leukemia (ALL) Diagnosed January 2016 Relapsed September 2021

Hayden began his cancer journey in 2016 after being diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastomic Leukemia (ALL). Hayden was just 7 years old at the time, and it was devastating news to his family.

With the traditional chemo not working as well as the doctors had hoped, Hayden began a high risk treatment. The new chemo was effective in treating his cancer, but caused

chemical-type burns on his arms and face. In addition, doctors found nodules growing in Hayden's lungs which caused high fevers and kept him in the hospital for several days at a time.

Despite his ups and downs, Hayden was declared cancer free after his initial 90-day biopsy. He continued regular follow up treatments for the next four years and did well. He was able to do all the things he had done before and return to school.

Just before his fifth anniversary of being cancer free, Hayden relapsed. He has spent much of the last several months at Children's Mercy since September 2021. In early January, Hayden received Car-T Cell Therapy, an effective and less harsh treatment.

Months in the hospital was taking its toll on Hayden. He became quiet, slept more, had a hard time eating and didn't act the young man his family knew prior to his relapse. In a high-risk move, his mom decided to take him home in early February. Immediately, Hayden began to smile, he gained six pounds within a week, and he was more energetic than he had been. "It may have been luck, but he didn't have any issues with bad side effects. His entire demeanor changed almost instantly when he found out what we were doing", said Ashley, Hayden's mom. "It was like just the thought of being sneaky in itself perked him right up!"



On February 7, Hayden and his family found that the first two in-house bone marrow specimens came back clear of leukemia cells! He will do another

bone marrow biopsy in 60 days. If the tests show his bone marrow is leukemia free again, he will likely be determined to be in remission.

Ashley wrote on Facebook, "If anyone was wondering what Hayden's first comment was after hearing the news, it was 'Now I can go fishing!'"

TESSA Type B Hodgkin's Lymphoma

Diagnosed February 2021

Tessa is 15 years old and lives in Manhattan, Kansas. She was diagnosed with stage 4 Type B Hodgkin's Lymphoma in February 2021.

Tessa began chemo at Children's Mercy immediately after her diagnoses, but not without a few bumps along the way.

The month of March was tough. Tests showed that her white blood cells were extremely low and the chemo would kill what little she had. This also made her

highly susceptible to any illness. In addition, an x-ray showed a minimal decrease in the size of the mass around her lungs. It wasn't what the family or doctors had hoped for. However, the mass was still too large for Tessa to have a port installed for her chemo. Instead, she was receiving all her treatments through a PICC line which is difficult at best. By mid-April, a port was able to be installed.

Tessa set a goal at the beginning of her journey to attend her eighth grade graduation at Riley County Middle School in May. After months of treatment and determination, she was able to attend surrounded by her classmates and family.

In December 2021 more symptoms and a change in her appearance caused concern. Unfortunately, tests confirmed it was thyroid cancer. Despite the set back, Tessa is doing as well as can be expected. She's been able to return to school with her classmates which helps keep her spirits up during this difficult journey.

Ryian Acute Lymphoblastomic Leukemia Diagnosed March 2020



After receiving Car-T Cell Therapy during the summer of 2020, Rylan went into remission for several months. Unfortunately, his leukemia returned in October 2020.

The cancer spread to his spinal fluid, stomach, bladder and brain in the following months, but was doing well enough that Rylan was able to be dismissed from the hospital in the spring.


